# REPORT

OF THE

## ELECTORAL DISTRICTS COMMISSIONERS.

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To His Excellency The Right Honorable Sir ROBERT WILLIAM DUFF, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, a Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY :

We, the Electoral Districts Commissioners, appointed by your Excellency to carry out the provisions of section 13 of the "Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act of 1893," have now, as directed by section 15, and within the time provided by section 13, of the Act, the honour to report to your Excellency as follows :—

In the manner provided by subsection (i) of section 17 of the Act, your Commissioners have ascertained that the quota of electors for the purposes of the first distribution of New South Wales into electoral districts under the provisions of the Act is 2,263, that number being approximately the one hundred and twenty-fifth part of the number 282,851, which they find to be the total number of persons enrolled on the Electoral Rolls in force for the years 1892–1893, omitting therefrom the names of all persons appearing to be qualified otherwise than by residence within the several electoral districts constituted under the "Electoral Act of 1880" and the "Wentworth Electorate Subdivision Act."

As directed by section 13, and observing the instructions contained in sections 14 and 17 of the Act, your Commissioners have distributed New South Wales into one hundred and twenty-five Electoral Districts, whereof the names and boundaries, as determined by them, are set out in Schedule A, attached to and forming part of this Report; and in Schedule B, also attached to and forming part of their Report, they have appended a list, by number and name, of the districts named and described in Schedule A, and have set opposite to the name of each such district the number of the electors whom they find to have been resident within the same according to the Electoral Rolls in force for the years 1892–1893; and they have further, as directed by subsection (iv) of section 17 of the Act, appended their reasons for adopting, in each case in which they have so determined, a margin of allowance exceeding two hundred, by way of addition to, or subtraction from, the quota of 2,263, in assigning any Electoral District determined by them.



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## NAMES AND BOUNDARIES.

### 1. SYDNEY—KING DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting at Dawes' Point, on the shore of Port Jackson, at the foot of George-street North; and bounded thence by George-street North and George-street generally southerly to Liverpool-street; thence by that street easterly and Oxford-street south-easterly to Burton-street; thence by that street easterly to Riley-street; thence by that street northerly to Sir John Young's Crescent; thence by Sir John Young's Crescent and Lincoln's Crescent generally north-easterly to the northern extremity of Lincoln's Crescent; thence by a line bearing north-east to the waters of Port Jackson; and thence by the waters of Port Jackson to the starting point;—together with the waters of Port Jackson and the islands therein east of a line joining Blue's Point and Dawes' Point, and also east of a line joining Middle Head and Grotto Point, and south of a line joining Dobroyd Point and Green Point; and together with South Solitary, Montague, and Lord Howe Islands.

### 2. SYDNEY—FITZROY DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting on Rushcutter's Bay Creek at the crossing of Bayswater Road; and bounded thence by Bayswater Road westerly to Upper William-street South; thence by that street westerly to Victoria-street; thence by that street northerly to William-street; thence by that street westerly to Riley-street; thence by that street northerly to Sir John Young's Crescent; thence by Sir John Young's Crescent and Lincoln's Crescent generally north-easterly to the northern extremity of Lincoln's Crescent; thence by a line bearing north-east to the waters of Port Jackson; thence by the waters of Port Jackson to the mouth of Rushcutter's Creek; and thence by the centre of that creek southerly to the starting point.

### 3. SYDNEY—BLIGH DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting at Bayswater Road, at its intersection with Barcom-street; and bounded thence by Bayswater Road westerly to Upper William-street South; thence by that street westerly to Victoria-street; thence by that street northerly to William-street; thence by that street westerly to Riley-street; thence by that street southerly to Burton-street; thence by that street westerly to Oxford-street; thence by that street south-easterly to Great Barcom-street; and thence by that street and Barcom-street north-easterly to the starting point.

### 4. SYDNEY—FLINDERS DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Riley-street with Oxford-street; and bounded thence by Riley-street southerly to Tudor-street; thence by that street easterly to Crown-street; thence by that street southerly to Davis-street; thence by that street easterly to Bourke-street; thence by that street southerly to Nobbs-street; thence by that street easterly to Dowling-street; thence by that street northerly to Oxford-street; and thence by that street north-westerly to the starting point.

### 5. SYDNEY—BELMORE DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Liverpool-street with Elizabeth-street, and bounded thence by Elizabeth-street southerly to Foveaux-street; thence by that street south-easterly and easterly to Riley-street; thence by that street northerly to Oxford-street; and thence by that street north-westerly and by Liverpool-street westerly to the starting point.

## 6. SYDNEY—COOK DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Elizabeth-street with Cleveland-street; and bounded thence by Cleveland-street easterly to Dowling-street; thence by that street northerly to Nobbs-street; thence by that street westerly to Bourke-street; thence by that street northerly to Davis-street; thence by that street westerly to Crown-street; thence by that street northerly to Tudor-street; thence by that street westerly to Riley-street; thence by that street northerly to Foveaux-street; thence by that street westerly to Elizabeth-street; and thence by that street southerly to the starting point.

## 7. SYDNEY—PHILLIP DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of George-street with Liverpool-street; and bounded thence by George-street and George-street West southerly and westerly to Newtown Road; thence by that road southerly to Cleveland-street; thence by that street easterly to Elizabeth-street; thence by that street northerly to Liverpool-street; and thence by that street westerly to the starting point.

## 8. SYDNEY—DENISON DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Hay and George Streets; and bounded thence on part of the east, south-east, and south by George-street and George-street West southerly, south-westerly, and westerly to Bay-street; thence by that street northerly to William Henry-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Wattle-street; thence by that street north-westerly to the south-westerly prolongation of Fig-street; thence by that prolongation and street and the prolongation of its centre line north-easterly to the waters of Port Jackson; thence by the waters of Port Jackson south-easterly to meet a line due north from the intersection of the centre lines of Pier-street and Lackey-street; thence by a line due south to that intersection; and thence by Lackey-street south-easterly to Hay-street; and thence by that street easterly to the starting point.

## 9. SYDNEY—PYRMONT DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Wattle-street with the south-westerly prolongation of Fig-street; and bounded thence by Wattle-street and the prolongation of its centre line north-westerly to the waters of Port Jackson; thence by the waters of Port Jackson to meet the north-easterly prolongation of the centre line of Fig-street; and thence by that prolongation and that street and its prolongation south-westerly to the starting point.

## 10. SYDNEY—BRISBANE DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting on the waters of Port Jackson, at the foot of Margaret-street; and bounded thence by that street easterly to Kent-street; thence by that street northerly to Charlotte-place; thence by Charlotte-place easterly to George-street; thence by that street southerly to Hay-street; thence by that street westerly to Lackey-street; thence by that street north-westerly to the south-eastern side of Pier-street; thence by a line due north to the waters of Port Jackson; and thence by the waters of Port Jackson generally northerly to the starting point; together with the waters of Port Jackson, its tributaries, and the islands therein west of a line joining Blue's Point and Dawes' Point, together with the waters of Port Jackson and the islands therein west of a line joining Blue's Point and Dawes' Point.

## 11. SYDNEY—GIPPS DIVISION.

Comprising part of the City of Sydney, county of Cumberland: Starting at Dawes' Point, on the shore of Port Jackson at the foot of George-street North; and bounded thence by that street generally southerly to Charlotte-place; thence by Charlotte-place westerly to Kent-street; thence by that street southerly to Margaret-street; thence by that street westerly to the waters of Port Jackson; and thence by the waters of Port Jackson to the starting point.

## 12. PADDINGTON.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Oxford-street with Great Barcom-street; and bounded thence by Oxford-street south-easterly to Green's Road; thence by Green's Road southerly, by Park Road easterly, and by Oatley Road northerly to Oxford-street; thence by that street easterly and south-easterly to the Point Piper Road; thence by that road easterly and north-easterly to the south-easterly prolongation of the centre of Sutherland-street; thence by that prolongation, by Sutherland-street north-westerly to Cascade-street; thence by Cascade-street and Glenmore Road northerly to the New South Head Road; thence by that road and the Bayswater Road westerly to Barcom-street; and thence by that street and Great Barcom-street south-westerly to the starting point.

## 13. REDFERN EAST.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Cleveland-street with Dowling-street; and bounded thence by Dowling-street southerly to Crescent-street; thence by that street westerly to Bourke-street; thence by that street northerly to the southern boundary of the Borough of Redfern; thence by that boundary westerly to Bullanaming-street; thence by that street northerly to Cleveland-street; and thence by that street easterly to the starting point.

## 14. REDFERN WEST.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Cleveland-street with Bullanaming-street; and bounded thence by the latter street southerly to the southern boundary of the Borough of Redfern; thence by that boundary westerly and south-westerly to the western boundary of the said Borough; thence by that boundary northerly to Wilson-street; thence by that street westerly to Forbes-street; thence by that street northerly to Newtown Road; thence by that Road north-easterly to Cleveland-street; and thence by that street easterly to the starting point.

## 15. WATERLOO.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Dowling-street with Crescent-street; and bounded thence by Crescent-street westerly to Bourke-street; thence by that street northerly to the southern boundary of the Borough of Redfern; thence by that boundary generally westerly to the western boundary of the said Borough; thence by that boundary southerly to the Erskineville Road; thence by that road westerly to Park-street; thence by that street southerly to Swanson-street; thence by that street easterly and Copeland-street south-easterly to Mitchell's Road; thence by that road north-easterly to Buckland-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Botany Road; thence by that road south-easterly to M'Evoy-street; thence by that street north-easterly and easterly and by the prolongation of its centre line easterly to Bourke-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Lachlan-street; thence by that street easterly to Dowling-street; and thence by that street northerly to the starting point.

## 16. GLEBE EAST.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of the Parramatta Road with Bay-street; and bounded thence by the Parramatta Road westerly to Derwent-street; thence by that street north-westerly to St. John's Road; thence by that road south-westerly to Ross-street; thence by that street and the tram-line to Balmain north-westerly to Johnstone's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the waters of Port Jackson; thence by those waters to Darling-street, Pyrmont; thence by that street (which forms the north-eastern boundary of Wentworth Park) south-easterly to William Henry-street; thence by that street to Bay-street; and thence by that street southerly to the starting point.

## 17. GLEBE WEST.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of the Parramatta Road with Derwent-street; and bounded thence by the Parramatta Road westerly to White's Creek; thence by that creek to the waters of Port Jackson; thence by the waters of Port Jackson and by Johnstone's Creek southerly to the tram-line from Balmain to Sydney; thence by that tram-line and Ross-street south-easterly to St. John's Road; thence by St. John's Road north-easterly to Derwent-street; and thence by Derwent-street south-easterly to the starting point.

## 18. BALMAIN—FRANKLIN DIVISION.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting on the waters of Port Jackson at the foot of Reynolds-street; and bounded thence by that street generally north-westerly to Mullins-street; thence by that street and Montague-street (crossing Darling-street) and by Rowntree-street, northerly to Macquarie-terrace; thence by that terrace to Grove Road; thence by that road to Water-street; thence by that street to the waters of Port Jackson; thence by those waters to the boundary dividing the Municipalities of Leichhardt and Balmain; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the left bank of White's Creek; and thence by that bank of that creek and the waters of Port Jackson to the starting point,—including Glebe Island.

## 19. BALMAIN—WATERVIEW DIVISION.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the waters of Port Jackson at the foot of Reynolds-street; and bounded thence by that street generally north-westerly to Mullins-street; thence by that street and Montague-street (crossing Darling-street) and by Rowntree-street, northerly to Macquarie-terrace; thence by that terrace to Grove Road; thence by that road north-easterly to Water-street; thence by that street north-westerly to the waters of Port Jackson; and thence by those waters to the starting point.

## 20. ST. LEONARDS.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the waters of Port Jackson, at the foot of Horace-street, Ball's Head Bay; and bounded thence by those waters and by the creek flowing into Neutral Harbour, and forming part of the western boundary of Thrupp's Estate, northerly to Bent-street; thence by that street northerly to Falcon-street; thence by that street westerly to West-street; thence by that street southerly and south-westerly to the Lane Cove Road; thence by that road southerly to Bay Road; thence by that road south-westerly to the Crows' Nest Road; thence by that road south-westerly and southerly to Horace-street; and thence by that street westerly to the starting point.

## 21. WOOLLAHRA.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Rushcutters' Creek with the New South Head Road; and bounded thence by that road easterly to the Glenmore Road; thence by that Road and Cascade-street southerly to Sutherland-street; thence by Sutherland-street and the prolongation of its centre line south-easterly to the Point Piper Road; thence by that road south-westerly to Oxford-street; thence by that street, the Old South Head Road, Ocean-street, Wallis-street, Edgecliff Road, and again by the Old South Head Road to the southern boundary of the Light House Reserve; thence by that boundary (being the northernmost boundary of the Borough of Waverley) easterly to the Ocean; thence by the Ocean and the waters of Port Jackson northerly and southerly to Rushcutters' Creek; and thence by that creek southerly to the starting point.

## 22. WAVERLEY.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the point of contact of the Old South Head Road with Wallis-street; and bounded thence by that road easterly to the western boundary of the Borough of Waverley, thence by that boundary southerly to Boundary-street; thence by that street easterly to Carrington Road; thence by that road southerly to Alice-street; thence by that street easterly to Albion-street; thence by that street northerly to Macpherson-street; thence by that street easterly to St. Thomas-street; thence by that street southerly to Boundary-street East; thence by that street easterly to the Ocean; thence by the Ocean northerly to the south-eastern corner of the Lighthouse Reserve; thence by the southern boundary of that reserve (being the northernmost boundary of the Borough of Waverley) westerly to the Old South Head Road; and thence by that road, the Edgecliff Road, and Wallis-street southerly and westerly to the starting point.

### 23. RANDWICK.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Oxford-street with Dowling-street; and bounded thence by Dowling street southerly to the southern boundary of the Sydney Common; thence by that boundary easterly to the Bunnerong Road; thence by that road partly known as Eastern Avenue southerly to Rainbow-street; thence by that street easterly to the Ocean; thence by the Ocean northerly to Boundary-street East; thence by that street westerly to St. Thomas-street; thence by that street northerly to Macpherson-street; thence by that street westerly to Albion-street; thence by that street southerly to Alice-street; thence by that street westerly to Carrington Road; thence by that road northerly to Boundary-street; thence by that street and its prolongation westerly to the western boundary of the borough of Waverley; thence by that boundary northerly to the Old South Head Road; thence by that road and Oxford-street westerly to Oatley Road; thence by that road southerly, by Park Road westerly, by Green's Road northerly to Oxford-street, and by that street westerly to the starting point.

### 24. BOTANY.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Mitchell's Road with Copeland-street; and bounded thence by Mitchell's Road north-easterly to Buckland-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Botany Road; thence by that road south-easterly to M'Evoy-street; thence by that street north-easterly and easterly and by the prolongation of its centre line easterly to Bourke-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Lachlan-street; thence by that street easterly to Dowling-street; thence by that street southerly to the southern boundary of the Sydney Common; thence by that boundary easterly to the Bunnerong Road; thence by that road, partly known as Eastern Avenue, southerly to Rainbow-street; thence by that street easterly to the Ocean; thence by the Ocean southerly, and by the northern shore of Botany Bay north-westerly, and by the left bank of Cook's River upwards to Shea's Creek; thence by Shea's Creek upwards to Ricketty Road; thence by that road north-westerly to the boundary dividing the Municipalities of St. Peter's and Alexandria; thence by that boundary north-easterly and northerly, and by Waterloo Road northerly, and by Mitchell's Road easterly and north-easterly to the starting point;—together with Bare Island.

### 25. NEWTOWN—CAMPERDOWN DIVISION.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of the Parramatta Road with the Newtown Road; and bounded thence by the Parramatta Road westerly to Johnstone's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Salisbury-street; thence by that street easterly to Kingston Road; thence by that road southerly to Trade-street; thence by that street easterly to Peirce-street; thence by that street south-westerly to Horbury-terrace; thence by that terrace north-westerly to Liberty-street; thence by that street south-westerly to the Stanmore Road; thence by that road south-easterly to the Enmore Road; thence by that road north-easterly to King-street; and thence by that street and Newtown Road north-easterly to the starting point.

### 26. NEWTOWN—ERSKINE DIVISION.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of the Newtown Road with Forbes-street; and bounded thence by the Newtown Road, King-street, and the Cook's River Road, south-westerly and south-easterly, crossing the Illawarra Railway, to Mitchell's Road; thence by that road north-easterly, easterly, and again north-easterly to Copeland-street; thence by that street north-westerly and Swanson-street westerly to Park-street; thence by that street northerly to the Erskineville Road; thence by that road north-easterly to the eastern boundary of the Municipal District of Erskineville; thence by that boundary and its prolongation north-westerly to Wilson-street; thence by that street south-westerly to Forbes-street; and thence by that street north-westerly to the starting point.

### 27. NEWTOWN—ST. PETER'S DIVISION.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting on the left bank of Cook's River at its intersection with the centre of the Illawarra Railway; and bounded thence on the south-west and south-east by that bank of that river downwards, and by the right bank of Shea's Creek upwards to Ricketty Road; thence by that road north-westerly to the boundary dividing the municipalities of St. Peter's and Alexandria; thence by that boundary north-easterly and northerly and Cook's River Road and King-street, crossing the Illawarra Railway, northerly, north-westerly, and north-easterly to Enmore Road; thence by that road generally south-westerly to Juliet-street; thence by that street south-easterly to Harrow Road; thence by that road northerly to the Edgeware Road; thence by that road south-easterly to the centre of the Illawarra Railway; and thence by a line along the centre of that railway south-westerly to the starting point.

## 28. MARRICKVILLE.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting on the left bank of Cook's River at its intersection with the centre of the Illawarra Railway; and bounded thence by the left bank of that river upwards to Garnet-street; thence by that street northerly to Canterbury New Road; thence by that road and Stanmore Road generally easterly to the Enmore Road; thence by that road southerly to Juliet-street; thence by that street south-easterly to Harrow Road; thence by that road north-easterly to the Edgeware Road; thence by that road south-easterly to the centre of the Illawarra Railway; and thence by a line along the centre of that railway south-westerly to the starting point.

## 29. PETERSHAM.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Parramatta Road and Johnstone's Creek; and bounded thence by Parramatta Road westerly to Long Cove Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Canterbury Old Road; thence by that road westerly and south-westerly to Canterbury New Road; thence by that road and Stanmore Road easterly to Liberty-street; thence by that street northerly to Horbury-terrace; thence by that terrace south-easterly to Peirce-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Trade-street; thence by that street westerly to Kingston Road; thence by that road northerly to Salisbury-street; thence by that street westerly to Johnstone's Creek; and thence by that creek downwards to the starting point.

## 30. LEICHHARDT.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting on the left bank of White's Creek at the south-eastern extremity of the boundary dividing the municipalities of Balmain and Leichhardt; and bounded thence by that boundary north-westerly to the waters of Port Jackson; thence by the waters of Port Jackson and Long Cove Creek southerly to the Parramatta Road; thence by that road easterly to White's Creek; and thence by that creek northerly to the starting point.

## 31. ASHFIELD.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of Long Cove Creek and the Parramatta Road; and bounded thence by that creek upwards to the Canterbury Old Road; thence by that road westerly and south-westerly to South or Princes-street; thence by that street westerly to Holden-street South; thence by that street northerly to a southern boundary of the municipality of Ashfield; thence by that boundary westerly to the western boundary of that municipality; thence by that boundary northerly to George's River Road; thence by that road south-westerly to Greenhills-street; thence by that street northerly to the Liverpool Road; thence by that road south-easterly to Edwin-street; thence by that street north-easterly to the centre of Main Railway; thence by a line along the centre of that railway north-westerly to Meta-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Grosvenor-street; thence by that street north-westerly to Young-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Boundary-street; thence by that street easterly to Robinson-street; thence by that street northerly to Queen-street; thence by that street easterly to Lang-street; thence by that street northerly to the Parramatta Road; thence by that road south-easterly to Iron Cove Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the waters of Long Cove; and thence by those waters north-easterly and southerly and by Long Cove Creek upwards to the starting point.

## 32. BURWOOD.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of the Parramatta Road with Lang-street; and bounded thence by that street southerly to Queen-street; thence by that street westerly to Robinson-street; thence by that street southerly to Boundary-street; thence by that street westerly to Young-street; thence by that street south-westerly to Grosvenor Road; thence by that road south-easterly to Meta-street; thence by that street south-westerly to the centre of Main Railway; thence by a line along the centre of that railway south-easterly to Edwin-street; thence by that street south-westerly to the Liverpool Road; thence by that road generally westerly and south-westerly to the Boulevard, which forms the boundary dividing the Municipalities of Burwood and Strathfield; thence by that Boulevard northerly to the centre of the Northern Railway; thence by a line along the centre of that railway north-westerly to the Parramatta Road; thence by that road westerly to Powell's Creek; thence by that Creek downwards to the waters of the Parramatta River; thence by those waters to the south-western boundary of the borough of Drummoyne; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the waters of Long Cove; thence by those waters generally south-westerly and by Iron Cove Creek upwards to the Parramatta Road; and thence by that road north-westerly to the starting point.

## 33. JERSEY.

Comprising two parts of the county of Cumberland: Starting on the left bank of the Parramatta River at the southern extremity of the Orphan School Road; and bounded thence by that road northerly to the Kissing Point Road; thence by that road south-westerly to the eastern boundary of section 73 of the town of Parramatta; thence by that eastern boundary and the eastern boundary of section 72A northerly, and by the north-eastern boundary of the last-named section north-westerly to Belmore-street East; thence by that street south-westerly to the south-western boundary of Francis Oakes' 50 acres; thence by that boundary and the south-western boundary of T. and J. Hackett's 120 acres north-westerly, and by part of the north-western boundary of the said 120 acres north-easterly, to the south-western boundary of D. Nairn's 76 acres; thence by that boundary north-westerly to the Governor's Arms Road; thence by that road generally north-easterly to the road from Carlingford to Peat's Ferry; thence by that road northerly and north-easterly to Boundary Road (which was formerly the north-eastern boundary of the Field of Mars Common); thence by that road south-easterly to Terry's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Lane Cove River; thence by the right bank of that river downwards to the Parramatta River; and thence by the left bank of that river upwards to the starting point;—Together with the area contained within the boundaries of the Borough of Drummoyne, on the south side of the Parramatta River.

## 34. WILLOUGHBY.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting on the shores of Port Jackson at the extremity of Horace-street, Ball's Head Bay; and bounded thence by that street easterly to Crow's Nest Road; thence by that road northerly and north-easterly to Bay Road; thence by that road north-easterly to Lane Cove Road; thence by that road north-westerly to West-street; thence by that street north-easterly and northerly to Falcon-street; thence by that street easterly to meet the southerly prolongation of the eastern boundary of Cammeray Park; thence by that prolongation and boundary northerly to Willoughby Falls Creek; thence by that creek and by the western shore of Middle Harbour and Middle Harbour Creek upwards to the source of Middle Harbour Creek; thence by a line, crossing the road from Gordon to Pitt Water, and forming part of the eastern boundary of the parish of Gordon, northerly to the source of Cowan Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Hawkesbury River; thence by the right bank of that river upwards to Berowra Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the south-eastern boundary of portion 20 of 80 acres, parish of North Colah; thence by that boundary south-westerly, and by the south-western boundary of that portion and its prolongation north-westerly to the road from Dural to Parramatta; thence by that road generally southerly to the Pennant Hills Road at Rogan's Hill; thence by that road south-easterly to the road to Peat's Ferry at Thompson's Corner; thence by that road north-easterly to Boundary Road (which was formerly the north-eastern boundary of the Field of Mars Common); thence by that road south-easterly to Terry's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Lane Cove River; and thence by a line crossing that river, and by its left bank downwards, and by the waters of Port Jackson, to the starting point;—Together with the waters and the islands therein of Broken Bay and the Hawkesbury River with their southern tributaries, from the Ocean westerly to a line joining Fisherman's Point with Bar Point, but exclusive of the waters and the islands therein of Pitt Water south of a line joining West Head with Barranjoey, and the waters and the islands therein of Brisbane Water north of a line running due west from Kourong-Courong.

## 35. WARRINGAH.

Comprising parts of the county of Cumberland: Starting on the waters of Port Jackson at the outlet of the creek which flows into Neutral Harbour; and bounded thence by that creek northerly to the eastern side of Bent-street; thence by that side of that street and by a line partly forming the eastern boundary of Cammeray Park northerly to Willoughby Falls Creek; and thence by that creek and by the waters of Middle Harbour and Port Jackson to the starting point. Together with the area now secondly described:—Starting at the Ocean at the North Head of Port Jackson; and bounded thence by the Ocean northerly to Barranjoey; thence by the waters of Broken Bay to the entrance to Pitt Water and by the Pitt Water and the Hawkesbury River to Cowan Creek; thence by that creek upwards, and by that branch which forms the north-eastern boundary of the parish of Gordon upwards to its source; thence by a line southerly crossing the road from Gordon to Pitt Water, and forming part of the eastern boundary of the said parish, to the source of Middle Harbour Creek; thence by that creek downwards, and by the waters of Middle Harbour and Port Jackson to the Ocean at the starting point;—Together with the waters of Port Jackson north of a line joining Green Point with Dobroyd Point, and also the waters of Middle Harbour west of a line joining Middle Head with Grotto Point, and also the waters of Pitt Water and the islands therein south of a line joining Barranjoey and the West Head of Broken Bay.

## 36. ST. GEORGE.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland; Starting on the right bank of Cook's River at its intersection with the centre of the Illawarra Railway; and bounded thence by that bank of that river downwards, by the shores of Botany Bay southerly and south-westerly, and by the left banks of George's River and Salt Pan Creek upwards to the northern boundary of the Municipality of Hurstville; and thence by that boundary easterly, north-easterly, north-westerly, and again north-easterly and by Woolli Creek and the right bank of Cook's River downwards to the starting point.

## 37. SALISBURY.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting on the left bank of Salt-pan Creek at its intersection with the northern boundary of the Municipality of Hurstville; and bounded thence by that boundary generally north-easterly and by Woolli Creek downwards to Cook's River; thence by that river upwards to Garnet-street (being the line forming the boundary between the Municipalities of Marrickville and Canterbury); thence by Garnet-street northerly to the Canterbury New Road; thence by that road westerly to the Canterbury Old Road; thence by that road south-westerly to Princes-street; thence by that street westerly to Holden-street; thence by that street northerly to the boundary dividing the Municipalities of Ashfield and Canterbury; thence by that boundary westerly and northerly to Green Hills-street; thence by that street northerly to the Liverpool Road; thence by that road generally westerly to the Boulevard; thence by that Boulevard (being the boundary between the Municipalities of Strathfield and Burwood northerly to the centre of the Great Northern Railway; thence by the centre line of that railway north-westerly to the Parramatta Road; thence by that road westerly to Powell's Creek; thence by the left bank of that creek downwards to the creek which forms part of the eastern boundary of the Municipality of Rookwood; thence by that creek upwards to the Parramatta Road; thence by that road easterly to the western boundary of J. Fleming's 200 acres, "The Flemington Estate"; thence by that boundary and its prolongation southerly to the centre of the Main Railway; thence by the centre line of that railway westerly to the prolongation of the northern boundary of the area set apart for a Necropolis; thence by the northern boundary of that area easterly, by its eastern boundary southerly, by its southern boundary westerly, and by part of an eastern boundary of the area resumed for the State Model Farm southerly to the Water-supply Pipes; thence by that line of pipes westerly to the Woodville Road; thence by that road and the main Southern Road southerly to Prospect Creek at Lansdowne Bridge; thence by that creek and Orphan School Creek upward to the Old Cowpasture Road; thence by that road southerly to the road from Bringelly to Liverpool; thence by that road easterly to the Main Southern Road; thence by that road north-easterly to the northern boundary of the parish of Minto; thence by that boundary easterly to George's River; thence by that river upwards to Harrow Road of the Moorbank Estate; thence by that road easterly to the western boundary of portion 52, parish of Holdsworthy; thence by that boundary northerly, and by part of the northern boundary of that portion easterly to Harris Creek; thence by that creek downwards to George's River; thence by that river downwards to Salt-pan Creek; and thence by that creek upwards to the starting point.

## 38. GLADSTONE.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of A'Beckett's Creek and the Western Railway Line; and bounded thence by A'Beckett's Creek downwards to the Duck River; thence by that river downwards to the Parramatta River; thence by that river downwards and by Powell's Creek upwards to the creek which forms part of the eastern boundary of the Municipality of Rookwood; thence by that creek upwards to the Parramatta Road; thence by that road easterly to the western boundary of J. Fleming's 200 acres, "The Flemington Estate;" thence by that boundary southerly to the centre of the Main Railway; thence by the centre line of that railway westerly to the prolongation of the northern boundary of the area set apart for a Necropolis; thence by the northern boundary of that area easterly, by its eastern boundary southerly, by its southern boundary westerly, and by part of an eastern boundary of the area resumed for the State Model Farm southerly to the Water-supply Pipes; thence by that line of pipes westerly to the road from Smithfield to Parramatta; thence by that road north-easterly to Auburn-street, town of Parramatta; thence by that street easterly to Pitt Row; thence by Pitt Row northerly to Crown-street; thence by that street south-easterly to Fox-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Railway-street; thence by that street easterly to the Sydney Road; thence by that road southerly to A'Beckett's Creek; and thence by that creek downwards to the starting point.

## 39. PARRAMATTA.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of A'Beckett's Creek with the Western Railway; and bounded thence by A'Beckett's Creek upwards to the Sydney Road; thence by that road north-westerly to Railway-street; thence by that street and Fox-street south-westerly to Crown-street; thence by that street north-westerly and westerly to Pitt Row; thence by Pitt Row southerly to Auburn-street; thence by that street north-westerly to Burnett-street; thence by that street north-easterly to the Great Western Road; thence by that road generally westerly to a branch of Toongabbee Creek which forms part of the eastern boundary of the parish of Prospect; thence by that branch of Toongabbee Creek downwards to Toongabbee Creek, and by that creek upwards to the north-western boundary of portion 22 of 19 acres 1 rood, parish of St. John; thence by that boundary and the north-western boundaries of portions 23, 24, and 27 north-easterly to the Windsor Road; thence by that road south-easterly to Governor's Arms Road; thence by that road north-easterly to the south-western boundary of D. Nairn's 76 acres; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the north-western boundary of T. and J. Hackett's 120 acres; thence by that boundary south-westerly, and by the south-western boundary of that portion, and the south-western boundary of Francis Oakes' 50 acres south-easterly to Belmore-street East; thence by that street north-easterly to the north-eastern boundary of section 72A, town of Parramatta; thence by that boundary south-easterly and by the eastern boundary of that section and section 73 southerly to the Kissing Point Road; thence by that road north-easterly to Orphan School Road; and thence by that road southerly to the right bank of the Parramatta River; thence by that bank of that river downwards, by the left bank of Duck River upwards, and by A'Beckett's Creek upwards to the starting point.

## 40. SHERBROOKE.

Comprising part of the county of Cumberland: Starting at the intersection of the Windsor Road with the Governor's Arms Road; and bounded thence by the latter road generally north-easterly to the road from Mobbs' Hill to Rogan's Hill; thence by that road northerly and north-westerly to the road from Parramatta to Dural; thence by that road generally northerly to the south-western boundary of portion 20 of 80 acres, parish of North Colah; thence by that boundary and by the south-eastern boundary of that portion north-easterly to Berowra Creek; thence by the left bank of that creek downwards to Calabash Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the southern boundary of Railway Reserve 64, notified 20th April, 1881; thence by that boundary westerly to the main North Road to Wiseman's Ferry; thence by that road northerly to the northern boundary of the parish of Nelson; thence by that boundary (partly formed by Kelly's Arm Creek) westerly to Cattai Creek; thence by that creek upwards, and by the Second Ponds Creek upwards, to the road from Windsor to Parramatta; thence by that road south-easterly to the road leading to Schofield's Siding, and forming the south-eastern boundaries of J. Faultless' 600 acres, E. Rouse's 300 acres, R. Fopps' 200 acres, and J. Biggs' 200 acres; thence by that road and by the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned portion south-westerly to Eastern Creek; thence by that creek downwards to meet the north-easterly prolongation of the south-eastern boundary of J. L. Nicholas' 700 acres; thence by that prolongation and boundary south-westerly to the Richmond Road; thence by that road south-easterly to meet the easterly prolongation of the southern boundary of J. McLouglan's 60 acres, parish of Rooty Hill; thence by that prolongation and by that boundary and the southern boundary of R. Fitzgerald's 1,350 acres westerly to the north-west corner of portion 12, parish of Rooty Hill; thence by that boundary southerly, by the road forming the southern boundary of that portion easterly, by the western boundary of portion 17 southerly, by the road forming the south-western boundary of that portion south-easterly, and by the eastern boundary of George Druitt's 1,000 acres southerly to the Great Western Road; thence by that road westerly to Rope's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the northern boundary of George Johnston's 600 acres, parish of Melville; thence by that boundary and the northern boundary of George Johnston's 2,000 acres easterly, by the eastern boundary of the latter land and the old Cowpasture Road southerly to Orphan School Creek; thence by that creek (being the boundary dividing the Municipality of Prospect and Sherwood from Cabramatta and Canley Vale) downwards to Prospect Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Main Southern Road at Lansdowne Bridge; thence by that road and the Woodville Road northerly to the Water-supply Pipes; thence by that line of pipes north-westerly to the road from Smithfield to Parramatta; thence by that road north-easterly, and by Burnett-street north-easterly to the Great Western Road; thence by that road generally westerly to a branch of Toongabbie Creek, which forms part of the eastern boundary of the parish of Prospect; thence by that branch of Toongabbie Creek downwards to Toongabbie Creek, and by that creek upwards to the north-eastern boundary of portion 22 of 19 acres 1 rood, parish of St. John; thence by a line forming that north-western boundary and the north-western boundaries of portions 23, 24, and 27, north-easterly to the Windsor Road; and thence by that road south-easterly to the starting point.

## 41. THE HAWKESBURY.

Comprising parts of the counties of Cumberland, Cook, and Hunter: Starting at the junction of the Grose River with the Nepean River; and bounded thence by the Grose River upwards to the south boundary of mineral permit No. 452, parish of Blackheath, county of Cook; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that mineral permit easterly and northerly and by the eastern boundary of mineral permit No. 451 and its prolongation northerly to Bell's line of road; thence by that road south-easterly to the source of Bowen's Creek; thence by Bowen's Creek downwards to the eastern boundary of the parish of Irvine, county of Cook; thence by that boundary northerly and by the northernmost boundary of that parish westerly to Wollangambe Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Colo River; thence by that river upwards to its confluence with Wollemi Creek; thence by a line easterly to the north-west corner of portion 1, Jonathan Gosper's 40 acres, parish of Six Brothers, county of Hunter; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that portion easterly and southerly, and by the spur range easterly to the Bulga Road, near the 57-mile peg; thence by that road south-easterly and easterly to the south boundary of the parish of Wonga; thence by that boundary easterly to the Hawkesbury River and by the left bank of that river downwards to Bar Point; thence by a line south-westerly crossing the Hawkesbury River to Fisherman's Point; thence by Berowra Creek upwards to Calabash Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the southern boundary of railway reserve No. 64, notified 20th April, 1881; thence by that boundary westerly to the Main North Road to Wiseman's Ferry; thence by that road northerly to the northern boundary of the parish of Nelson; thence by that boundary westerly to Cattai Creek; thence by that creek upwards and by the Second Ponds Creek upwards to the road from Windsor to Parramatta; thence by that road south-easterly to the road leading to Scholefield's Siding and forming the south-eastern boundaries of J. Faultless' 600 acres, E. Rouse's 300 acres, R. Fopps' 200 acres, and J. Biggs' 200 acres; thence by that road and the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned portion south-westerly to Eastern Creek; thence by that creek downwards to meet the north-easterly prolongation of the south-eastern boundary of J. L. Nicholas' 700 acres; thence by that prolongation and boundary south-westerly to the Richmond Road; and thence by that road and the southern boundary of Ham Common and its prolongation north-westerly to the starting point.

## 42. THE NEPEAN.

Comprising parts of the counties of Cumberland and Cook: Starting on the Nepean River at the north-western corner of the parish of Castlereagh, county of Cumberland; and bounded thence by the northern boundary of that parish and the parish of Londonderry easterly to the road from Richmond to Sydney; thence by that road south-easterly to the southern boundary of J. McLaughlin's 60 acres, parish of Rooty Hill; thence by that boundary and the southern boundary of R. Fitzgerald's 1,350 acres grant westerly to the north-west corner of portion 12, parish of Rooty Hill; thence by that boundary southerly, by the road forming the southern boundary of that portion easterly, by the western boundary of portion 17 southerly, by the road forming the south-western boundary of that portion south-easterly, and by the eastern boundary of George Druitt's 1,000 acres southerly to the Great Western Road; thence by that road westerly to Ropes' Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the northern boundary of George Johnstone's 600 acres, parish of Melville, county of Cumberland; thence by that boundary and the northern boundary of George Johnstone's 2,000 acres easterly, by the eastern boundary of the latter portion, and by the Old Cow-pasture Road southerly to the Bringelly Road; thence by that road westerly to Bringelly Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Nepean River; thence by that river downwards to its junction with the Warragamba River; and thence by the range forming the northern watershed of the Warragamba River westerly and northerly to the southern boundary of portion 23, parish of Kedumba, county of Cook; thence by the southern boundary of that portion westerly, and by part of its western boundary northerly to the south boundary of portion 21; thence by the south boundaries of that portion and portion 22 and their prolongation westerly to Waterfall Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Kedumba or Jamison's Valley Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the creek which forms part of the southern boundary of the parish of Jamison, county of Cook; thence by that creek upwards to the western boundary of that parish; thence by that boundary northerly and by the eastern boundary of the Municipal District of Katoomba and by the Mount Hay Road northerly to Mount Hay; thence by a line north-easterly to the south-west corner of portion 93; thence by the western boundary of that portion northerly to the Grose River; thence by that river downwards to the Nepean River; and thence by a line easterly to the starting point.

## 43. CAMDEN.

Comprising parts of the counties of Camden, Westmoreland, Cumberland, and Cook: Starting at the confluence of the Nepean and Warragamba Rivers; and bounded thence by the range forming the northern watershed of the Warragamba River westerly and northerly to the southern boundary of portion 23, parish of Kedumba, county of Cook; thence by the southern boundary of that portion westerly and part of its western boundary northerly to the south boundary of portion 21; thence by the south boundaries of that portion and portion 22 and their prolongation westerly to Waterfall Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Kedumba or Jamieson's Valley Creek; thence by that creek downwards to its confluence with Cox's River; thence by that river upwards to its confluence with the Kowmung River; thence by that river upwards to its source nearest to Mount Collong; thence by a line to that mountain and by the range from that mountain southerly to the source of Myanga Valley Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Jooriland Creek; thence by that creek downwards to its confluence with the Wollondilly River; thence by that river upwards to its confluence with Bonnum Pic Creek; thence by that creek upward to the southern boundary of the parish of Nattai, county of Camden; thence by that boundary easterly to Allum River; thence by that river downwards to the Nattai River; thence by that river downwards to Martin's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the southern boundary of portion 1, W. Mitchell's 200 acres, parish of Killawarrah; thence by that southern boundary and a line east to the Little River; thence by that river downwards to Blue Gum Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the area reclaimed for the water-supply pipes to Picton Lakes Platform; thence by that reclamation easterly to the western boundary of the enclosure of the Great Southern Railway; thence by that boundary northerly to meet the westerly prolongation of Nattai-street, of the Town of Couridjah; thence by that prolongation and street and the northern boundary of portion 122, parish of Couridjah, easterly, and by the eastern boundary of that portion southerly to the northern boundary of portion 121; thence by the northern boundary of that portion easterly, and by part of its eastern boundary southerly to the road from Picton Lakes Platform to the Bargo River; thence by that road easterly to that river; thence by that river downwards to the Nepean River; thence by that river downwards and the Cordeaux River upwards to where it meets the boundaries dividing the parishes of Wallandoola and Wilton, county of Camden; thence by that boundary northerly to the Boorimea or Cascade Creek; thence by that creek downwards (being also the boundary between the above-mentioned parishes) to its confluence with the Cataract River; thence by that river and Cataract Creek upwards to the boundary dividing the parishes of Wedderburn and Southend, county of Cumberland; thence by that boundary north-easterly to the source of the Iluka Creek; thence by that creek and O'Hare's Creek downwards to where it meets the western boundary of portion 85 of 149 acres 1 rood, parish of Southend, county of Cumberland; thence by that boundary northerly and the northern boundary of that portion easterly to the road from Liverpool to Wollongong; thence by that road generally northerly to where it crosses the Woronora River; thence by that river downwards to George's River; thence by that river upwards to Harris Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the northern boundary of portion 52, parish of Holdsworthy, county of Cumberland; thence by part of that boundary westerly and by part of the western boundary of that parish southerly to Harrow Road of the Moorbank Estate; thence by that road westerly to George's River; thence by that river downwards to the northern boundary of the parish of Minto; thence by that boundary westerly to the Main Southern Road; thence by that road south-westerly to the Bringelly Road; thence by that road westerly and southerly to Bringelly Creek; thence by that creek downwards to its confluence with the Nepean River; thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

## 44. WORONORA.

Comprising parts of the counties of Cumberland and Camden: Starting on the Ocean, at the mouth of Para Creek; and bounded thence by the boundary dividing the municipalities of North Illawarra and Wollongong westerly and southerly to the Mount Keira Road; thence by that road westerly to the northern boundary of portion 2, parish of Kembla; thence by that boundary westerly to the Goondarin Creek; thence by that creek downwards to its confluence with the Cordeaux River; thence by that river downwards to where it meets the boundary dividing the parishes of Wallandoola and Wilton, county of Camden; thence by that boundary northerly to the Boorimea or Cascade Creek; thence by that creek downwards (being also the boundary between the above-mentioned parishes) to its confluence with the Cataract River; thence by that river and Cataract Creek upwards to the boundary dividing the parishes of Wedderburn and Southend, county of Cumberland; thence by that boundary north-easterly to the source of Iluka Creek; thence by that creek and O'Hare's Creek downwards to where it meets the western boundary of portion 85 of 149 acres 1 rood, parish of Southend, county of Cumberland; thence by that boundary northerly and the northern boundary of that portion easterly to the road from Liverpool to Wollongong; thence by that road generally northerly to where it crosses the Woronora River; thence by that river and George's River downwards and the shores of Botany Bay to the Ocean; and thence by the Ocean southerly to the starting point,—including the waters of Port Hacking.

## 45. ILLAWARRA.

Comprising part of the county of Camden: Starting on the Ocean at the mouth of Para Creek; and bounded thence by the boundary dividing the municipalities of North Illawarra and Wollongong westerly and southerly to the Mount Keira Road; thence by that road westerly to the northern boundary of portion 2, parish of Kembla; thence by that boundary westerly to Goondarin Creek; thence by that creek downwards to its confluence with the Cordeaux River; thence by that river downwards to the western boundary of the parish of Kembla; thence by that boundary and the western boundary of the parish of Calderwood generally southerly, and by part of the south-western and western boundary of the parish of Jamberoo south-easterly and southerly to the Minumurra River; thence by that river downwards to the Ocean; and thence by the Ocean northerly to the starting point,—inclusive of Illawarra Lake and the islands therein, and together with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined.

## 46. KIAMA.

Comprising a part of the county of Camden: Starting on the Ocean at the mouth of the Minumurra River; and bounded thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the parishes of Jamberoo and Calderwood from the parishes of Wallaya and Kangaloon; thence by that boundary generally north-westerly to the Macquarie Pass Road; thence by that road generally westerly to Molly Morgan's Creek, and by that creek downwards to the road from Dapto, *viâ* Stock-yard Swamp, to Mittagong; thence by that road (being the northern boundary of the parish of Kangaloon) westerly to London or Mittagong River; thence by that river downwards and by Double's Folly Creek upwards to the northern boundary of George Riley's 2,560 acres, parish of Mittagong; thence by that boundary easterly, and the eastern boundary of that portion, and its prolongation southerly to the southern margin of the Wingecarribee Swamp; thence by that margin generally westerly to the southern boundary of T. D. Rowe's 1,000 acres, parish of Yarrunga; thence by part of that boundary westerly to the road forming the western boundary of Edward Shipley's 80 acres; thence by that road southerly to the road forming the southern boundary of portions 12 and 13; thence by that road westerly to the road leading to the Fitzroy Waterfalls, and partly forming the western boundary of portion 19 of 137 acres; thence by that road southerly to Yarrunga Creek at Fitzroy Waterfalls; thence by that creek to the Kangaroo River; thence by that river downwards to Rowland's line of road; thence by that line of road easterly to the range dividing the waters of the Kangaroo and Shoalhaven Rivers; thence by that range generally north-easterly to the road from Kangaroo Valley to Berry; thence by that road easterly to the junction at the south-west corner of portion 18, parish of Bunberra, of the road leading to Broughton Head; thence by that road northerly and north-easterly to the north boundary of portion 12, parish of Broughton; thence by a line partly forming that north boundary and the northern boundaries of portions 11 and 10, and Aspinall and Brown's 4,000 acres, easterly to the west boundary of A. Finn's 100 acres, by that boundary northerly, by the northern boundary of that portion, and the southern boundaries of David Berry's two portions of 320 acres each easterly to the western boundary of Thomas Hyde's 1,000 acres; thence by that boundary southerly and by part of the southern boundary of that portion easterly to the Crooked River; thence by that river downwards to the Ocean; and thence by the Ocean northerly to the starting point.

## 47. BOWRAL.

Comprising parts of the counties of Camden and Westmoreland: Starting at the confluence of Barber's Creek with the Shoalhaven River; and bounded thence by that creek upwards and by the boundary dividing the counties of Argyle and Camden northerly to the Uringalla Creek; thence by that creek, Paddy's River, and the Wollondilly River downwards to its confluence with Settler's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source nearest to Mount Muruin; thence by a line to that mount; thence by the range forming the southern watershed of the Kowmung River southerly and northerly to the source of Myanga Valley Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Jooriland Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Wollondilly River; thence by that river upwards to Bonnum Pic Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the southern boundary of the parish of Nattai, county of Camden; thence by that boundary easterly to Allum River; thence by that river downwards to the Nattai River; thence by that river downwards to Martin's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the southern boundary of portion 1, W. Mitchell's 200 acres, parish of Killawarrah; thence by that southern boundary and a line east to the Little River; thence by that river downwards to Blue-gum Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the area reclaimed for the water-supply pipes to Picton Lakes Platform; thence by that reclamation easterly to the western boundary of the enclosure of the Great Southern Railway; thence by that boundary northerly to meet the westerly prolongation of Nattai-street of the town of Couridjah; thence by that prolongation and street and the northern boundary of portion 122, parish of Couridjah, easterly, and by the eastern boundary of that portion southerly to the northern boundary of portion 121; thence by that northern boundary easterly, and by part of the eastern boundary of the same portion southerly to the road from Picton Lakes Platform to the Bargo River; thence by that road easterly to that river; thence by that river downwards to the Nepean River; thence by that river downwards to its confluence with the Cordeaux

River; thence by that river upwards to the western boundary of the parish of Kembla, county of Camden; thence by that boundary and the western boundary of the parish of Calderwood southerly to the Macquarie Pass Road; thence by that road and Molly Morgan's Creek westerly to the road from Dapto, *via* Stockyard Swamp, to Bowral; thence by that road (partly forming the northern boundary of the parish of Kangaloon), generally westerly to the London or Mittagong River; thence by that river downwards and by Doudle's Folly Creek upwards to the northern boundary of George Riley's 2,560 acres, parish of Mittagong, county of Camden; thence by that boundary easterly and the eastern boundary of that parish and its prolongation southerly to the southern margin of the Wingecarribee Swamp; thence by that margin generally westerly to the southern boundary of T. D. Rowe's 1,000 acres, parish of Yarrunga, county of Camden; thence by part of the southern boundary of that portion westerly to the road forming the western boundary of Edward Shipley's 80 acres, parish of Yarrunga; thence by that road southerly to the road forming the south boundaries of portions 12 and 13, parish of Yarrunga; thence by that road westerly to the road leading to the Fitzroy Waterfalls, and partly forming the western boundary of portion 19, of 137 acres; thence by that road southerly to Yarrunga Creek at Fitzroy Waterfalls; thence by that creek and the Kangaroo River downwards to the Shoalhaven River; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

#### 48. HARTLEY.

Comprising parts of the counties of Cook and Westmoreland: Starting at the confluence of Kedumba or Jamieson's Valley Creek with the Cox River; and bounded thence by that river upwards to the Kowmung River; thence by that river upwards to its source at Mount Colong; thence by the range forming the northern watershed of Muruin or Settler's Creek southerly, north-westerly, and south-westerly to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range generally northerly to the range forming the eastern watershed of Coco or Cook's Creek; thence by that range north-easterly to the Capertee River; thence by that river and the Colo River downwards to the Wallangambe Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the northernmost boundary of the parish of Irvine, county of Cook; thence by that boundary easterly and by the eastern boundary of that parish southerly to Bowen's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range forming the south-western boundary of the parish of Irvine; thence by Bell's line of road (which follows that range) to the north-east corner of mineral permit 451, parish of Blackheath; thence by the eastern boundaries of that mineral permit and mineral permit 452 south, and by the south boundary of the last-mentioned mineral permit west to the Grose River; thence by that river downwards to the north-west corner of portion 93, parish of Grose; thence by the west boundary of that portion south, and by a line south-westerly to Mount Hay; thence by the road from Mount Hay to Katoomba south-westerly, and by the easternmost boundary of the municipality of Katoomba southerly, and by part of the eastern boundary of the parish of Megalong south to the creek which forms part of the south boundary of the parish of Jamieson; thence by that creek downwards to Kedumba or Jamieson's Valley Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek downwards to the starting point.

#### 49. NORTHUMBERLAND.

Comprising parts of the counties of Hunter and Northumberland: Starting at the Ocean at the north bank of the Hawkesbury River at Box or Hawke's Head; and bounded thence by that bank of that river upwards to Kourung Courung; thence by a line west crossing the mouth of Brisbane Water, and again by the north bank of the Hawkesbury River upwards to the south boundary of the parish of Wonga, county of Hunter; thence by that boundary west to the Wheelbarrow Range; thence by that range westerly to the Bulga Road; thence by that road generally north-westerly to the 57-mile peg, which is about 3 miles south-westerly from the Six Brothers' Waterhole; thence westerly by the Spur Range, leading to Jonathan Gosper's portion 1 of 40 acres, parish of Six Brothers, to the eastern boundary of that portion; thence by its eastern and northern boundaries and a line westerly to the Colo River at its junction with Wollemi Creek; thence by that river and the Capertee River upwards to the range forming the eastern watershed of Umbrella Creek; thence by that range and the Great Dividing Range generally northerly to Mount Coricudgy; thence by the range forming the south-eastern watershed of Blackwater Creek north-easterly, and by the range dividing the waters of Baerami or Jones Creek, Gungalwa Creek, Doyle's Creek, and Parsons Creek from the waters of the Macdonald River generally easterly to the range dividing the parish of Burton from the parishes of Milbrodale and Dalton, county of Northumberland; thence by that range south-easterly and by the range forming the southern watershed of Drew's Creek easterly, *via* Mt. Dalton, to Wollombi Brook; thence by that brook downwards to the range forming the south-eastern boundaries of the parishes of Broke and Ovingham; thence by that range north-easterly to the Broken Back Range; thence by that range south-easterly, easterly, and southerly, and by the Sugarloaf Range north-easterly to the boundary dividing the parish of Teralba from the parish of Awaba; thence by that boundary generally easterly to the waters of Lake Macquarie; and thence by those waters and the waters of the Ocean to the starting point;—Together with the waters of Lake Macquarie, and the islands therein; and together also with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined.

## 50. WEST MAITLAND.

Comprising parts of the counties of Northumberland and Durham: Starting on the right bank of the Hunter River at the intersection of the westerly prolongation of the southern boundary of "Bolwarra," John Brown's 2,030 acres, parish of Middlehope, county of Durham; and bounded thence by that boundary easterly to the Hunter River; thence by that river and Wallis Creek upwards to the northern boundary of portion 7, George Brook's 2,000 acres, parish of Stockrington, county of Northumberland; thence by part of that boundary westerly, part of the eastern boundary of John Hill Garvan's 640 acres, parish of Heddon, southerly, and by the southern boundaries of that grant, and of John Callaghan's grants (two) of 640 acres each, westerly to the north-east corner of James Weston's grant of 640 acres; thence by a line partly forming the eastern boundaries of that grant, of John Terry Hughes' grants (two) of 640 acres, and of portions 54, 53, 52, 51, 6, and 5, parish of Stanford, southerly, to the south-east corner of the last-named portion; thence by the south-eastern boundary of that portion and a north boundary of portion 3 westerly, and by a western boundary of that portion and of portion 59 southerly, to the range forming part of the western boundary of the parish of Mulbring; thence by that range southerly to the Broken Back Range; thence by that range westerly and north-westerly to the Broken Back Mountain; thence by the range north-westerly to the source of Rothbury Creek; thence by that creek and Black Creek downwards to the road from Singleton to Maitland, *via* Allandale; thence by that road easterly to the road leading to Greta, being the southerly continuation of Illalong-street; thence by that road and by Illalong-street north-westerly and northerly to the south-western boundary of the Great Northern Railway enclosure; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the eastern boundary of the Municipality of Greta, being a western boundary of W. Harper's 2,000 acres; thence by that boundary northerly to the Hunter River; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

## 51. EAST MAITLAND.

Comprising part of the county of Northumberland: Starting on the right bank of the Hunter River at the north-western corner of Simeon Lord's grant of 2,000 acres, parish of Alwick, county of Northumberland; and bounded thence by that river upwards to Wallis Creek, by that creek upwards to the northern boundary of Geo. Brook's 2,000 acres, parish of Stockrington; thence by part of that boundary westerly, part of the eastern boundary of John Hill Garvan's 640-acre grant, parish of Heddon, southerly, and by the southern boundaries of that grant, and John Callaghan's grants (two) of 640 acres each westerly to the north-east corner of James Weston's grant of 640 acres; thence by a line partly forming the eastern boundaries of that grant, of John Terry Hughes' grants (two) of 640 acres each, and of portions 54, 53, 52, 51, 6, and 5, parish of Stanford, southerly to the south-east corner of the last-named portion; thence by the southern boundary of that portion, and a north boundary of portion 3 westerly, and by the western boundary of that portion and portion 59 southerly to the range forming part of the western boundary of the parish of Mulbring; thence by that range southerly to the Broken Back Range; by the Broken Back Range and the Sugarloaf Range generally southerly, north-easterly, and northerly to the road dividing portions 95 and 64, parish of Teralba; thence by that road easterly to the western boundary of portion 15A; thence by that boundary northerly, the northern boundary of that portion easterly, the western and northern boundaries of portion 16A northerly and easterly, part of the western boundary of portion 97 northerly, its northern boundary, and the northern boundaries of portions 98, 99, and 30 easterly, part of the western boundary of portion 29 northerly, and the northern boundaries of that portion and of portions 28, 27, 26, 25, 24, 23, and 21, and part of the northern boundary of portion 20, parish of Teralba, easterly, to the western boundary of the municipality of Plattsburgh; thence by that boundary northerly and the western boundaries of A. W. Scott's 598 acres, parish of Hexham, by the western boundary of W. C. Wentworth's 1,070 acres, by a western boundary of W. C. Wentworth's 830 acres and its prolongation northerly to the south-east corner of A. Sparke's grant of 300 acres, all in the same parish, and by the eastern boundary of that grant northerly to the southern boundary of Edward Sparke's 2,000 acres, parish of Alwick; thence by part of that last-named boundary easterly to the right bank of the Hunter River; thence by that bank of that river upwards to the north-eastern corner of John Terry Hughes' grant of 300 acres; and thence by the northern boundary of that grant and the southern boundary of Simeon Lord's grant of 2,000 acres westerly, and the western boundary of that grant northerly to the starting point.

## 52. WALLSEND.

Comprising part of the county of Northumberland: Starting on the waters of Lake Macquarie at the western boundary of portion 11, J. Warner's grant of 1,280 acres, parish of Kahibah; and bounded thence by part of that boundary northerly to the road from Lake Macquarie to Charleston, *via* Hillesborough; thence by that road generally north-easterly to the road forming the western boundaries of portion 12 of the parish of Kahibah, and portions 173, 172, 171, 167, 23, 142, 5A, and 141 of the parish of Newcastle; thence by that road and the western boundary of J. Platt's 2,000 acres northerly to the northern boundary of the Municipality of

Plattsburg; thence by that boundary westerly and the western boundary of that municipality southerly to the northern boundary of portion 20, parish of Teralba; thence by part of that boundary and by the northern boundaries of portions 21, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, and 29 westerly, by part of the western boundary of portion 29 southerly, by the northern boundaries of portions 30, 99, 98, and 97 westerly, by part of the western boundary of portion 97 southerly, by the northern boundary of portion 16A westerly and its western boundary southerly, and by the northern boundary of portion 15A westerly and its western boundary southerly to the road dividing portions 95 and 64 parish of Teralba; thence by that road westerly to the Sugarloaf Range; thence by that range generally southerly to the Spur Range forming the boundary dividing the parishes of Teralba and Awaba; thence by that boundary easterly, northerly, and again generally easterly to the waters of Lake Macquarie; and thence by those waters generally north-westerly and easterly to the starting point.

### 53. KAHIBAH.

Comprising part of county of Northumberland: Starting on the Ocean at the intersection of the southerly prolongation of Reuss-street; and bounded thence by that prolongation and that street and Darby-street north-easterly to the Lake Macquarie Road; thence by that road westerly and by the boundary dividing the municipalities of Hamilton and Merewether westerly, and by the boundary dividing the municipalities of Hamilton and Adamstown northerly, westerly, and again generally northerly to Young Road; thence by that road north-westerly to the boundary between the municipalities of Lambton and New Lambton (being the Lambton Railway); thence by that boundary westerly to the road forming the western boundaries of portions 167, 171, 172, and 173, parish of Newcastle, and by that road southerly to the main road from Charleston, *vid* Hillesborough, to Lake Macquarie; thence by that road generally south-westerly to the western boundary of portion 11, J. Warner's grant of 1,280 acres, parish of Kahibah; thence by that boundary southerly to the waters of Lake Macquarie; and thence by those waters southerly and the Ocean northerly to the starting point;—Together with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined.

### 54. NEWCASTLE EAST.

Comprising parts of the counties of Northumberland and Gloucester: Starting on the Ocean at the intersection of the south-easterly prolongation of Parry-street; and bounded thence by that prolongation and street north-westerly to Brooks-street; thence by that street north-easterly to Pit-street; thence by that street westerly to Darby-street; thence by that street northerly to Hunter-street West; thence by that street south-westerly to Merewether-street; thence by that street northerly to the waters of Port Hunter; and thence by those waters north-easterly, and by the Ocean south-westerly, to the starting point. Together with the area now secondly described:—Starting on the northern shore of Fullerton Cove at the south-eastern corner of William Russel's 1,155 acres, parish of Stockton, county of Gloucester; and bounded thence by part of the eastern boundary of that grant northerly; by the northern boundaries of Captain Hollinworth's 1,030 acres and John Smith's 640 acres, parish of Stowell, county of Gloucester, easterly; by part of the eastern boundary of the latter portion southerly; and by the northern boundaries of portions 155, 71, and 72, and their prolongation easterly to the Ocean; by the Ocean south-easterly to Port Hunter, and by the waters of Port Hunter and Fullerton Cove to the starting point;—and also including the waters of Port Hunter, the Hunter River, and Fullerton Cove easterly of the following lines:—(1) From the northern extremity of Merewether-street to the southern extremity of the Dyke on Bullock Island. (2) From the northern extremity of the Waratah Coal Company's Railway to the southernmost point of Moscheto Island. (3) From the north-western corner of portion 44 on Moscheto Island to the southernmost point of Smith's Island.

### 55. NEWCASTLE WEST.

Comprising part of the county of Northumberland: Starting on the Ocean at the intersection of the southerly prolongation of Reuss-street; and bounded thence by that prolongation and street northerly to Darby-street; thence by that street north-easterly to the Lake Macquarie Road; thence by that road westerly, and by the boundary dividing the municipalities of Hamilton and Merewether westerly, and by the boundary dividing the municipalities of Hamilton and Adamstown northerly, westerly, and again generally northerly to Young Road; thence by that road south-easterly to the main road from Lambton to Newcastle; thence by that road generally easterly to Swamp or Glebe Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the waters of Port Hunter; thence by those waters easterly to the northern extremity of Merewether-street; thence by that street southerly to Hunter-street West; thence by that street easterly to Darby-street; thence by that street southerly to Pit-street; thence by that street easterly to Brooks-street; thence by that street south-westerly to Parry-street; thence by that street and its prolongation south-easterly to the Ocean; and thence by the Ocean south-westerly to the starting point.

## 56. CARRINGTON.

Comprising part of the county of Northumberland: Starting at the intersection of the centre of the Waratah Railway with the Great Northern Railway; and bounded thence by the latter railway south-easterly to the main road from Maitland to Newcastle; thence by that road south-easterly to Swamp or Glebe Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the waters of Port Hunter; thence by those waters easterly to the northern extremity of Merewether-street; thence by a line north-easterly to the southern extremity of the Dyke; thence by the waters of Port Hunter and the right bank of the Hunter River generally north-westerly to the Waratah Railway; and thence by that railway south-westerly to the starting point.

## 57. WARATAH.

Comprising part of the county of Northumberland: Starting on the right bank of the south branch of the Hunter River at the northern extremity of the Waratah Railway; and bounded thence by that railway south-westerly to the Great Northern Railway; thence by that railway south-easterly to the main road from Maitland to Newcastle; thence by that road south-easterly to the main road from Newcastle to Lambton; thence by that road westerly to Young Road; thence by that road north-westerly to the boundary dividing the municipalities of Lambton and New Lambton, being the centre of the Lambton Railway; thence by that boundary to the road forming the western boundaries of portions 23, 142, 5A, and 141, parish of Newcastle; thence by that road and the western boundary of J. Platt's 2,000 acres northerly to the northern boundary of the Plattsburg Municipality; thence by that boundary westerly to the north-western corner of that municipality; thence by part of the western boundary of A. W. Scott's portion 9 of 598 acres, by the western boundary of W. C. Wentworth's 1,070 acres, by a western boundary of W. C. Wentworth's 830 acres and its prolongation northerly to the south-east corner of A. Sparke's 300 acres, and by the eastern boundary of that portion northerly to the southern boundary of Edward Sparke's 2,000 acres; thence by part of that boundary easterly to the right bank of the Hunter River; and thence by that bank of that river and of its north channel downwards and a line south-westerly to the starting point;— Together with Hexham Island, Ash Island, Moscheto Island, Dempsey Island, and Spit Island.

## 58. GLOUCESTER.

Comprising parts of the counties of Gloucester, Northumberland, Durham, and Hawes: Starting on the northern shore of Fullerton Cove, at the south-east corner of William Russell's 1,155 acres, parish of Stockton, county of Gloucester; and bounded thence by part of the eastern boundary of that grant northerly, by the northern boundaries of Captain Hollinsworth's 1,030 acres and John Smith's 640 acres, parish of Stowell, county of Gloucester, easterly, by part of the eastern boundary of the latter portion southerly, and by the northern boundaries of portions 155, 71, and 72, and their prolongation easterly to the Ocean; by the Ocean north-easterly to the eastern extremity of the south boundary of the parish of Beryan, at Point Halliday, county of Gloucester; thence by that boundary westerly to the road from Bundagry to Tinonee; thence by that road generally north-westerly to the southern boundary of the parish of Tinonee, county of Gloucester; thence by part of that boundary and the southern boundary of the parish of Bootawa westerly to Kundibakh Creek; thence by that creek downwards to a northern boundary of the parish of Belbora; thence by that boundary, which is partly formed by a south boundary of the Australian Agricultural Company's 464,640 acres, westerly to the eastern boundary of that grant near Millstone Hill; thence by a line north-westerly to the junction of the Manning and Gloucester Rivers; thence by the Manning River to the Barnard River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the counties of Macquarie and Hawes; thence by that boundary northerly to the Nowendoc River; thence by that river upwards to a point north-easterly from the PGK tree, on the road from Nowendoc to Giro; thence by a marked line south-westerly to that tree; thence by that road southerly to the south boundary of portion 2, parish of Tuggolo; thence by that boundary westerly to Tuggolo Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the junction of Back Creek at a tree marked A over 91; thence by the range dividing the waters of Tuggolo Creek and the Barnard River north-westerly to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range and the Mount Royal Range southerly, and by the range forming the western watershed of the Manning and Gloucester Rivers southerly, to the range at the head of the Paterson, Allyn, and Williams Rivers; by the range dividing the waters of the Williams and Karuah Rivers easterly, south-easterly, and southerly to the north boundary of D. M'Leod's 1,000 acres, parish of Thornton, county of Gloucester; thence by part of the northern boundary of that grant westerly to the Williams River, by that river downwards to the easterly prolongation of a line forming the southern boundary of portion 42, parish of Seaham, county of Durham; thence by that prolongation, by that southern boundary and the southern boundaries of portions 43 and 44 westerly, by the western boundaries of portions 7, 8, 15, 16, 45 of the same parish, crossing the Hunter River, and by the western boundary of Simeon Lord's 2,000-acre grant, parish of Alwick, county of Northumberland, southerly, and by the southern boundary of that grant, and the northern boundary of John Terry Hughes' grant of 300 acres, and its prolongation easterly to the left bank of the Hunter River; thence by that river downwards to the waters of Fullerton Cove, at the southern-most point of Smith's Island; and thence by those waters northerly and easterly to the starting point; together with the islands lying off the district so defined.

## 59. DURHAM.

Comprising parts of the counties of Durham and Gloucester : Starting on the right bank of the Williams River, at the south-east corner of portion 42, parish of Seaham, county of Durham ; and bounded thence by the south boundaries of that portion and portions 43 and 44 westerly, and a line partly forming the western boundaries of portions 7, 8, 15, 16, and 45, same parish, southerly to the Hunter River ; thence by that river upwards to the south boundary of "Bolwarra," John Brown's 2,030 acres, parish of Middlehope ; thence by that boundary westerly to the Hunter River ; thence by that river upwards to the south-western corner of Charles Throsby's 2,000 acres grant, parish of Stanhope, county of Durham ; thence by part of the west boundary of that grant northerly to the road connecting the Branxton to Maitland Road with the Singleton and Gresford Road within the same parish and county ; thence by that road northerly to the range dividing the waters of the Fal Brook from those of the Paterson River ; thence by that range and the Mount Royal Range north-easterly, northerly, and north-westerly to the range at the head of the Allyn, Paterson, and Williams Rivers ; thence by that range easterly and the range dividing the waters of the Karuah and Williams Rivers south-easterly and southerly to the northern boundary of D. McLeod's grant of 1,000 acres, parish of Thornton, county of Gloucester ; thence by part of that boundary westerly to the Williams River ; and thence by the right bank of that river downwards to the starting point.

## 60. SINGLETON.

Comprising parts of the counties of Durham, Hunter, and Northumberland : Starting at the confluence of Foy Brook with the Hunter River ; and bounded thence by that brook upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters flowing into that brook from those flowing into Rouchel Brook ; thence by that range generally north-easterly to the Mount Royal Range, which divides the waters flowing into the Paterson River from those flowing into Fal Brook ; thence by that range south-easterly, southerly, and south-westerly to the road which connects the Singleton and Gresford Road with the road from Branxton to Maitland, within the parish of Stanhope, county of Durham ; thence by the first-named road south-easterly, southerly, and south-westerly to the western boundary of Charles Throsby's grant of 2,000 acres, parish of Stanhope, county of Durham ; thence by part of that boundary south to the Hunter River ; thence by that river downwards to the north-west corner of W. Harper's 2,000 acres ; thence by that boundary (being the eastern limit of the municipality of Greta) southerly to the south-western boundary of the Great Northern Railway enclosure ; thence by that boundary north-westerly to Illalong-street ; thence by that street and by the road in continuation of that street southerly and south-easterly to the road from Singleton to Maitland, *viâ* Allandale ; thence by that road westerly to Black Creek ; thence by that creek and Rothbury Creek upwards to the source of the last-mentioned creek in Broken Back Range ; thence by that range and the range forming the south-eastern boundaries of the parishes of Ovingham and Broke south-westerly to the Wollombi Brook ; thence by that brook upwards to the range, *viâ* Mount Dalton ; thence by that range and the range forming the southern watershed of Drew's Creek, generally westerly to the range dividing the parish of Burton from the parishes of Dalton and Milbrodale ; thence by that range and the range dividing the waters flowing into the Macdonald River from those flowing into Parson's Creek generally north-westerly to the range forming the eastern watershed of Doyle's Creek ; thence by that range northerly to the south boundary of the parish of Wambo, county of Hunter ; thence by part of the south and the west boundaries of that parish westerly and northerly to the Hunter River aforesaid ; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

## 61. THE HUNTER.

Comprising parts of the counties of Durham, Hunter, and Brisbane : Starting at the confluence of Foy Brook with the Hunter River ; and bounded thence by that brook upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters flowing into that brook from those flowing into Rouchel Brook ; thence by that range, the range dividing the counties of Durham and Brisbane from the counties of Gloucester and Hawes, and the Liverpool Range, north-easterly, northerly, westerly, and south-westerly to the range dividing the waters flowing into Hall's Creek from those flowing into Guan Gua Creek and the Wybong Creek ; thence by that range southerly to the Goulburn River ; thence by that river upwards to the north-west corner of the parish of Arndell, county of Hunter ; thence by the west and part of the south boundary of that parish southerly and easterly to the range dividing the waters of Baerami Creek from the waters of Bureen or Greig's Creek and Gungalwa Creek ; thence by that range southerly to Mount Monundilla ; thence by the range dividing the waters of Baerami or James Creek, Gungalwa Creek, and Doyle's Creek from the waters of the Macdonald River easterly to the range forming the eastern watershed of Doyle's Creek aforesaid ; thence by that range northerly to the south boundary of the parish of Wambo ; thence by part of the south and the west boundary of that parish westerly and northerly to the Hunter River aforesaid ; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

## 62. MITCHELL.

Comprising parts of the counties of Phillip, Roxburgh, Wellington, Bligh, Hunter, and Brisbane: Starting on the Goulburn River at the north-west corner of the parish of Arndell, county of Hunter; and bounded thence by the west and part of the south boundary of that parish southerly and easterly to the range dividing the waters of Baerami Creek from Gungalma and Burrun or Greig's Creek; thence by that range southerly, and by the range forming the eastern watershed of Blackwater Creek south-westerly to Mount Coricudgy in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range and the range forming the eastern watershed of Umbrella Creek southerly to the Capertee River; thence by that river to the boundary dividing the counties of Roxburgh and Cook; thence by that boundary (being the range forming the eastern watershed of Coco or Cook's Creek) south-westerly to the Great Dividing Range aforesaid; thence by that range generally westerly to the source of Crown Ridge Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Turon River; thence by that river downwards to the western watershed of Round Swamp Creek; thence by that watershed and the southern watershed of Warragonia Creek northerly and westerly to the source of Four-mile Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Cunningham's or Crudine Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Turon River; thence by that river downwards to the road from Bathurst to Windeyer, *via* Toolamanang; thence by that road northerly, westerly, and again northerly to the range forming the southern watershed of Meroo Creek; thence by that range easterly and by the boundary dividing the parish of Toolamanang from the parishes of Windeyer and Warratra, county of Wellington, north-westerly and north-easterly to Guigong or Campbell's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the range dividing the waters of that creek from Four-mile Creek; thence by that range to the source of the last-mentioned creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Cudgegong River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary dividing the parishes of Derale, Boogledie, Bayley, and Cooyal from the parishes of Arthur, Bara, Botobolar, and Price generally northerly to the Great Dividing Range aforesaid; thence by that range westerly and northerly to the source of Wyaldra Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Guntawang to Cobborah; thence by that road north-westerly and westerly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Bligh and Lincoln; thence by that boundary to the Talbragar River; thence by that river, the Coolaburragundy River, and the Coolah Creek upwards to the source of the last-mentioned creek in the Liverpool Range; thence by that range easterly to the range forming the watershed dividing Hall's Creek from Guangua Creek and Wybong Creek; thence by that range southerly to the Goulburn River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

## 63. MUDGEES.

Comprising parts of the counties of Phillip and Wellington: Starting at the confluence of Wyaldra Creek with the Cudgegong River; and bounded thence by that creek upwards to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range southerly and easterly to the boundary dividing the parishes of Cooyal, Bayly, Boogledie, and Derale, from the parishes of Price, Botobolar, Bara, and Arthur, southerly to the Cudgegong River aforesaid; thence by that river upwards to Four-mile Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the range dividing the waters of that creek from those of Guigong or Campbell's Creek; thence by that range to the source of the last-mentioned creek; thence by that creek downwards, and by the boundary dividing the parish of Toolamanang from the parishes of Warratra and Windeyer, county of Wellington, south-westerly and south-easterly to the range forming the southern watershed of Meroo Creek; thence by that range and the range forming the southern boundary of the parish of Canning generally westerly to the source of Gunnell Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Cudgegong River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

## 64. ORANGE.

Comprising parts of the counties of Bathurst and Wellington: Starting at the confluence of the Swallow Creek and the Macquarie River; and bounded thence by Swallow Creek and Long Swamp Creek upwards to the boundary between the parishes of Byng and Colville, county of Bathurst; thence by that boundary westerly, and by the boundary between the parishes of Colville and Shadforth southerly, and by the northern boundary of the parish of Graham westerly, to Brown's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Milthorpe to Carcoar; thence by that road southerly to the southern boundary of the parish of Beneree; thence by that boundary westerly to Flyer's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the southern boundary of the parish of Waldegrave; thence by that boundary and the southern boundary of the parish of Clarendon westerly to the Panuara Rivulet; thence by that rivulet upwards to its source in the range forming the boundary between the counties of Ashburnham and Wellington; thence by that boundary northerly to the Molong Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the southern prolongation of the west boundary of Joseph Taylor's 2,560 acres grant, parish of Gamboola, county of Wellington; thence by that prolongation and the western boundary of that grant north to the Bell River; thence by that river downwards to Larras Lake Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters flowing into the Macquarie River from those flowing into the Bell River; thence by that

range to the source of Curragurra Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Wellington to Ophir; thence by that road south-easterly to Boshé's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Macquarie River; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

### 65. MACQUARIE.

Comprising parts of the counties of Roxborough and Westmoreland: Starting at the confluence of the Turon River with the Macquarie River; and bounded thence by the Turon River upwards to Cunningham's or Crudine Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Four-mile Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range forming the southern watershed of the Warrangunia Creek; thence by that range and the range forming the western watershed of Round Swamp Creek easterly and southerly to the Turon River aforesaid; thence by that river upwards to Crown Ridge Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range generally easterly, southerly, and south-westerly to the range dividing the waters flowing into Campbell's River from those flowing into the Abercrombie River; thence by that range westerly to the source of Campbell's River; thence by that river downward to the road from Goulburn to Rockley; thence by that road north-westerly to Campbell's River; thence by that river downwards to the Fish River; thence by that river upwards to the eastern boundary of the parish of Kelso, county of Roxburgh; thence by that boundary northerly and by the north and north-western boundaries of that parish westerly and south-westerly to the Macquarie River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

### 66. BATHURST.

Comprising parts of the counties of Bathurst and Roxburgh: Starting at the confluence of the Fish River with the Macquarie River; and bounded thence by the last-mentioned river downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Bathurst, county of Bathurst; thence by that boundary and the south and west boundaries of the parish of Mount Pleasant westerly and northerly to the Macquarie River aforesaid; thence by that river upwards to the north-western boundary of the parish of Kelso, county of Roxburgh; thence by that boundary, and the north and east boundaries of that parish north-easterly, easterly, and southerly, to the Fish River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

### 67. BLAYNEY.

Comprising parts of the counties of Bathurst, Georgiana, and Westmoreland: Starting at the confluence of Swallow Creek with the Macquarie River; and bounded thence by that creek and Long Swamp Creek upwards to the boundary between the parishes of Byng and Colville, county of Bathurst; thence by that boundary westerly, and by the boundary between the parishes of Colville and Shadforth southerly, and by part of the south boundary of the last-mentioned parish westerly to Cowriga, or Brown's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Millthorpe to Carcoar; thence by that road westerly and southerly to Brown's Creek aforesaid; thence by that creek downwards to MacKenzie's Water-hole Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the east boundary of portion 143, parish of Errol, county of Bathurst; thence by that boundary and the east boundary of portion 144 south to the north boundary of portion 74; thence by a line partly forming part of that boundary, the north boundaries of portions 73 and 72, and the south boundaries of portions 53 and 52 east, and by part of the east boundary of the last-mentioned portion north, and by a line and the south boundary of portion 45 east to the Belubula River; thence by that river downwards to the Chain of Ponds; thence by those ponds upwards to the north boundary of portion 158, parish of Osborne; thence by that boundary westerly and by the boundary between the parishes of Shaw and Osborne southerly to the Coombing Rivulet; thence by a line crossing that rivulet to the north-east corner of W. C. Wentworth's 839 acres, parish of Neville; thence by the east boundary of that land and the east boundary of portion 8 south, by part of the south boundary of the last-mentioned portion west, and by a line partly forming the west boundaries of portions 12, 64, and 66, the east boundary of portion 194, and the west boundaries of portions 55, 53, and 133, south to the range dividing the waters flowing into the Coombing Rivulet from those flowing into the Abercrombie River; thence by that range easterly to the source of Rocky Bridge Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Abercrombie River; thence by that river downwards to the Lachlan River; thence by that river upwards to the Crookwell River; thence by that river upwards to Kangaloolah Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters of the Bolong River from those of Cook's Creek; thence by that range (forming the boundary between the parishes of Sherwood and Burridgee, county of Georgiana), north-easterly to the Abercrombie River aforesaid; thence by that river upwards to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range and the range dividing the waters flowing into Campbell's River from those flowing into the Abercrombie River north-westerly and westerly to the source of Campbell's River; thence by that river downwards to the road from Goulburn to Rockley; thence by that road north-westerly to Campbell's River; thence by that river and the Macquarie River downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Bathurst, county of Bathurst; thence by that boundary and the south and west boundaries of the parish of Mount Pleasant westerly and northerly to the Macquarie River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the point of starting.

## 68. ARGYLE.

Comprising parts of the counties of Argyle, Georgiana, King, and Westmoreland: Starting at the confluence of Settler's Creek with the Wollondilly River; and bounded thence by that creek upwards to its source nearest to Mount Muruin; thence by a line to that mount, and thence by the range generally north-westerly to the source of the Abercrombie River; thence by that river to its confluence with the Bolong River; thence by the range forming the western watershed of the Bolong River, and dividing its waters from those of Cook's Vale Creek, and the range dividing the waters of the Abercrombie and Crookwell Rivers, generally south-westerly and by Kangaloola Creek southerly to its confluence with the Crookwell River; thence by that river upwards to the road from Binda to Boorowa; thence by that road south-westerly to the southern watershed of the Crookwell River; thence by that watershed easterly and southerly to the south boundary of John Warren's 788 acres; thence by that boundary and by the southern boundary of the parish of Crookwell, county of King, and by Crookwell River easterly to the range forming the boundaries between the counties of Argyle and King; thence by that range southerly to the southern boundary of the enclosure of the Main Southern Railway line; thence by that boundary and a line crossing the Cooma Railway easterly to the western boundary of the municipality of Goulburn; thence by that boundary southerly, and by the southern boundary of the municipality easterly to the road from Goulburn to Bungonia; thence by that road generally easterly to Bungonia Creek; thence by that creek downwards to its confluence with the Shoalhaven River; thence by that river downwards to its confluence with Barber's Creek, and by Barber's Creek upwards, and by the boundary dividing the counties of Argyle and Camden northerly to Uringalla Creek; and thence by that creek, Paddy's River, and the Wollondilly River downwards to the starting point,—excepting thereout the municipality of Goulburn, being the electorate of Goulburn, hereinafter defined.

## 69. GOULBURN.

Comprising part of the county of Argyle: Starting on the Wollondilly River, at the north-east corner of Francis Rossi's grant of 2,560 acres, called Rossville, parish of Goulburn; and bounded thence by an eastern boundary of that 2,560 acres southerly to the northernmost boundary of W. Broughton's 1,400 acres grant; thence by a line bearing south-easterly to the north-west corner of C. Thomson's portion 18 of 200 acres; thence by the western boundary of that portion southerly, and by its south boundary and prolongation easterly, crossing the Mulwaree Ponds to its right bank; thence by the Mulwaree Ponds downwards to the south-west corner of Jonas Bradley's portion of 100 acres, parish of Towrang; thence by the southern boundary of that 100 acres easterly to its south-east corner; thence by part of the east boundary of that 100 acres northerly to the south-west corner of William Bradley's 50 acres; thence by the southern boundary of that 50 acres and its prolongation easterly to the north-west corner of N. C. Phillips' portion 1 of 80 acres; thence by the western boundary of that portion southerly to its south-west corner; thence by the southern boundary of that portion, the south boundaries of Henry Creig's portion 2 of 80 acres, Eliza Phillips' 4 acres, Henry Creig's portion 3 of 80 acres, and J. J. Roberts' portion 4 of 80 acres easterly to the south-east corner of the latter portion; thence by a line partly forming the eastern boundary of that portion, the west boundaries of James Marsden's portion 97 of 55 acres 2 roods 30 perches, John Burgess' portion 96 of 81 acres 2 roods, William Sidwell's portion 66 of 86 acres, and part of the western boundary of William Sidwell's portion 65 of 57 acres 2 roods, bearing northerly to the south-eastern corner of Daniel Cadwell's portion 46 of 47 acres; thence by the southern boundary of that portion and the north boundary of J. J. Woodward's portion 55 of 11 acres 0 rood 32 perches westerly, and crossing the Wollondilly River to its left bank; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

## 70. THE SHOALHAVEN.

Comprising parts of the counties of Camden and St. Vincent: Starting on the Ocean at the South Head of Sussex Inlet; and bounded thence by the range dividing the waters of Swan Lake, Conjola Creek, and the Clyde River from those of St. George's Basin and Wandrawandian Creek westerly to a point east of the south-east corner of portion 12, parish of Tianjara, county of St. Vincent; thence by a line and the south boundary of that portion west to the range forming the eastern watershed of the Endrick River; thence by that range southerly to the source of the Endrick River at The Vines; thence by that river downwards to the Shoalhaven River; thence by the Shoalhaven River downwards to Kangaroo Valley; thence by that river upwards to Rowland's line of road; thence by that line of road easterly to the range dividing the waters of the Kangaroo and Shoalhaven Rivers; thence by that range generally north-easterly to the road from Kangaroo Valley to Berry; thence by that road easterly to its junction at the south-west corner of portion 18, parish of Bunberra, with the road towards Broughton Head; thence by that road northerly and north-easterly to the northern boundary of portion 12, parish of Broughton; thence by a line partly forming that north boundary and the northern boundary of portions 11 and 10, and Aspinall and Brown's 4,000 acres, and its prolongation easterly to the west boundary of A. Finn's 100 acres; by that boundary northerly, and by the northern boundary of that portion and the southern boundary

of David Berry's two portions of 320 acres each easterly to the western boundary of Thos. Hyndes 1,000 acres; thence by that boundary southerly, and by part of the southern boundary of that portion easterly to Crooked River; thence by that river downwards to the Ocean; and thence by the Ocean southerly to the starting point,—including the waters of Jervis Bay and the islands therein, and together with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined.

### 71. THE CLYDE.

Comprising parts of the counties of Dampier and St. Vincent: Starting on the Ocean at the south head of Sussex Inlet; and bounded thence by the range dividing the waters of Swan Lake, Conjola Creek, and the Clyde River from those of St. George's Basin and Wandrawandian Creek westerly to a point east of the south-east corner of portion 12, parish of Tianjara, county of St. Vincent; thence by a line and the south boundary of that portion west to the range dividing the waters of the Clyde River from those of the Shoalhaven River; thence by that range southerly to a point east of the south-east corner of portion 26, parish of Milo; thence by a line partly forming the southern boundary of that portion west to its south-west corner; thence by a line south-westerly to the confluence of Araluen Creek and the Moruya River; thence by that river upwards to the confluence of Moodong Creek; thence by the range dividing the waters of that creek from those of the Deua River south-westerly to the range dividing the waters of the Deua River from those of the Shoalhaven River; thence by that range southerly to the range dividing the waters of the Shoalhaven River from those of the Tuross River; thence by that range westerly to a spur range which branches off near Mount Euranbene and terminates at the head of Woila Creek; thence by that spur range southerly to that creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Tuross River; thence by that river downwards to Reedy Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Cobargo to Bodalla, *via* Eurobodalla; thence by that road southerly to the southern branch of Dignam's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Narira to Tilba Tilba, which forms the western and northern boundaries of portions 238, 237, 405, and 404, parish of Noorooma, county of Dampier; thence by that road easterly to a point north of the north-east corner of the last-named portion on the summit of the range dividing the waters flowing into Tilba Tilba Swamp from those flowing into Wallaga Lake; thence by that range south-easterly to the shore of Wallaga Lake; thence by that shore easterly to the Ocean; and by the Ocean northerly to the starting point;—Together with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined, with the exception of Montague Island (forming part of of the King Division of Sydney).

### 72. BRAIDWOOD.

Comprising parts of the counties of Argyle, St. Vincent, Murray, and Dampier: Starting at the confluence of the Endrick River with the Shoalhaven River; and bounded thence by the latter river upwards to the confluence of Bungonia Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Bungonia to Goulburn; thence by that road generally westerly to the southern boundary of the municipality of Goulburn; thence by that boundary westerly to the southern boundary of the Great Southern Railway enclosure; thence by that boundary and a line westerly to the western boundary of the Cooma Railway; thence by that boundary southerly to the northern boundary of portion 23, parish of Mulwarree, county of Argyle; thence by that boundary westerly, and by the western boundary of that portion and of portions 22, 47, and 25, William Sherwin's 1,117 acres, southerly to the range leading to Mount Walowalar; thence by the range dividing the coast waters from the inland waters southerly, *via* Mounts Twynam, Butmaroo, and Jinerro, to Big Badja Mountain; thence by the range at the source of the Shoalhaven River, and by the eastern watershed of that river to the spur range forming the southern watershed of Moodong Creek; thence by that spur range to the confluence of Moodong Creek with the Deua River; and by that river to Araluen Creek; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the south-east corner of portion 26, parish of Milo, county of St. Vincent; thence by the south boundary of that portion and a line east to the eastern watershed of Araluen Creek; thence by the eastern watershed of that creek and the Mongarlowe River, the Corang, and the Endrick Rivers northerly to the source of the Endrick River at The Vines; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

### 73. QUEANBEYAN.

Comprising parts of the counties of Argyle, Murray, Cowley, and Buccleugh: Starting on the range dividing the coast waters from the inland waters at the source of the Queanbeyan River near Mount Tumanmang; and bounded thence by that river downwards to Tinderry Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the Twins or the Tinderry Pics at the source of Micaligo Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Murrumbidgee River and by that river upwards to Gap Creek; thence by that creek and a tributary thereof upwards to Mount Clear; thence by the range dividing the waters of Naas Valley Creek and the Gudjenby, Cotter, and Goodradigbee Rivers, from those falling direct to the Murrumbidgee River generally westerly to the main range dividing the waters of the Goodradigbee River from

those of the Tumut River; thence by that range northerly to a spur range which leads to the confluence of Flea Creek and the Goodradigbee River; thence by that range to that confluence; thence by a line crossing the Goodradigbee River to the spur range which divides the waters of Flea Creek from those of the Goodradigbee River above that creek; thence by that range easterly to the range dividing the waters of the Murrumbidgee River from those of the Goodradigbee River; thence by that range northerly to the range dividing the waters of Mountain Creek from those of the Murrumbidgee River; thence by that range northerly to a point west of the north-west corner of portion 139, parish of Cavan, county of Cowley; thence by a line forming the northern boundaries of that portion and portion 97 east to the road from the Mullion to Yass; thence by that road northerly to the Murrumbidgee River at Boambolo Ford; thence by that river downwards to the southern boundary of the parish of Jeir, county of Murray; thence by that boundary and the southern boundary of the parish of Bedulluck easterly, and by part of the eastern boundary of the last-named parish northerly to Morumbateman Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the southern boundary of the parish of Toual; thence by that boundary easterly to the south-west corner of Donald McLeod's 2,000 acres; thence by the western boundary of that land northerly to the Yass River; thence by that river upwards to Gundaroo Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the Cullarin Range, dividing the waters of the Wollondilly River from those of the Lachlan River; thence by that range northerly to the southern boundary of the Great Southern Railway enclosure; thence by that boundary easterly to the western boundary of the Goulburn to Cooma Railway enclosure; thence by that boundary southerly to the southern boundary of portion 18, parish of Mulwarce, county of Argyle; thence by part of that boundary west, and by the western boundaries of portions 23, 22, 47, and 25, William Sherwin's 1,117 acres, southerly to the range leading to Mount Woolowolar; thence by the range dividing the coast waters from the inland waters aforesaid southerly, *via* Mounts Twynam, Butmaroo, and Jinerro, to the starting point.

#### 74. YASS.

Comprising parts of the counties of King, Harden, Murray, Cowley, and Buccleugh: Starting on the Lachlan River at the confluence of Old Man Gonyah Creek; and bounded thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters of Pudman's Creek from those of the Lachlan River, Blakney Creek, and the Boorowa River; thence by that range southerly and westerly to a spur range dividing the waters of Kangiara Creek from those of Lang's Creek; thence by that range westerly to the northern boundary of portion 8, parish of Taunton, county of King, John Ryan's 200 acres; thence by part of that boundary west to the Boorowa River; thence by that river upwards to Hassall's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters of the Yass River from those of the Boorowa River; thence by that range south-westerly to the southern boundary of the Great Southern Railway enclosure; thence by that boundary westerly to Jugiong Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the Main Southern Road; thence by that road westerly to the junction of a road from the Five-mile Creek to L. Roache's 40 acres on the Murrumbidgee River; thence by that road southerly to that river; thence by that river upwards to the confluence of Jeremiah Creek; thence by the spur range dividing the waters of that creek from those of Macpherson's Swamp Creek southerly to the main range dividing the waters of the Tumut River from those of the Goodradigbee River; thence by that range southerly to a spur range which leads to the confluence of Flea Creek and the Goodradigbee River; thence by that range to that confluence; thence by a line crossing the Goodradigbee River to the spur range which divides the waters of Flea Creek from those of the Goodradigbee River above that creek; thence by that range easterly to the range dividing the waters of the Murrumbidgee River from those of the Goodradigbee River; thence by that range northerly to the range dividing the waters of Mountain Creek from those of the Murrumbidgee River; thence by that range northerly to a point west of the north-west corner of portion 139, parish of Cavan, county of Cowley; thence by a line forming the northern boundaries of that portion and portion 97 east to the road from the Mullion to Yass; thence by that road northerly to the Murrumbidgee River at Boambolo Ford; thence by that river downwards to the southern boundary of the parish of Jeir, county of Murray; thence by that boundary and the southern boundary of the parish of Bedulluck easterly, and by part of the eastern boundary of the last-named parish northerly to Morumbateman Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the southern boundary of the parish of Toual; thence by that boundary easterly to the south-east corner of Donald McLeod's 2,000 acres; thence by the western boundary of that land northerly to the Yass River; thence by that river upwards to Gundaroo Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the Cullarin Range, dividing the waters of the Wollondilly River from those of the Lachlan River; thence by the boundary between the counties of King and Argyle northerly generally along that range and the Gullen Range to the source of Crookwell River; thence by that river downwards to the southern boundary of portion 12, parish of Crookwell, John Warn's 788 acres; thence by part of that boundary west to the range dividing the waters of Wheeo Creek from those of the Crookwell River; thence by that range westerly to the road from Binda to Boorowa; thence by that road northerly to the Crookwell River; thence by that river downwards to the Lachlan River; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

## 75. BOOROWA.

Comprising parts of the counties of Monteagle, Harden, and King: Starting at the point where the range forming the boundary between the counties of Forbes and Monteagle meets the range dividing the waters of the Boorowa River from those of Koorowatha or Crowther Creek; and bounded thence by the last-named range southerly to the range dividing the waters of the Lachlan River from those of the Murrumbidgee River, and forming the boundary between the counties of Monteagle and Harden; thence by that county boundary generally along that range westerly and southerly to the range dividing the waters of Cunningham's and Jugiong Creeks from those of Muttama and Cooney's Creeks; thence by that range south-easterly to the westernmost boundary of the Municipal District of Wallendbeen; thence by that municipal boundary generally south-easterly, easterly, and northerly to the range aforesaid at the eastern boundary of portion 690, parish of Cullinja, county of Harden; thence by that range south-easterly to the confluence of Jugiong Creek and the Murrumbidgee River; thence by that river upwards to Rocky Creek at L. Roach's 40 acres; thence by a road northerly to the Main Southern Road at Five-mile Creek; thence by that road easterly to Barber's or Bogolong Creek, and by that creek northerly to Jugiong Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the Great Southern Railway; thence by the southern boundary of that railway enclosure easterly to the range dividing the waters of Jugiong Creek from those of the Yass River; thence by that range easterly to the range dividing the waters of the Boorowa River from those of the Yass River; thence by that range easterly to the source of Hassall's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Boorowa River; thence by that river downwards to the north-west corner of portion 8, parish of Taunton, county of King, John Ryan's 200 acres; thence by part of the northern boundary of that portion east to the range dividing the waters of Kangiara and Lang's Creeks; thence by that range to the range dividing the waters of the Boorowa River from those of Pudman's Creek; thence by that range easterly to the range dividing the waters of the Lachlan and Boorowa Rivers; thence by that range northerly to the source of Old Man Gunyah Creek; thence by that creek downwards to its confluence with the Lachlan River; thence by that river downwards to its confluence with the Boorowa River; and thence by the range dividing the waters of that river from those of Neila Creek south-westerly to the starting point.

## 76. COWRA.

Comprising parts of the counties of Bathurst, Forbes, and Ashburnham: Starting at the confluence of the Belubula River with the Lachlan River; and bounded thence by the first-mentioned river upwards to the western boundary of portion 11, parish of Collett, county of Ashburnham; thence by that boundary northerly, and by the northern boundary of that portion and the northern boundary of portion 92 easterly to the north-east corner of the latter portion; thence by the eastern boundaries of portions 60, 153, and 152 northerly, by the southern boundary of portion 94 easterly, and by the western, southern, and eastern boundaries of portion 38 southerly, easterly, and northerly, to the south-west corner of portion 67; thence by the southern boundary of that portion and portion 59 easterly to the south-east corner of the last-named portion; thence by a line southerly to the north-east corner of portion 4; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that portion westerly and southerly to the Belubula River; thence by that river upwards to the Panuara Rivulet; thence by that rivulet upwards to the southern boundary of the parish of Clarendon, county of Bathurst; thence by that boundary and the southern boundary of the parish of Waldegrave easterly to Flyer's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the northern boundary of the parish of Calvert; thence by that boundary easterly to the road from Millthorpe to Carcoar; thence by that road southerly to Brown's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Mackenzie's Waterhole Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the east boundary of portion 143, parish of Errol, county of Bathurst; thence by that boundary and the east boundary of portion 144 south to the north boundary of portion 74; thence by part of that boundary, the north boundaries of portions 73 and 72, and the south boundaries of portions 53 and 52 east, and by part of the east boundary of the last-mentioned portion north, and by a line and the south boundary of portion 45 east to the Belubula River; thence by that river downwards to the Chain of Ponds; thence by those ponds upwards to the north boundary of portion 158, parish of Osborne; thence by that boundary westerly and by the boundary between the parishes of Shaw and Osborne southerly to the Coombing Rivulet; thence by a line crossing that rivulet to the north-east corner of W. C. Wentworth's 839 acres, parish of Neville; thence by the east boundary of that land and the east boundary of portion 8 south, by part of the south boundary of the last-mentioned portion west, and by the west boundaries of portions 12, 64, and 66, the east boundary of portion 194, and the west boundaries of portions 55, 33, and 133, and a line south to the range dividing the waters flowing into the Coombing Rivulet from those flowing into the Abercrombie River; thence by that range easterly to the source of Rocky Bridge Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Abercrombie River; thence by that river downwards to the Lachlan River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary dividing the county of Forbes from the county of King; thence by that boundary (being a range forming a watershed between the Boorowa River and Neila Creek) southerly and westerly, and by the range dividing the counties of Monteagle and Forbes north-westerly to the source of Bang Bang Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Crowther or Koorowatha Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the boundary between the counties of Forbes and Monteagle; thence

by that boundary (being a marked line) west to the range dividing the waters flowing into the Lachlan River from those flowing into Tyagong and Burrangong Creeks; thence by that range northerly and south-westerly to the source of Kangaroo Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Lachlan River; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

#### 77. MOLONG.

Comprising parts of the counties of Gordon, Ashburnham, and Wellington: Starting on the Lachlan River at the confluence of Mandagery Creek, and bounded thence by that creek upwards to the confluence of Moura Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in Croker's Range; thence by that range northerly to the range forming the northern boundary of the county of Ashburnham and dividing the waters of the Macquarie River from those of the Lachlan River; thence by that county boundary westerly along that range to Harvey's Range, dividing the waters of the Bogan and Macquarie Rivers; thence northerly along that range and the Sappa Bulga Range to the main source of Belowrie Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Dubbo to Obley; thence by that road southerly to the Little River; thence by that river downwards to the confluence of Burrawong or Buckinbah Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the confluence of Loombah Creek, and by that creek upwards to the confluence of Googoderry Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the south-west corner of portion 106, parish of Catombal, county of Gordon; thence by a line partly forming the southern boundaries of that portion and portion 18 east to the south-east corner of the latter portion; thence by the eastern boundary of that portion north to the south-west corner of portion 80, parish of Cardington; thence by the south and east boundaries of that portion east and north to the south-west corner of portion 81; thence by the south boundaries of that portion and portion 87 east to the south-east corner of the latter portion; thence by a line forming the eastern boundaries of that portion and portion 94 north to the southern boundary of portion 113; thence by the southern and part of the eastern boundary of that portion east and north to the southern head of Two-mile Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Bell River; thence by that river downwards to the confluence of Nubrigyn Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the north-east corner of portion 9, parish of Warne; thence by a northern and the western boundary of that parish westerly and southerly to Larras Lake Creek; thence by that creek and Kerr's or Carr's Creek downwards to the Bell River; thence by that river upwards to the northern extremity of the western boundary of portion 22, Joseph Taylor's 2,560 acres, parish of Gamboola, county of Wellington; thence by that boundary and its prolongation south to Molong Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the confluence of Boreenore Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range forming part of the eastern boundary of the county of Ashburnham; thence by that range southerly to the source of the Panuara Rivulet; thence by that rivulet downwards to its confluence with the Belubula River, and thence to the western boundary of portion 4, parish of Collett, county of Ashburnham; thence by that boundary north and the northern boundary of that portion east to the north-east corner of that portion; thence by a line northerly to the south-east corner of portion 59; thence by the south boundary of that portion and portion 67 westerly to the east boundary of portion 38; thence by part of that boundary southerly, the southern boundary of that portion south-westerly, westerly, and north-westerly, and part of the western boundary northerly to the southernmost boundary of portion 94; thence by part of that boundary westerly to a point north of the north-east corner of portion 152; thence by a line forming the eastern boundaries of portions 152, 153, and 60 southerly to the north-east corner of portion 92; thence by the northern boundaries of that portion and portion 11 westerly and by the western boundary of the latter portion southerly to the Belubula River; thence by that river downwards to its confluence with the Lachlan River; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

#### 78. WELLINGTON.

Comprising parts of the counties of Wellington, Gordon, Bligh, Lincoln, and Napier: Starting at the confluence of Ranter's Creek with the Castlereagh River; and bounded thence by Ranter's Creek upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters flowing into the Castlereagh River from those flowing into the Talbragar River; thence by that range southerly to the source of Jones' Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Talbragar River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the parishes of Beni and Murrumbidgee from Barbegal, Macquarie, and Geurie, county of Lincoln; thence by that boundary southerly to the Macquarie River; thence by that river downwards to Belowrie Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Dubbo to Obley; thence by that road southerly to the Little River; thence by that river downwards to Burrawong or Buckinbah Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Loombah Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Googoderry Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the south-west corner of portion 106, parish of Catombal, county of Gordon; thence by a line partly forming the southern boundaries of that portion and portion 18 east to the south-east corner of the latter portion; thence by the eastern boundary of that portion north to the south-west corner of portion 80, parish of Cardington; thence by the south and east boundaries of that portion east and north to the south-west corner of portion 81; thence by the south boundaries of that portion and portion

87 east to the south-east corner of the latter portion; thence by a line forming the eastern boundaries of that portion and portion 94 north to the southern boundary of portion 113; thence by the southern and part of the eastern boundary of that portion east and north to the southern head of Two-mile Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Bell River; thence by that river downwards to Nubrygyn Creek; thence by that creek upwards to a northern boundary of the parish of Warne, county of Wellington; thence by that boundary westerly and by the western boundary of that parish southerly to Larras Lake Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters flowing into the Macquarie River from those flowing into the Bell River; thence by that range to the source of Curragurra Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Wellington to Ophir; thence by that road south-easterly to Boshé's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Macquarie River aforesaid; thence by that river upwards to the Turon River; thence by that river upwards to the road from Bathurst to Windeyer, *via* Toolamanang; thence by that road northerly, westerly, and again northerly to the range forming the southern watershed of Meroo Creek; thence by that range and the range forming the south boundary of the parish of Canning, county of Wellington, generally westerly to the source of Gunnell Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Cudgegong River; thence by that river upwards to Wyaldra Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Guntawang to Cobborah; thence by that road north-westerly and westerly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Bligh and Lincoln; thence by that boundary to the Talbragar River; thence by that river to the road from Dunedoo to Merrygoen; thence by that road to Merrygoen Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the south-east corner of portion 78, parish of Mendooran, county of Napier; thence by a line partly forming the east boundaries of that portion and portion 79 north to the Castlereagh River; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

#### 79. DUBBO.

Comprising parts of the counties of Narromine, Ewenmar, Lincoln, and Gordon: Starting at the confluence of Jones's Creek with the Talbragar River; and bounded thence by Jones's Creek upwards to its source in the range which divides the waters flowing into the Talbragar River aforesaid from those flowing into the Castlereagh River; thence by that range northerly to the source of Ranter's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Lincoln, county of Lincoln; thence by part of that boundary, and by part of the boundary between the counties of Lincoln and Ewenmar, westerly and south-westerly to Coolbaggie Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Brocklehurst to Warren; thence by that road westerly to Ewenmar Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the boundary between the Burroway and Belgoreen pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary south-westerly to the Macquarie River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary between the counties of Oxley and Narromine; thence by that boundary south-westerly to Boggy Cowal; thence by Boggy Cowal and Backwater Cowal easterly to Wallaby Creek; thence by that creek and Ugumjil Creek upwards to the source of the last-mentioned creek, in the Sappa Bulga Range; thence by that range southerly to the source of Belowrie Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Macquarie River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the parishes of Murrumbidgee and Beni from the parishes of Geurie, Macquarie, and Barbical, county of Lincoln; thence by that boundary northerly to the Talbragar River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

#### 80. GUNNEDAH.

Comprising the county of Napier, and parts of the counties of Gowen, White, Pottinger, Buckland, and Nandewar: Starting on the Liverpool Range at the source of Yarraman Creek; and bounded thence by that creek downwards to the crossing of the road from Blackville to Bundella; thence by that road north-westerly to Coomoo Coomoo Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the south boundary of the Trinkey pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary easterly and by part of the east boundary of that holding northerly to the road from Bundella to Wallhollow; thence by that road north-easterly to the western boundary of portion 19, parish of Coolanbilla, county of Pottinger; thence by that boundary and the western boundary of portion 24 northerly to the northern boundary of the latter portion; thence by part of that boundary to a point south of the south-west corner of portion 16; thence by a line along the western boundaries of portions 16 and 17 northerly to a south boundary of portion 105; thence by part of that boundary easterly and part of the east boundary northerly to the south boundary of portion 89, parish of Brothers; thence by part of that boundary easterly to the eastern boundary of that portion; thence by a line partly formed by the eastern boundaries of portions 89, 83, 71, 59, 62, 90, 141, 161, 142, 143, and 144 northerly to the south boundary of portion 1, parish of Nea; thence by part of that boundary and the south boundary of portion 18 easterly to the south-east corner of the latter portion; thence by a line partly formed by the eastern boundaries of that portion and portions 5, 4, 3, 35, 39, 41, 43, 45, 46, and 47 northerly to the road from Lake Coran to Curlewis; thence by that road north-easterly to the northern boundary of Breeza pastoral holding; thence by that boundary easterly to the boundary dividing the parish of Mooki, county of Buckland, from the parish of Clift; thence by part of that boundary and the boundary dividing the parishes of Denver and Babbinsboon from the

parishes of Clift and Pialloway generally northerly to the range dividing the waters of Sandy Mountain Creek from the waters of Currabubula Creek; thence by that range (which forms the boundary between the counties of Buckland and Parry) north-westerly to the road from Carroll to Somerton; thence by that road south-westerly to the eastern boundary of the parish of Carroll, county of Buckland; thence by part of that boundary northerly to the Namoi River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary between the counties of Nandewar and Darling; thence by that boundary (being in part the range dividing the waters flowing into Tulcumbah Creek from those flowing into the Manilla River) generally northerly to the source of Cox's Creek; thence by that creek and Kihl or Maule's Creek downwards to the Namoi River aforesaid; thence by that river upwards to the north-western boundary of the Ghoolendaadi pastoral holding; thence by that boundary south-westerly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of White and Pottinger; thence by that boundary generally southerly to the northern boundary of Borah pastoral holding; thence by that boundary westerly and part of the west boundary of that holding southerly to the boundary dividing Denobollie pastoral holding from Arrownie pastoral holding; thence by that boundary westerly to the south-west corner of the latter holding; thence by a line west to the easternmost corner of Bullerawa pastoral holding; thence by the south-east boundary of that holding south-westerly, a south-western boundary north-westerly, and again by a south-eastern boundary south-westerly to the boundary dividing Cumble, Kiambir, and Bimble pastoral holdings from Cumbil, Wargen, and Dinby pastoral holdings generally westerly and southerly to the western boundary of Bimble pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary and the western boundary of Gorianawa pastoral holding southerly and by a south boundary of the latter holding to the range forming the boundary dividing the county of Baradine from the counties of Leichhardt and Gowen; thence by that range south-easterly to the range forming the western boundary of the Belar, Tannabar, and Gowang pastoral holdings; thence by that range southerly to the source of the Wallamburrawang Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Castlereagh River; thence by that river upwards to the north-east corner of portion 79, parish of Mendooran, county of Napier; thence by a line partly forming the east boundary of that portion and the east boundary of portion 78 south to Merrygoen Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Merrygoen to Dunedoo; thence by that road south-easterly to the Talbragar River; thence by that river, the Coolaburragundy River, and Coolah Creek upwards to the source of the Coolah Creek in the range forming the southern boundary of the county of Pottinger; and thence by that range and the Liverpool Range easterly to the starting point.

### 81. QUIRINDI.

Comprising parts of the counties of Parry, Buckland, and Pottinger: Starting on the Liverpool Range at the source of Yaraman Creek; and bounded thence by that creek downwards to the crossing of the road from Blackville to Bundella; thence by that road north-westerly to Coomoo Coomoo Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the south boundary of the Trinkey pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary easterly and by part of its east boundary northerly to the centre of the road from Bundella to Wallhollow; thence by that road north-easterly to the western boundary of portion 19, parish of Coolanbilla, county of Pottinger; thence by that boundary, and the western boundary of portion 24, northerly to the northern boundary of the latter portion; thence by part of that boundary to a point south of the southwest corner of portion 16; thence by a line along the western boundaries of portions 16 and 17 northerly to a south boundary of portion 105; thence by part of that boundary easterly, and an east boundary northerly, to the south boundary of portion 89, parish of Brothers; thence by part of that boundary easterly to the eastern boundary of that portion; thence by a line partly formed by the eastern boundaries of portions 89, 83, 71, 59, 62, 90, 141, 161, 142, 143, and 144 northerly, to the south boundary of portion 1, parish of Nea; thence by part of that boundary, and the south boundary of portion 18 easterly, to the south-east corner of the latter portion; thence by a line partly formed by the eastern boundaries of that portion and portions 5, 4, 3, 35, 39, 41, 43, 45, 46 and 47, northerly to the road from Lake Coran to Curlewis; thence by that road north-easterly to the northern boundary of Breeza pastoral holding; thence by that boundary easterly to the boundary dividing the parish of Mooki, county of Buckland, from the parish of Clift; thence by part of that boundary and the boundary dividing the parishes of Denver and Babbinoon, from the parishes of Clift and Pialloway, generally northerly to the range dividing the waters of Sandy Mountain Creek from the waters of Currabubula Creek; thence by that range, which forms the boundary between the counties of Parry and Buckland, south-easterly to a west boundary of the Australian Agricultural Company's grant of 313,298 acres; thence by that boundary southerly, by a south boundary of that grant and a line easterly to the 10 mile post on the Great Northern Road; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the confluence of Dungowan Creek, with the Peel River at the south-east corner of portion 21, parish of Gill, county of Parry; thence by the east boundary of that portion and part of the east boundary of portion 10, northerly to the northern watershed of Dungowan Creek; thence by that watershed generally easterly to the range dividing the county of Parry from the counties of Vernon and Hawes; thence by that range southerly and westerly to the Great Dividing Range; and thence by that range and the Liverpool Range to the starting point.

## 82. TAMWORTH.

Comprising the southern part of the county of Inglis, the northern part of the county of Parry, and a small part of the county of Darling: Starting at the confluence of the Namoi River with the Halla Linga Creek; and bounded thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range which forms the boundary between the counties of Nandewar and Darling; thence by that boundary southerly to the Namoi River; thence by that river upwards to the eastern boundary of the parish of Carroll, county of Buckland; thence by part of that boundary southerly to the road from Carroll to Somerton; thence by that road north-easterly to the range forming the watershed between Sandy Mountain Creek and Currabubula Creek; thence by that range (being the boundary between the counties of Parry and Buckland) south-easterly to a west boundary of the Australian Agricultural Company's Grant of 313,298 acres; thence by that boundary southerly and by a south boundary of that grant and a line easterly to the 10-mile post on the Great Northern Road; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the confluence of Dungowan Creek with the Peel River at the south-east corner of portion 21, parish of Gill, county of Parry; thence by the east boundary of that portion and part of the east boundary of portion 10 northerly to the northern watershed of Dungowan Creek; thence by that watershed generally easterly to the range dividing the county of Parry from the counties of Vernon and Hawes; thence by that range southerly and westerly to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range and the Moonbi Range northerly and westerly to the range dividing the waters of Cuerindi or Hall's Creek from Attunga Creek; thence by that range (being the southern boundary of the county of Darling) westerly to the source of Rushes Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Namoi River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

## 83. WALCHA.

Comprising parts of the counties of Sandon, Clarke, Inglis, Vernon, and Hawes: Starting at the confluence of the Gyra River with the Muddy River or Salisbury Waters; and bounded thence by the first-mentioned river upwards to Commissioner's Waters or Tilbuster Ponds; thence by those waters or ponds upwards to the north extremity of the east boundary of the parish of Armidale, county of Sandon; thence by that boundary south, and by the south and part of the west boundary of that parish west and north to the road from Armidale to Bundarra; thence by that road westerly to the boundary which divides the counties of Sandon and Inglis from the county of Hardinge; thence by that boundary (being the range which divides the waters flowing into Abington Creek from those flowing into the Booroolong Creek and a line southerly) to the Bundarra River; thence by that river downwards to Rounalla Creek, and by that creek upwards to Stonybatter Creek, and by that creek upwards to its source in the Nandewar Range; thence by that range southerly to the source of Boundary Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Muluerindie River; thence by that river downwards to the Moonbi Range; thence by that range generally south-easterly to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range southerly to the range dividing the waters of Tuggolo Creek and Barnard River; thence by that range southerly to a tree marked A over 91 at the junction of Tuggolo and Back Creeks; thence by Tuggolo Creek downwards to the Myall River, and by that river downwards to the south boundary of portion 2, parish of Tuggolo, and by that boundary east to the road from Giro to Nowendoc, and by that road northerly to the P.G.K tree on that road; thence by a marked line north-easterly to the Nowendoc River, and by that river downwards to its confluence with the Cooplacurriba River, and by the last-named river upwards to the boundaries between the counties of Macquarie and Hawes; thence by that boundary (which partly forms the western boundaries of the parishes of Khatambuhl and Mackay, county of Macquarie, and follows Rowley River and Cell's River, the western boundary of the parish of Grahme, the northern watershed of Big Hill or Doyle's River, Ralph's Rivulet, and the Hastings River), and by the boundary dividing the counties of Vernon and Macquarie, to the source of Kunderang Brook; thence by that brook downwards to the Macleay River; thence by that river upwards to the Muddy River or Salisbury Waters aforesaid; and thence by that river or waters upwards to the starting point.

## 84. THE MANNING.

Comprising parts of the counties of Macquarie and Gloucester: Starting on the Ocean at the east extremity of the south boundary of the parish of Beryan, county of Gloucester; and bounded thence by that boundary westerly to the road from Bundagry to Tinonee; thence by that road generally north-westerly to the south boundary of the parish of Tinonee, county of Gloucester; thence by part of that boundary westerly to Bow Bow Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Bootoowaa; thence by that boundary westerly to Kundibakh Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Burrill Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the north boundary of the parish of Belbora; thence by that boundary (which is partly formed by a south boundary of the Australian Agricultural Company's grant of 464,640 acres) westerly to an eastern boundary of that grant; thence by a line north-westerly through that grant to the junction of the Gloucester River with the Manning River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the county

of Macquarie from the county of Hawes; thence by that boundary (which partly forms the western boundaries of the parishes of Khatambuhl and Mackay, county of Macquarie, and follows Rowley River and Cell's River and the western and northern boundaries of the parish of Graeme) to the range dividing the waters of the Hastings River on the north from those of the Manning River on the south; thence by that range southerly and easterly to Kerewong or Broken Bago Range; thence by that range to the south boundary of John Maughen's 2,560 acres; thence by that boundary easterly to the west boundary of R. A. Wauch's 1,030 acres; thence by part of that boundary southerly and by the south boundary of that portion easterly to Narran or King's River; thence by that river downwards to the road from New England to Port Macquarie; thence by that road generally easterly to the south boundary of the parish of Macquarie, county of Macquarie; thence by part of that boundary easterly to the northern shore of Lake Innes; thence by the northern and eastern shores of that lake easterly and southerly to Cathie Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Ocean; and thence by the Ocean southerly to the starting point.

### 85. KIPPARA.

Comprising parts of the counties of Dudley, Macquarie, Vernon and Clarke: Starting on the Ocean at Cathie Creek; and bounded thence by that creek upwards to Lake Innes; thence by the eastern and northern shore of that lake northerly and westerly to the south boundary of the parish of Macquarie, county of Macquarie; thence by part of that boundary westerly to the road from Port Macquarie to New England; thence by that road westerly to Narran or King's River; thence by that river upwards to the south boundary of R. A. Waugh's 1,030 acres; thence by that boundary westerly and part of its west boundary northerly to the south boundary of John Maughen's 2,560 acres; thence by that boundary westerly to the Kerewong or Broken Bago Range; thence by that range south-westerly to the range dividing the waters of the Hastings River on the north from those of the Manning River on the south; thence by that range westerly and northerly to the boundary between the counties of Macquarie and Hawes; thence by that boundary (being Ralph's Rivulet and the Hastings River) and the boundary between the counties of Macquarie and Vernon (being the range dividing the waters of the Yarrowitch River from the Hastings River) northerly and easterly, and by the boundary between the counties of Macquarie and Vernon to the source of Kunderang Brook; thence by that brook downwards to the Macleay River; thence by that river upwards to Muddy River or Salisbury Waters; thence by that river upwards to the Chandler River; thence by that river upwards to the south boundary of the parish of Poganbilla, county of Clarke; thence by that boundary east to Oaky River; thence by that river upwards to the south boundary of the parish of Serpentine; thence by that boundary east to the Styx River; thence by that river upwards to the range forming the boundary between the county of Raleigh and the counties of Clarke and Dudley; thence by that boundary southerly to the road from Baker's Creek to Green Hills; thence by that road southerly to Trial Bay Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Doughboy Swamp; thence by Doughboy Swamp to the east boundary of portion 71, parish of Yarrabandini, county of Dudley; thence by part of that boundary north to the south boundary of portion 3, parish of Tanban; thence east by that boundary and a south boundary of portion 34; thence by an east boundary of the last-named portion north to the road dividing portions 179, 148, and 147, parish of Yarrabandini, on the south, from portions 34 and 35, parish of Tanban, and portions 175 and 174, parish of Yarrabandini, on the north, reserved through portions 174 and 176, parish of Yarrabandini, dividing portions 120 and 119 on the south from portion 122 in the same parish on the north, and dividing portions 113, 230, 168, 105, and 102, parish of Cooroobongatti, on the south, from portions 128, 177, 179, 184, 170, and 107, in the same parish, generally easterly to the west boundary of portion 70; thence by part of that west boundary and the west boundary of portion 16 south to the south boundary of the last-named portion; thence by that boundary east to the Macleay River; thence by the left bank of that river downwards to a point due west of the junction of Kinchela Creek with that river; thence by a line to that junction, and by that creek upwards to the south boundary of the parish of Arakoon, county of Macquarie; thence by that boundary generally easterly to the south-east corner of portion 100, parish of Arakoon aforesaid; thence by a line east to the Ocean; and thence by the Ocean southerly to the starting point;—Together with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined.

### 86. RALEIGH.

Comprising parts of the counties of Fitzroy, Gresham, Raleigh, Dudley and Macquarie: Starting at the Ocean at Redbank River, and bounded thence by that river upwards and by Dirty Creek upwards to the new road from Woogoolga to Grafton; thence by that road north-westerly to Halfway Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Dundoo Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Orara River; thence by that river upwards to the north-east corner of portion 7, parish of Kremnos, county of Fitzroy; thence by the north and west boundaries of that portion westerly and southerly, and the west boundaries of portions 10, 8, 9, 19, 18, 2, and 21, and the range forming the western watershed of the Tallawudjah or Tallonagal Creek southerly to the road from Kangaroo Creek Station to Nana Creek; thence by that road to a

point north of a tree on Mole Creek marked broad-arrow over J over 85; thence by a line south to that tree; thence by Mole Creek downwards to the Little Nymboida River; thence by that river and the Nymboida River downwards to Cloud's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Horton's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the boundary dividing the county of Fitzroy from the county of Gresham; thence by that boundary northerly to the Nymboida River; thence by that river downwards to the road from Newton Boyd to Grafton, along the range forming the northern watershed of the Boyd or Little River; thence by that road westerly to the east boundary of the parish of Urania, county of Gresham; thence by part of that boundary south to the Boyd or Little River aforesaid; thence by that river upwards to the Guy Fawkes River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the county of Gresham from the county of Clarke; thence by that boundary (being a range and a line south-easterly) to the range forming the boundary dividing the counties of Gresham and Clarke from the county of Fitzroy at a point near Mount Hyland; thence by that range southerly to a spur range which terminates at Hyland Creek, opposite Hyland's Yards; thence by that spur range southerly to Hyland Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Blick's River; thence by that river downwards to Merchin Creek; thence by that creek upwards about 1 mile to a tree marked broad-arrow over LDB over 48; thence by a line bearing south 16 degrees 42 minutes west 138 chains 33 links to the Grafton and Armidale Road; thence by that road southerly to the north boundary of portion 8, parish of Ernani, county of Fitzroy; thence by the north boundaries of that portion and portion 20 easterly to Boundary Creek; thence by that creek and the ridge dividing the waters of Major's Creek and Allan's Water southerly to the range forming the boundary between the county of Raleigh and the county of Fitzroy; thence by that range southerly to the range dividing the county of Clarke from the county of Raleigh; thence by that range southerly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Raleigh and Dudley; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the road from Baker's Creek to Greenhills; thence by that road southerly to Trial Bay Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Doughboy Swamp; thence by Doughboy Swamp to the east boundary of portion 71, parish of Yarrabandini, county of Dudley; thence by part of that boundary north to the south boundary of portion 3, parish of Tanban; thence east by that boundary and a south boundary of portion 34; thence by an east boundary of the last-named portion north to the road dividing portions 179, 148, and 147, parish of Yarrabandini, on the south from portions 34 and 35, parish of Tanban, and portions 175 and 174, parish of Yarrabandini, on the north, reserved through portions 174 and 176, parish of Yarrabandini, dividing portions 120 and 119 on the south from portion 122, in the same parish, on the north, and dividing portions 113, 230, 168, 105, and 102, parish of Cooroobongatti, on the south from portions 128, 177, 179, 184, 170, and 107 in the same parish, generally easterly to the west boundary of portion 70; thence by part of that west boundary and the west boundary of portion 16, parish of Cooroobongatti, south to the south boundary of the last-named portion; thence by that boundary east to the Macleay River; thence by the left bank of that river downwards to a point due west of the junction of Kinchela Creek with that river; thence by a line to that junction, and by that creek upwards to the south boundary of the parish of Arakoon, county of Macquarie; thence by that boundary generally easterly to the south-east corner of portion 100, parish of Arakoon aforesaid; thence by a line east to the Ocean; and thence by the Ocean northerly, to the starting point;—Together with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined, with the exception of the South Solitary Island (forming part of the King Division of Sydney).

## 87. ARMIDALE.

Comprising parts of the counties of Sandon, Clarke, and Fitzroy: Starting on the range dividing the county of Clarke from the counties of Dudley and Raleigh at the source of the Styx River; and bounded thence by that river downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Serpentine, county of Clarke; thence by that boundary west to Oaky River, and by that river downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Poganbilla, county of Clarke; thence by that boundary west to Chandler River; thence by that river downwards to its confluence with the Muddy River, or Salisbury Waters; thence by that river or waters upwards to the Gyra River; thence by that river upwards to the Commissioner's Waters or Tilbuster Ponds; thence by those waters or ponds upwards to the east boundary of the parish of Armidale; thence by that boundary south, by the south boundary of the same parish west, and by part of the west boundary north to the road from Armidale to Bundarra; thence by that road westerly to the range which forms the boundary between the counties of Hardinge and Sandon; thence by that boundary northerly and easterly to the boundary dividing the parishes of Falconer and Exmouth; thence by that boundary southerly, and by the boundary dividing the parishes of Falconer and Wentworth from the parishes of Tilbuster and Springmount easterly, and by the boundary dividing the parish of Wentworth, county of Sandon, and the parish of Lagune, county of Clarke, from the parish of Clevedon, county of Sandon, and the parish of Gill, county of Clarke, northerly, easterly, and again northerly to the Aberfoyle River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary between the counties of

Gresham and Clarke; thence by that boundary (being partly a range and a line south-easterly) to the range forming the boundary dividing the counties of Gresham and Clarke from the county of Fitzroy, at a point near Mount Hyland; thence by that range southerly to a spur range which terminates at Hyland Creek, opposite Hyland's yards; thence by that spur range southerly to Hyland Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Blick's River; thence by that river downwards to Merchin Creek; thence by that creek upwards about 1 mile to a tree marked  $\uparrow$ LDB, 48; thence by a line bearing south  $16^{\circ} 42'$  west, 138 chains 33 links to the Grafton and Armidale Road; thence by that road southerly to the north boundary of portion No. 8, parish of Ernani, county of Fitzroy; thence by the north boundary of that portion and the north boundary of portion 20 easterly to Boundary Creek; thence by that creek and the ridge dividing the waters of Major's Creek and Allan's Water southerly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Raleigh and Fitzroy; thence by that range southerly to the range dividing the county of Clarke from the counties of Dudley and Raleigh aforesaid, and by that range southerly to the starting point.

### 88. THE GWYDIR.

Comprising parts of the counties of Hardinge, Murchison, Darling, and Clarke: Starting at the confluence of Cope's Creek with the Gwydir or Big River; and bounded thence by Cope's Creek upwards to the road from Bundarra to Inverell; thence by that road northerly to the boundary dividing the county of Gough from the county of Hardinge; thence by that boundary and by the boundary dividing the county of Gough from the County of Clarke, easterly to the road from Armidale to Glen Innes; thence by that road southerly to the boundary dividing the county of Clarke from the county of Sandon; thence by that boundary westerly to the western boundary of the Great Northern Railway enclosure; thence by that boundary southerly to the boundary dividing the parish of Falconer from the parish of Exmouth, county of Sandon; thence by that boundary westerly to the boundary between the last-mentioned county and the county of Hardinge; thence by that boundary (being the range dividing the waters of the Abington Creek from those of the Booroolong Creek and a line southerly) to the Bundarra River; thence by that river downwards to Roumalla Creek, and by that creek upwards to Stonybattery Creek, and by that creek upwards to its source in the Nandewar Range; thence by that range southerly to the source of Boundary Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Muluerindie River; thence by that river downwards to the Moonbi Range; thence by that range southerly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Darling and Inglis; thence by that boundary westerly to the source of Rushe's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Namoi River; thence by that river downwards to Halla Linga Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range forming the boundary between the counties of Darling and Nandewar; thence by that range and the boundary dividing the county of Murchison from the counties of Nandewar, Jamison, Courallie, and Burnett (being the range dividing the waters flowing into the Namoi River from those flowing into the Horton River, and the range dividing the waters flowing into Courallie Creek from those flowing into the Horton River, and the northern boundary of the Bangheet pastoral holding) north-westerly, northerly, and easterly, crossing the Gwydir River, to the west boundary of the Myall Creek pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary south and by part of the south boundary of that holding east to the boundary between the parishes of Dingo and Evans, county of Murchison; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Gwydir or Big River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

### 89. NARRABRI.

Comprising the county of Jamison and parts of the counties of Benarba, Denham, Courallie, Nandewar, White, and Baradine: Starting at the confluence of Kihl or Maule's Creek with the Namoi River; and bounded thence by that river upwards to the north-western boundary of the Ghoolendaadi pastoral holding; thence by that boundary south-westerly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of White and Pottinger; thence by that boundary southerly to the northern boundary of Borah pastoral holding; thence by that boundary westerly and part of the west boundary of that holding southerly to the boundary dividing Denobollie pastoral holding from Arrarownie pastoral holding; thence by that boundary westerly to the south-west corner of the latter holding; thence by a line west to the easternmost corner of Bullerawa pastoral holding; thence by the south-east boundary of that holding south-westerly, a south-western boundary north-westerly, and again by a south-eastern boundary south-westerly to the boundary dividing Cumble, Kiambir, and Bimble pastoral holdings from Cumbil, Wargen, and Dinby pastoral holdings, generally westerly and southerly to the western boundary of Bimble pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary south to the road from Baradine to Bullarora; thence by that road westerly to Terembone or Teridgerie Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the crossing of the road from Coonamble to Pilliga; thence by that road south-westerly to Gunyillah Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Bullarora or Tourable Creek; thence by that creek downwards to

the Castlereagh River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary dividing the Warragan and Wingadee pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary northerly, easterly, and northerly to the boundary dividing the counties of Leichhardt and Baradine; thence by that boundary north-westerly to the boundary dividing the Goangra and Ulambie pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary northerly to the Namoi River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the Kucargo and Eurie Eurie pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary northerly and north-easterly, and by the boundary dividing the last-mentioned pastoral holding from the Merkadool pastoral holding northerly and westerly to the Barwon River; thence by that river upwards to the Gwydir River; thence by that river upwards to the Moomin River; thence by that river upwards to Courallie Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the eastern boundary of portion 11, parish of Windoondilla, county of Courallie; thence by that boundary, the eastern boundary of portion 112 of that parish, and the eastern boundary of portion 67, parish of Gurly, southerly to the south-east corner of the last-mentioned portion; thence by the southern boundary of that portion westerly to the boundary dividing the counties of Courallie and Jamison; thence by that boundary and the range dividing the counties of Jamison and Nandewar from the counties of Murchison and Darling south-easterly to the source of Cox's Creek; and thence by that creek and Kihî or Maule's Creek aforesaid downwards to the starting point.

### 90. COONAMBLE.

Comprising parts of the counties of Leichhardt, Gowen, Ewenmar, Oxley, Gregory, and Lincoln: Starting at the confluence of the Wallumburrawang Creek with the Castlereagh River, and bounded thence by that river upwards to Ranter's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the south boundary of the parish of Lincoln, county of Lincoln; thence by part of that boundary and by part of the boundary between the counties of Ewenmar and Lincoln, westerly and south-westerly to Coolbaggie Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Brocklehurst to Warren; thence by that road westerly to Ewenmar Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the boundary between the Burraway and Belgoreen pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary south-westerly to the Macquarie River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary between the counties of Oxley and Narromine; thence by that boundary south-westerly to the boundary between Nevertire and Cathundril No. 2 pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary north-westerly, and by the north-western boundary of the Nevertire pastoral holding north-easterly to the boundary between Cremorne and Gunningbar pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary north-westerly, and by the south-eastern, south-western, and part of the north-western boundary of Belaringar pastoral holding south-westerly, north-westerly, and north-easterly to a point in the south-easterly continuation of the south-west boundary of portion 31, parish of Warien, county of Oxley; thence by a line partly formed by part of the boundary dividing the leasehold from the resumed area of the Gunningbar pastoral holding north-westerly to the south-eastern boundary of the Mullengudgerly pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary north-easterly, and by the boundary dividing the leasehold from the resumed area of that holding north-westerly to the south-eastern boundary of the Benaweena pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary north-easterly to Gunningbar Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the south-eastern boundary of the Merryanbone pastoral holding; thence by that boundary north-easterly and by the north-eastern boundary of that holding north-westerly to the south-eastern boundary of the Canonba pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary north-easterly and by the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of that holding north-westerly and south-westerly to Duck Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the boundary between Murrawombie and Moonagee pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary westerly to the Bogna River; thence by that river upwards to the northern boundary of the county of Gregory; thence by part of that boundary easterly to Mara Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the boundary dividing the resumed from the leasehold area of the Willie pastoral holding; thence by that boundary easterly and north-easterly, and by the south-eastern boundary of the Derri Derri pastoral holding north-easterly to the Macquarie River; thence by that river downwards to the south-eastern boundary of the county of Clyde; thence by part of that boundary north-easterly to the northern boundary of the Quabothoo pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary easterly, by a western boundary northerly, and by the north-western boundary of that holding and the north-western boundary of the Gungalman West pastoral holding north-easterly to Nedgera Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Castlereagh River; thence by that river upwards to Bullarora or Tourable Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Gunyillah Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the crossing of the road from Coonamble to Pilliga; thence by that road north-easterly to Terembone or Teridgerie Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the western boundary of Goorianawa pastoral holding; thence by that boundary southerly to Square Top Mountain on the boundary between the counties of Baradine and Leichhardt; thence by that boundary and the range forming the boundary between the counties of Baradine and Gowen generally southerly to the range forming the western boundaries of the Belar, Tannabar, and Gowang pastoral holdings; thence by that range southerly to the source of Wallamburrawang Creek; and thence by that creek downwards to the starting point.

## 91. CONDOUBLIN.

Comprising the whole of the counties of Cunningham and Kennedy, and parts of the counties of Flinders, Narromine, and Oxley: Starting on the Lachlan River at the southern extremity of the boundary dividing the counties of Cunningham and Ashburnham; and bounded thence by that county boundary northerly along the Gunning Range to the southern boundary of the county of Kennedy, on the summit of the range dividing the waters of the Bogan and Lachlan Rivers; thence by that county boundary easterly along that range to Harvey's Range, dividing the waters of the Bogan and Macquarie Rivers, and northerly along that range and the Sappa Bulga Range to the source of Ugumjil Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Wallaby Creek, and by that creek downwards to the Backwater Cowel, and by that Cowel and the Boggy Cowel westerly to the north-western boundary of the county of Narromine; thence by that boundary south-westerly to the boundary between Nevertire and Cathundril No. 2 pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary north-westerly, and by the north-western boundary of Nevertire pastoral holding north-easterly to the boundary between Cremorne and Gunningbar pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary north-westerly, and by a north-western, a north-eastern, and another north-western boundary of Cremorne pastoral holding, generally westerly and south-westerly to the northernmost corner of Eugeldrie pastoral holding; thence by the north-western boundary of that holding south-westerly to the Bogan River; thence by that river downwards to the road from Buddabudah to Nymagee, *viâ* Panjee and Babinda; thence by that road westerly to the south-western boundary of the county of Flinders; thence by that boundary and the south-western boundary of the county of Cunningham, south-easterly to the Lachlan River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

## 92. ASHBURNHAM.

Comprising part of the counties of Ashburnham and Forbes: Starting on the Lachlan River, at the confluence of Mandagery Creek; and bounded thence by that creek upwards to the confluence of Moura Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in Croker's Range; thence by that range northerly to the range forming the northern boundary of the county of Ashburnham, and dividing the waters of the Macquarie and Bogan Rivers from those of the Lachlan River; thence by that county boundary westerly along that range, and southerly along the Gunning Range to the Lachlan River aforesaid; thence by that river upwards to the west boundary of the Municipal District of Forbes; thence by part of the west, the south, and part of the east boundaries of that district southerly, easterly, and northerly to the said river; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

## 93. GRENFELL.

Comprising the county of Gipps, and parts of the counties of Bland, Bourke, Cooper, Forbes, and Monteagle: Starting on the Lachlan River, at the confluence of Kangaroo Creek; and bounded thence by that river downwards to the eastern boundary of the Municipal District of Forbes; thence by part of the east, the south, and part of the west boundaries of that district southerly, westerly, and northerly to the said river; thence by that river downwards to the northern extremity of the Goobothery Range; thence by the boundary between the counties of Dowling and Gipps southerly along that range; and thence southerly, *viâ* Gorman's Hill and The Monument, to the western boundary of Yalcogoring North pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary, by the westernmost boundary of Buddigower pastoral holding, and by a western and south-western boundary of Yalcogrin pastoral holding, south and south-easterly to the line dividing the leasehold area from the resumed area of the last-named holding; thence by that dividing line to a southern boundary of that holding; thence by part of that boundary and a western and another southern boundary of that holding east, south, and again east to the western boundary of Bolaro Block A North pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary, and by the southern and part of the eastern boundary of that holding, south, east, and north, to the western extremity of the southernmost boundary of Bygoo pastoral holding; thence by that boundary and by part of the eastern boundary of that holding east and north to the south-west corner of Kildary pastoral holding; thence by the southern boundaries of that holding and West Mandamah and Mandamah pastoral holdings easterly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Bland and Bourke; thence by that range south-easterly to the range dividing the waters of Barmedman or Mandamah Creek from those of Narraburra Creek; thence by the Narraburra Range north-easterly and northerly till it intersects a western boundary of Morangarell and Narraburra Creek pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary north to the line dividing the leasehold and resumed areas of that holding; thence by that dividing line easterly, northerly, and easterly to a point near the confluence of Narraburra Creek and Yeo Yeo or Bland Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the confluence of Bribaree Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the boundary between the counties of Bland and Monteagle; thence by part of that boundary south-easterly to the road from Morangarell to Burrangong; thence by that road easterly to a point south of the south-east corner of portion 13, parish of Burrumunda, county of Monteagle;

thence by a line forming the eastern boundary of that portion and the eastern boundaries of portions 109, 108, 113, and 111, parish of Kikiamah, north to the southern boundary of portion 14, same parish; thence by part of the southern and eastern boundary of that portion east and north to Burrangong Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Forbes to Young; thence by that road north-westerly to the range dividing the waters of Tyagong Creek from those of Burrangong Creek; thence by that range easterly to the range dividing the waters of Tyagong Creek from those of Kooroowatha or Crowther Creek; thence by that range northerly to the range dividing the waters of Tyagong Creek from those of Kangaroo Creek aforesaid; thence by that range generally westerly to the source of Kangaroo Creek; and thence by that creek downwards to the starting point.

#### 94. YOUNG.

Comprising parts of the counties of Bland and Monteagle: Starting on the range forming the boundary between the counties of Forbes and Monteagle where it meets the range dividing the waters of the Boorowa River from those of Kooroowatha or Crowther Creek at the source of Morongla Creek; and bounded thence by the last-named range southerly to the range dividing the waters of the Lachlan River from those of the Murrumbidgee River; thence, along that range, by the boundary dividing the counties of Monteagle and Bland from the counties of Harder, Clarendon, and Bourke, south-westerly, westerly, and northerly to the range dividing the waters of Barmedman or Mandamah Creek from those of Narraburra Creek; thence by that range north-easterly and northerly till it intersects a western boundary of Morangarell and Narraburra Creek pastoral holdings; thence by part of that boundary north to the line dividing the leasehold and resumed areas of that holding; thence by that dividing line easterly, northerly, and easterly to a point near the confluence of Narraburra Creek and Yeo Yeo or Bland Creek; thence by the latter creek upwards to the confluence of Bribaree Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the boundary between the counties of Bland and Monteagle; thence by part of that boundary south-easterly to the road from Barmedman to Young; thence by that road easterly to a point south of the south-east corner of portion 13, parish of Burrumunda, county of Monteagle; thence by a line forming the eastern boundary of that portion and the eastern boundaries of portions 109, 108, 113, and 111, parish of Kikiamah, north to the southern boundary of portion 14, same parish; thence by part of the southern and the eastern boundary of that portion east and north to Burrangong Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Forbes to Young; thence by that road north-westerly to the range dividing the waters of Tyagong Creek from those of Burrangong Creek; thence by that range easterly to the range dividing the waters of Tyagong Creek from those of Kooroowatha or Crowther Creek; thence by that range northerly to the boundary between the counties of Forbes and Monteagle; thence by that boundary east to Kooroowatha or Crowther Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the confluence of Bang Bang Creek, and by that creek upwards to its source in a spur range forming the boundary between the counties of Forbes and Monteagle; and by that range easterly to the starting point.

#### 95. NARRANDERA.

Comprising parts of the counties of Cooper, Bourke, Clarendon, and Mitchell: Starting at the junction of the Murrumbidgee River and Yanko Creek; and bounded thence by that creek southerly to the boundary dividing the county of Mitchell from the county of Urana; thence by that boundary easterly to the boundary dividing the parishes of Birrego and Faithfull, county of Mitchell; thence by that boundary generally northerly to the boundary dividing Buckingham pastoral holding from Boree Creek and Brewarrina pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary northerly to Sandy Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Sandy Creek to Buckingham; thence by that road northerly to the Murrumbidgee River; thence by a line crossing that river to the boundary dividing the Bundidgerie pastoral holding from the Grong Grong pastoral holding; thence by that boundary northerly to the Bundidgerie Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the west boundary of portion 53, parish of Berembed, county of Bourke; thence by that boundary and a line northerly to the south-west corner of portion 117; thence by part of that boundary to the westernmost boundary of portion 135; thence by that boundary and the south boundaries of that portion and portions 197, 198, 99, 98, and 97, easterly, and by part of the east boundary of the last-named portion northerly to Boggy Creek; thence by that creek easterly to the west boundary of portion 3, parish of Derry; thence by part of that boundary northerly and the north boundary of that portion easterly to the west boundary of portion 1; thence by part of that boundary northerly and by the north boundary of that portion and its prolongation easterly to a point north of the north-west corner of portion 5; thence by a line south to that corner; thence by the northern boundaries of portions 5, 10, 23, 35, 25, 18, and 15, easterly to the east boundary of the last-named portion; thence by that boundary and part of the east boundary of portion 17 southerly to meet the westerly prolongation of the north boundary of portion 22, parish of Hooke; thence by that prolongation and boundary easterly to the east boundary of that portion; thence by that boundary and the eastern

## 97. GUNDAGAI.

Comprising parts of the counties of Harden, Clarendon, Buccleugh, and Wynyard: Starting at the Murrumbidgee River at the confluence of Jugiong Creek; and bounded thence by the range dividing the waters of Jugiong and Cunningham's Creeks from those of Cooney's and Muttama Creeks north-westerly to the eastern boundary of the Municipal District of Wallendbeen at the eastern boundary of portion 690, parish of Cullinga, county of Harden; thence by that municipal boundary southerly, westerly, and generally north-westerly to the range aforesaid at the eastern boundary of portion 350, parish of Jindalee, county of Harden; thence by that range north-westerly to the range dividing the waters of the Lachlan River from those of the Murrumbidgee River; thence by that range westerly to the range dividing the waters of Houlaghan's Creek from those of Billabung and Wantiool Creeks; thence by that range southerly to the watershed of Sandy Creek; thence by the western and southern limits of that watershed southerly and easterly to the Murrumbidgee River; thence by that river upwards to the confluence of Yaven Yaven or Hillas' Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the south-west corner of portion 15, parish of Yaven, county of Wynyard; thence by a line forming the western boundary of that portion north to the range forming the limits of the watershed of Black Springs Creek; thence by that range easterly and southerly to Euadera Mountain, and again easterly along the limits of the watershed of Oak Creek to Veteran's Peak; thence by a line east to the western boundary of portion 104, parish of Willie Ploma; thence by part of the southern boundary of the parish of Willie Ploma easterly, crossing Adelong Creek, to the range dividing the waters of Bunnabuckbuck and Stuckey's Creeks from those of Big Ben, Stoney, and Slaughter-house Creeks; thence by that range easterly to the Tumut River; thence by that river downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Darbalara, county of Buccleugh; thence by that boundary easterly and by part of the eastern boundary of that parish northerly to the range dividing the waters of Adjungbilly Creek from those of Oak Creek; thence by that range easterly by Paddy's Rock Hill to the range dividing the waters of the Murrumbidgee River from those of the Tumut River; thence by that range south-easterly to the range dividing the waters of MacPherson's Swamp Creek from those of Jeremiah Creek; thence by that range northerly to the Murrumbidgee River aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

## 98. TUMUT.

Comprising parts of the counties of Buccleugh, Wynyard, and Selwyn: Starting on the Tumut River at the southern boundary of the parish of Darbalara, county of Buccleugh; and bounded thence by that boundary easterly, and by part of the eastern boundary of that parish northerly to the range dividing the waters of Adjungbilly Creek from those of Oak Creek; thence by that range easterly by Paddy's Rock Hill to the range dividing the waters of the Murrumbidgee River from those of the Tumut River; thence by that range south-easterly to the range dividing the waters of the Goodradigbee River from those of the Tumut River; thence by that range southerly to the range dividing the waters of the Murrumbidgee and Snowy Rivers from those of the Tumut River; thence by that range southerly to the range dividing the waters of the Tumut and Murrumbidgee Rivers from those of the Murray River; thence by that range north-westerly and westerly to the range dividing the waters of Tarcutta Creek from those of Kyeamba and Coreinbob Creeks; thence by that range northerly, *via* Burngoogee, Kilgowla, Flint, and Bijingun Mountains, to the south boundary of portion 78, parish of Tarcutta, county of Wynyard (W. J. Clarke's C.L., 1,350 acres); thence by part of that boundary west, and by a line forming the north-western boundaries of that portion and portions 77, 76, and 61, north-easterly to Tarcutta Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the south-east corner of portion 16; thence by a line forming the eastern boundary of that portion north to the southern boundary of portion 100; thence by part of that boundary and by the western boundary of that portion west and north to its north-west corner; thence by a line forming the northern boundary of that portion east to the range dividing the waters of Tarcutta Creek from those of Yaven Yaven Creek; thence by that range south-easterly to a point west of the north-west corner of portion 103, parish of Yaven; thence by a line forming the northern boundaries of that portion and portions 100 and 53 east to the Main South Road; thence by that road northerly to Yaven Yaven or Hillas Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the south-west corner of portion 15, parish of Yaven; thence by a line forming the western boundary of that portion north to the range forming the limits of the watershed of Black Springs Creek; thence by that range easterly and southerly to Euadera Mountain, and again easterly along the limits of the watershed of Oak Creek to Veteran's Peak; thence by a line east to the western boundary of portion 104, parish of Willie Ploma; thence by part of the southern boundary of the parish of Willie Ploma easterly, crossing Adelong Creek, to the range dividing the waters of Bunnabuckbuck and Stuckey's Creeks from those of Big Ben, Stoney, and Slaughterhouse Creeks; thence by that range easterly to the Tumut River; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

## 99. COOMA.

Comprising the county of Beresford, and parts of the counties of Cowley, Dampier, Wellesley, and Wallace: Starting on the range dividing the waters of the coast from the inland waters at the source of the Queanbeyan River, near Mount Tumanmang; and bounded thence by that river downwards to the confluence of Tinderry Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Murrumbidgee River; thence by that river upwards to Gap Creek; thence by that creek and a tributary thereof to Mount Clear; thence by the range dividing the waters of the Murrumbidgee River from those of Naas Valley Creek, Gudgenby, Cotter, and Goodradigbee Rivers westerly to the range dividing the waters of the last-named river from those of the Tumut River; thence by the range dividing the waters of the Snowy and Murrumbidgee Rivers on the east from those of the Tumut and Murray Rivers on the west southerly to the boundary which divides the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria; thence by that boundary easterly to the Snowy River; thence by that river upwards to Bobundara Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the north-east corner of portion 70, parish of Boco, county of Wellesley; thence by the east boundaries of that portion and of portion 69, and their prolongation southerly to the road from Bobundara to Nimitabel; thence by that road easterly to the east boundary of portion 216, parish of Boco, aforesaid; thence by part of that boundary southerly to meet the westerly prolongation of the north boundary of portion 5, parish of Glenbog; thence by a line partly forming the north boundaries of portions 5, 38, 39, and part of portion 11, easterly to the range forming the boundary between the Land Districts of Bombala and Cooma; thence by that range easterly to the range dividing the waters of the coast from the inland waters; and thence by that range northerly to the source of the Tuross River; thence by that river downwards to the confluence of Woila Creek with that river; thence by Woila Creek upwards to a spur range which terminates at the head of that creek; thence by that spur range to the range forming the southern watershed of the Shoalhaven River at a point near Euranbene Mountain; thence by that range south-westerly to Big Badja Mountain in the range dividing the waters of the coast from the inland waters aforesaid; and thence by that range northerly to the starting point.

## 100. BEGA.

Comprising parts of the counties of Auckland and Dampier: Starting on the Ocean at the north-east corner of portion 129, parish of Panbula, county of Auckland; and bounded thence by a line forming the northern boundaries of that portion and portions 125 and 124 west, and by the western boundaries of portions 124 and 123 south to the northern boundary of portion 51; thence by a line partly forming part of that boundary west to the road from Wolumla to Merrimbula; thence by that road westerly to a point east of the south-east corner of portion 198, parish of Wolumla; thence by a line partly forming the southern boundary of that portion west to a point north of the north-east corner of portion 17, parish of Cobra; thence by a line south to that corner; thence by part of the northern boundary of the parish of Cobra generally westerly to the range dividing the waters of Panbula and Towamba Rivers from those of the Bega River; thence by that range westerly to the range dividing the waters of the Snowy River from those of the Bega River; thence by that range northerly to the range dividing the waters of the Bega River on the east from those of the Snowy and Murrumbidgee Rivers on the west; thence by that range to the source of the Tuross River; thence by that river downwards to the confluence of Reedy Creek with that river; thence by Reedy Creek upwards to the road from Cobargo to Bodalla, *via* Eurobodalla; thence by that road southerly to the southern branch of Dignam's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Narira to Tilba Tilba, which forms the western and northern boundaries of portions 100 and 235 and the northern boundaries of portions 238, 237, 405, and 404, parish of Noorooma, county of Dampier; thence by that road easterly to a point north of the north-east corner of the last-named portion on the summit of the range dividing the waters flowing into Tilba Tilba Swamp from those flowing into Wallaga Lake; thence by that range south-easterly to the shore of Wallaga Lake; thence by that shore easterly to the Ocean, and by the Ocean southerly to the starting point.

## 101. BOMBALA.

Embracing parts of the counties of Auckland and Wellesley: Starting on the Ocean, at the north-east corner of portion 129, parish of Panbula, county of Auckland; and bounded thence by a line forming the northern boundaries of that portion and portions 125 and 124 west, and by the western boundaries of portions 124 and 123 south, to the northern boundary of portion 51; thence by a line partly forming part of that boundary west to the road from Wolumla to Merrimbula; thence by that road westerly to a point east of the south-east corner of portion 198, parish of Wolumla; thence by a line partly formed by the southern boundary of that portion west to a point north of the north-east corner of portion 17, parish of Cobra; thence by a line south to that corner; thence by part of the northern boundary of the parish of Cobra generally westerly to the range dividing the waters of Panbula and Towamba Rivers from those of the Bega River; thence by that range westerly to the range dividing the waters of the Snowy River from

those of the Bega and Towamba Rivers; thence by that range northerly to the range forming the boundary between the Land Districts of Cooma and Bombala; thence by that range westerly to the northern boundary of portion 11, parish of Glenbog, county of Wellesley; thence by a line partly forming the northern boundaries of that portion and portions 39, 38, and 5, west, to the east boundary of portion 216, parish of Boco; thence by part of that boundary north to the road from Nimitabel to Bobundarah; thence by that road westerly to a point south of the south-east corner of portion 69, parish of Boco; thence by a line partly formed by the eastern boundaries of that portion and portion 70 north to Bobundarah Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Snowy River, and by that river downwards to the boundary dividing the colonies of Victoria and New South Wales; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Ocean at Cape Howe; and thence by the Ocean northerly to the starting point;—together with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined.

## 102. THE HUME.

Comprising parts of the counties of Urana, Mitchell, Wynyard, Hume, Goulburn, and Selwyn: Starting on the boundary dividing the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria at the source of the Upper Indi River, in the range dividing the waters of the Snowy River on the east from those of the Murray River on the west; and bounded thence by that range generally northerly to the range dividing the waters of the Murrumbidgee River from those of the Murray River; thence by that range generally north-westerly and westerly to the range dividing the waters of Tarcutta Creek from those of Kyeamba and Corinbob Creeks; thence by that range northerly, *viâ* Burngoogee, Kilgowla, and Flint Mountains, to the head of Toole's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the confluence of Kyeamba Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the confluence of O'Brien's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the northern boundary of the parish of Woomahrigong, county of Wynyard; thence by part of that boundary westerly to the south-west corner of portion 87, parish of Gregado; thence by the westerly prolongation of the southern boundary of that portion westerly to the eastern boundary of portion 167, parish of Rowan; thence by the eastern and part of the southern boundary of that portion and the eastern boundary of portion 18 south, west, and again south to the south-east corner of the last-named portion; thence by the southern boundary of that portion and a line west to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Mitchell and Wynyard; thence by that boundary along that range westerly and north-westerly, *viâ* Plum Pudding Hill, to the northern boundary of portion 79, parish of Sandy Creek, county of Mitchell, and by that boundary west to the eastern boundary of portion 156, parish of Uranquinty; thence by part of the eastern and by the southern boundary of that parish southerly and westerly to the south-west corner of portion 44, parish of Sandy Creek; thence by the westerly prolongation of the southern boundary of that portion to Sandy Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the southern boundary of the parish of Yarragundry; thence by that boundary generally westerly to the southernmost boundary of the parish of Mundowey; thence by that boundary and a western boundary of that parish west and north to the road from Urana to Wagga Wagga; thence by that road south-westerly to the eastern boundary of portion 18, parish of Bullenbung; thence by a line partly forming that boundary north to the north-east corner of that portion; thence by a line forming the northern boundaries of that portion and portions 5, 16, 17, and 66 west to Bullenbung Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the northern boundary of portion 50, parish of Osborne; thence by the northern boundaries of that portion and portion 51 westerly to the eastern boundary of portion 41; thence by part of that boundary and the northern and western boundaries and part of the south-western boundary of that portion north, west, south, and south-easterly to the intersection of the north-easterly prolongation of the south-western boundary of portion 70; thence by that boundary and the south-eastern boundary of portion 116 south-westerly to the northern boundary of portion 98; thence by part of that boundary and the western boundaries of portions 98 and 99 south to the south-west corner of the last-named portion; thence by a line forming part of the south-eastern boundary of portion 55 south-westerly to the boundary between the counties of Urana and Mitchell; thence by that county boundary north-westerly and westerly to the western boundary of the parish of Galore, county of Urana; thence by that boundary and the western boundaries of the parishes of Lockhart, Napier, Clive, and Ross generally southerly to Urangeline Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the boundary dividing the parish of Ross aforesaid from the parish of Finlay; thence by that boundary southerly to the northern boundary of the county of Hume; thence by part of that boundary westerly to the boundary dividing the parish of Bulgandry from the parish of Mahonga in that county; thence by the boundaries dividing the parishes of Bulgandry and Gibson from the parishes of Mahonga and Osborne bearing generally southerly to Goombargana Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the east boundary of portion 47, parish of Goombargana, county of Hume; thence by a line which forms part of that boundary and the east boundaries of portions 174 of that parish and 113, 115, 116, 138, 119, 120, 125, 128, 132, 87, 81, 187, and 86, parish of Richmond, southerly to the Oil Tree Lagoon; thence by the margin of that lagoon generally south-easterly and south-westerly to the line dividing the leasehold from the resumed area of Quat Quatta pastoral holding; thence by that dividing line southerly to the railway line from Corowa to Culcairn; thence by the

northern boundary of that railway enclosure generally north-easterly to the northern boundary of the parish of Castlestead, county of Hume; thence by the boundary dividing that parish from the parishes of Walla Walla, Creighton, and Morven generally easterly to the great Yambla Range; thence by that range southerly to the north boundary of portion 128, parish of Gerogery, county of Goulburn; thence by that parish boundary and the boundaries dividing the parishes of Mullanjandra and Wagra from the parishes of Woomargama, Hume, and Dora Dora generally along the range dividing the waters of Table-top, Mullanjandra, and Wagra Creeks on the south and west from the waters of the Woomargama and Honeysuckle Creeks on the north and east south-easterly to the Murray River at the south-west corner of portion 34, parish of Dora Dora; thence by the prolongation of that boundary crossing the Murray River to its left bank; and thence by the left bank of that river upwards and by the tributary known as the Upper Indi River (forming the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria) to the source of that tributary at the starting point.

### 103. ALBURY.

Comprising parts of the counties of Goulburn and Hume: Starting on the left bank of the Murray River, at a point opposite the southern extremity of a line dividing the leasehold from the resumed area of Quat Quatta pastoral holding; and bounded thence by that line northerly to the railway line from Corowa to Culcairn; thence by the northern boundary of that railway enclosure generally north-easterly to the northern boundary of the parish of Castlestead, county of Hume; thence by the boundary dividing that parish from the parishes of Walla Walla, Creighton, and Morven, generally easterly to the Great Yambla Range; thence by that range southerly to the north boundary of portion 128, parish of Gerogery, county of Goulburn; thence by that parish boundary and the boundaries dividing the parishes of Mullanjandra and Wagra from the parishes of Woomargama, Hume, and Dora Dora, generally along the range dividing the waters of Table-top, Mullanjandra, and Wagra Creeks on the south and west from the waters of the Woomargama and Honeysuckle Creeks on the north and east, south-easterly to the Murray River at the south-west corner of portion 34, parish of Dora Dora; thence by the prolongation of that boundary crossing the Murray River to its left bank; and thence by the left bank of that river downwards (being the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria) to the starting point.

### 104. THE MURRAY.

Comprising the county of Denison and portions of the counties of Urana and Hume: Starting on the left bank of the Murray River, at the east boundary of the county of Townsend; and bounded thence by that boundary northerly to the northern boundary of the county of Urana; thence by that boundary generally easterly to the west boundary of the parish of Galore, county of Urana; thence by that boundary and the boundaries dividing the parishes of Lockhart, Napier, Clive, and Ross from the parish of Hebden generally southerly to Urangeline Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the boundary dividing the parish of Ross aforesaid from the parish of Finlay; thence by that boundary southerly to the northern boundary of the county of Hume; thence by part of that boundary westerly to the boundary dividing the parish of Bulgandry from the parish of Mahonga in that county; thence by the boundaries dividing the parishes of Bulgandry and Gibson from the parishes of Mahonga and Osborne, bearing generally southerly to Goombargana Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the east boundary of portion 47, parish of Goombargana, county of Hume; thence by a line which forms part of that boundary and the east boundaries of portions 174, and 113, 115, 116, 138, 119, 120, 125, 128, 132, 87, 81, 187, and 86, parish of Richmond, southerly to Oil-tree Lagoon; thence by the margin of that lagoon generally south-easterly and south-westerly to the line dividing the leasehold from the resumed area of Quat Quatta pastoral holding; thence by that dividing line and its prolongation southerly to the left bank of the Murray River; and thence by that river bank downwards (being the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria) to the starting point.

### 105. DENILIQVIN.

Comprising the counties of Townsend, Cadell, and Wakool: Starting on the left bank of the Murray River, at a point opposite the mouth of the Wakool River; and bounded thence by that bank of the river upwards (being the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria) to the east boundary of the county of Townsend; thence by that boundary northerly, and by the northern boundaries of that county and the county of Wakool westerly to the west boundary of the latter county; thence by that boundary southerly to the Kyalite or Edward River; thence by that river downwards to the Wakool River; and thence by that river downwards to the starting point.

## 106. THE MURRUMBIDGEE.

Comprising the counties of Waradgery, Sturt, and Boyd, and parts of the counties of Nicholson, Cooper, and Caira: Starting at the junction of Yanko Creek with the Murrumbidgee River; and bounded thence by Yanko Creek upwards to the northern boundary of the county of Urana; thence by part of that boundary, the northern boundary of the county of Townsend, and part of the northern boundary of the county of Wakool, bearing generally westerly, to the boundary dividing the Yanga pastoral holding from the Keri Keri pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary northerly to the southern boundary of Tala pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary easterly to the boundary dividing that holding from Nap Nap pastoral holding; thence by that boundary northerly to the Murrumbidgee River; thence by that river upwards to the Lachlan River; thence by that river upwards to the north-west boundary of Boyong pastoral holding; thence by that boundary north-easterly to the Lachlan River; thence by that river upwards to the south boundary of portion 2, parish of Booligal, county of Nicholson; thence by part of that boundary easterly to the west boundary of the county of Nicholson; thence by part of that boundary southerly to meet the westerly prolongation of portion 52, parish of Tambalana, county of Nicholson; thence by a line partly formed by the south boundaries of portions 52, 22, 23, 24, 20, 25, 26, 27, 28, 39, 35, 34, 33, 1, 6, 2, and 3, of the said parish, and 4 and 10, parish of Coowerrawine, easterly to the boundary dividing the South Thononga pastoral holding from the Gunbar pastoral holding; thence by that boundary north-easterly and north-westerly to the south boundary of portion 22, parish of Bouyaree, county of Nicholson; thence by that boundary and the south boundaries of portions 21, 19, 15, 16, 17, 18, 27, 28, and 46 of that parish, and 44, 42, and 2 of the parish of Hopwood easterly to the road dividing portions 2, 41, and 38, from portions 25, 26, 1, and 39; thence by that road north to the south boundary of portion 32; thence by that boundary and the south boundaries of portions 22, 18, and 17, parish of Mea Mia south, and a line east to the boundary dividing the said Gunbar pastoral holding from the Cowl Cowl pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary south-easterly to the south-east boundary of the county of Nicholson; thence by part of that boundary north-easterly to the west boundary of the county of Cooper; thence by part of that boundary south to the north boundary of Ballandry pastoral holding; thence by the north and part of the east boundary of that holding easterly and southerly to the north boundary of Cocopara pastoral holding; thence by that boundary easterly, by the north-eastern boundaries of that holding and Binya pastoral holding south-easterly, and by a north boundary of the last-named holding easterly to the east boundary of the said Binya pastoral holding; thence by that boundary and the east boundary of North Gogeldrie pastoral holding southerly to the north boundary of North Yanco pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary westerly, and by the west boundary of that holding southerly to the Murrumbidgee River; and thence by that river upwards to the starting point.

## 107. THE LACHLAN.

Comprising the counties of Mouramba, Mossgiel, Blaxland, Waljeers, Franklin, and Dowling, and parts of the counties of Booroondarra, Woore, Manara, Nicholson, and Cooper: Starting at the northernmost corner of the county of Mouramba; and bounded thence by the boundary dividing the counties of Mouramba and Blaxland from the counties of Flinders and Cunningham southerly to the Lachlan River; thence by that river upwards to the northern extremity of the Gobothery Range; thence by the boundary between the counties of Dowling and Gipps southerly along that range, and thence southerly, *vid* Gorman's Hill and The Monument, to the eastern boundary of Nariah pastoral holding; thence by that boundary to its southern extremity, meeting the line dividing the leasehold from the resumed area of the Yalcogrin pastoral holding; thence by that line south-easterly, west, and south to a south boundary of that holding; thence by part of that boundary west to the east boundary of the Binya pastoral holding; thence by that boundary northerly and a north and north-east boundary of that holding, and a north-east and north boundary of the Cocopara holding, west, north-west, and west to the Cocopara Range; thence by that range northerly to a south boundary of the Conapaira pastoral holding, and by that boundary west to the western boundary of the county of Cooper, and by that boundary northerly to the south-eastern boundary of the county of Nicholson; thence by that boundary south-westerly to the boundary between the Cowl Cowl and Gunbar pastoral holdings, and by that boundary north-westerly to a point east of the south-east corner of portion 17, parish of Mea Mia south, county of Nicholson; thence by a line partly formed by the south boundaries of portions 17, 18, and 22, of that parish, and 32, parish of Hopwood, to the road dividing portions 39, 1, 26, and 25 from portions 38, 41, and 2; thence by that road south to the south boundary of the latter portion, and by that boundary and the south boundaries of portions 42 and 44, and the south boundaries of 46, 28, 27, 18, 17, 16, 15, 19, 21, and 22, parish of Bouyaree, to the boundary between Gunbar aforesaid and South Thononga pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary to meet the easterly prolongation of the south boundary of portion 10, parish of Coowerrawine, county of Nicholson; thence by a line which partly forms the south boundary of that portion and portion 4 of the said parish, and by the south boundaries of portions 3, 2, 6, 1, 33, 34, 35, 39, 40, 28, 27, 26, 25, 20, 24,

23, 22, and 52, parish of Tambalana, county of Nicholson, and its westerly prolongation to the eastern boundary of the county of Waradgery; thence by part of that boundary northerly and part of the south boundary of portion 2, parish of Booligal, westerly to the Lachlan River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary dividing the Corrong pastoral holding from the Tupra pastoral holding, and by that boundary to the western boundary of the county of Waljeers; thence by that boundary northerly to the south boundary of the parish of Darwin, county of Manara; thence by that boundary and the southern boundary of the parish of Gannarramby, county of Manara, to the west boundary of that parish, and by that boundary and its prolongation northerly to the south-west corner of Arlington Plains pastoral holding; thence by the boundaries dividing that holding from Mount Manara pastoral holding to the northern boundary of the county of Manara; thence by the boundary dividing the Marfield and Neckarboo pastoral holdings from the Mount Manara, Baden Park, Fulham, and Tiltagara pastoral holdings generally north-easterly and south-easterly to a north-west boundary of the Paddington pastoral holding; thence by that boundary, a north-east, a north-west, and a north-east boundary of that holding to the north-western boundary of the county of Mouramba, and by that boundary north-easterly to the starting point.

### 108. WENTWORTH.

Comprising the counties of Windeyer, Tara, Perry, Wentworth, Kilfera, and Taila, and parts of the counties of Tandora, Menindee, Livingstone, Manara, Waljeers, and Caira: Starting on the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria from South Australia at the Murray River; and bounded thence by the left bank of that river upwards (being the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria) to a point opposite the mouth of the Wakool River; thence by that river upwards to the Kyalite or Edward River; thence by that river upwards to the eastern boundary of the county of Caira; thence by that county boundary generally northerly and easterly to the eastern boundary of Yanga pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary northerly to the southern boundary of Tala pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary easterly to the boundary dividing that holding from Nap Nap pastoral holding; thence by that boundary northerly to the Murrumbidgee River; thence by that river upwards to the Lachlan River; thence by that river upwards to the north-west boundary of Boyong pastoral holding; thence by that boundary north-easterly to the Lachlan River; thence by that river upwards to the easternmost boundary of Tupra pastoral holding; thence by the boundaries dividing that holding from Corrong pastoral holding generally northerly and westerly to the eastern boundary of the county of Kilfera; thence by part of that county boundary and part of the eastern boundary of the county of Manara northerly to the south boundary of the parish of Darwin, county of Manara; thence by that boundary and the southern boundary of the parish of Gunarramby, county of Manara, westerly to the west boundary of the latter parish; thence by that boundary and its prolongation north to the south-west corner of Arlington Plains pastoral holding; thence by the boundaries dividing that holding from Mount Manara pastoral holding to the northern boundary of the county of Manara; thence by part of that county boundary westerly to the road from Ivanhoe to Wilcannia; thence by that road north-westerly to the south boundary of Billila pastoral holding; thence by that boundary westerly to the Darling River; thence by that river downwards to the east boundary of the county of Tandora; thence by that county boundary northerly and north-westerly to the easternmost corner of Glenlyon pastoral holding; thence by a south-east boundary of that holding south-westerly to the north boundary of Kinchega pastoral holding; thence by the boundary dividing that pastoral holding from the Glenlyon, Topar, and Mount Gipps pastoral holdings westerly to the eastern boundary of homestead lease 91-8; thence by part of that boundary southerly (forming a part of the eastern boundary of the county of Yancowinna) to Stephens Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the northern boundary of the county of Menindee; thence by that county boundary westerly to a southern boundary of Kinchega pastoral holding; thence by part of that holding boundary westerly to the westernmost boundary of that holding; thence by part of that boundary northerly to the northern boundary of the county of Menindee; thence by part of that county boundary westerly to the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and South Australia; and thence by that boundary southerly to the starting point.

### 109. ALMA.

Comprising part of the county of Yancowinna: Starting at the intersection of Slag-street, town of Willyama, with Garnet-street; and bounded thence by the latter street north-westerly to Brown-street (forming the north-west boundaries of portions 1,718 to 1,740, inclusive, and 1,742 to 1,749, inclusive, in the parish of Picton, being suburban lands at Willyama); thence by that street south-westerly to its intersection with the road or street which forms the south-west boundaries of portions 1,102, 1,103, 1,116, 1,117, 1,131, 1,132, 2,500, and 2,495, parish of Picton (also being suburban lands at Willyama); thence by that street and the prolongation of its north-east boundary to the north-west boundary of mineral lease 22, parish of Picton; thence by part of that boundary north-easterly to the

westernmost corner of mineral lease 93; thence by the south-west and part of the south-east boundary of that mineral lease south-easterly and north-easterly to the westernmost corner of mineral lease 5; thence by the south-west boundaries of mineral lease 5 and mineral lease 88 and part of the south-east boundary of the latter portion south-easterly and north-easterly to the road or street which forms the south-west boundaries of portions 1,812, 1,318, 1,319, 1,325, and 1,336, parish of Picton (being suburban lands at Alma); thence by that street south-easterly to its intersection with a road or street which forms the south-east boundaries of portions 1,485 to 1,514, inclusive, parish of Picton (being also suburban lands at Alma); thence by that road or street north-easterly to its intersection with a road or street which forms the north-east boundaries of portions 1,514, 1,484, 1,420, 1,419, 1,367, and 1,366, parish of Picton (being also suburban lands at Alma); thence by that road or street north-westerly to the south-east boundary of mineral lease 84 in the said parish; thence by part of that boundary north-easterly to the north-east corner of that mineral lease; thence by the north-east boundary of that mineral lease north-westerly to the northern corner of that lease; thence by a line being the continuation of the north-western boundary of that mineral lease partly forming a south boundary of an extension to the Town of Alma north-easterly to a south-west boundary of mineral lease 74; thence by that boundary north-westerly and the boundary dividing mineral lease 79 from mineral lease 80 to the south-east boundary of mineral lease 13; thence by part of that boundary north-easterly and the north-eastern boundary of the same lease north-westerly to Slag-street, town of Willyama; and thence by that street to the starting point.

#### 110. WILLYAMA.

Comprising part of the town and suburban lands at Willyama, in the county of Yancowinna: Starting at the intersection of Slag-street with Iodide-street; and bounded thence by the latter street north-westerly to Brown-street, forming the north-west boundaries of suburban portions 1,698 to 1,707, inclusive, 1,840, 1,839, 1,838, 1,837, 1,836, 1,835, 1,834, 1,833, 1,832, 1,831, and 1,708 to 1,717, inclusive, parish of Picton; thence by that street bearing south-westerly to Garnet-street; thence by that street south-easterly to Slag-street; and thence by that street north-easterly to the starting point.

#### 111. STURT.

Comprising parts of the counties of Farnell, Menindee, and Yancowinna: Starting on the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and South Australia, at the south-west corner of the county of Yancowinna; and bounded thence by part of the south boundary of that county easterly to the western boundary of Kinchega pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary southerly and by part of the southern boundary of that holding easterly to its intersection with the south boundary of the county of Yancowinna; thence by part of that boundary easterly to Stephens Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the east boundary of homestead lease 91-8; thence by part of that boundary northerly (being part of an east boundary of the county of Yancowinna) to the boundary dividing the Kinchega pastoral holding from the Mount Gipps pastoral holding; thence by that boundary easterly, and by part of an eastern boundary of Mount Gipps pastoral holding northerly to Yancowinna Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road or track from Five-mile Tank to Gairdner's Creek; thence by that road or track northerly to the northern boundary of the county of Yancowinna; thence by part of that boundary west to the eastern boundary of the county of Farnell; thence by part of that boundary north to the northernmost boundary of Poolamacca pastoral holding; thence by that boundary west, and by a western and part of a northern boundary of that pastoral holding southerly and westerly to the road from Burns to Corona; thence by that road south-westerly to the northern boundary of the county of Yancowinna; thence by part of that boundary west, and by a west and again by a north boundary of that county southerly and westerly to a western boundary of Mundi Mundi pastoral holding; thence by that boundary southerly and by a northern boundary of that pastoral holding westerly to the boundary dividing the Colonies of South Australia and New South Wales; and thence by that boundary southerly to the starting point. But exclusive of the Electoral Districts of Alma and Willyama, as hereinbefore defined.

#### 112. WILCANNIA.

Comprising the counties of Poole, Tongowoko, Delalah, Evelyn, Yantara, Fitzgerald, Mootwingee, Yungnulgra, Killara, and Young, and parts of the counties of Thoulcanna, Ularara, Farnell, Yancowinna, Tandora, Werunda, Rankin, Livingstone, and Woore: Starting on the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Queensland at the north-east corner of the Waverley Downs pastoral holding; and bounded thence by the boundaries dividing that pastoral holding, Berawimia Downs No. 3, and Elsinora pastoral holdings from Talyeale and Tinapagee pastoral

holdings generally southerly to the north boundary of Wanaaring pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary westerly, and by the boundary dividing the Wanaaring and Nocoleche pastoral holdings from the Urisino and Salisbury Downs pastoral holdings generally southerly to the south-west corner of Nocoleche pastoral holding; thence by part of the south boundary of that holding easterly to the Paroo River; thence by that river downwards to the western corner of the county of Landsborough; thence by the south-west boundary of that county (which partly forms the boundary dividing the Dunlop pastoral holding from the Kallara pastoral holding) south-easterly to the Darling River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary dividing the Cultowa pastoral holding from the Nelyambo pastoral holding; thence by that boundary generally south-easterly to the north-west boundary of Bulla Bulla pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary south-westerly to the boundary dividing Fulham pastoral holding from Bulla Bulla and Tiltagara pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the north-west boundary of Neckarboo pastoral holding; thence by the boundary dividing that holding and the Marfield pastoral holding from Fulham, Baden Park, and Mount Manaro pastoral holdings generally south-westerly to the northern boundary of the county of Manara; thence by part of that county boundary westerly to the road from Ivanhoe to Wilcannia; thence by that road north-westerly to the south boundary of Billila pastoral holding; thence by that boundary westerly to the Darling River; thence by that river downwards to the east boundary of the county of Tandora; thence by that county boundary northerly and its north-east boundary north-westerly to the easternmost corner of Glenlyon pastoral holding; thence by a south-east boundary of that pastoral holding south-westerly to the north boundary of Kincheqa pastoral holding; thence by the boundary dividing that holding from the Glenlyon and Topar pastoral holdings westerly to the westernmost boundary of the latter holding; thence by part of that boundary bearing north to Yancowinna Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road or track from Five-mile Tank to Gairdner's Creek; thence by that road or track north-westerly to the northern boundary of the county of Yancowinna; thence by part of that boundary west to the eastern boundary of the county of Farnell; thence by part of that county boundary north to the northernmost boundary of Poolamacca pastoral holding; thence by that boundary west, by a western boundary of that pastoral holding south, and by part of a northern boundary of that pastoral holding west to the road from Burns to Corona; thence by that road southerly to the northern boundary of the county of Yancowinna; thence by part of that county boundary west to the west boundary of Mundi Mundi pastoral holding; thence by that boundary southerly and by a northern boundary of that pastoral holding westerly to the boundary dividing the Colonies of South Australia and New South Wales; thence by that boundary northerly to the boundary dividing the Colonies of Queensland and New South Wales; and thence by that boundary easterly to the starting point.

### 113. BOURKE.

Comprising the counties of Barrona, Irrara, and Landsborough, and parts of the counties of Cowper, Gunderbooka, Culgoa, Thoulcanna, and Ularara: Starting on the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Queensland at the western boundary of Talyeale pastoral holding in the county of Thoulcanna; and bounded thence by that boundary easterly to the eastern boundary of the Belalie pastoral holding; thence by that boundary south and the boundary dividing the Molten Plains and Lissington pastoral holdings from Lila Springs pastoral holding easterly and southerly to a north boundary of Warraweena pastoral holding, and by that boundary east and the north-east boundary of that holding south-easterly to the Culgoa River; thence by that river downwards to its junction with the Darling River, and by that river upwards to the Bogan River; thence by that river upwards to the line dividing the leasehold from the resumed area of the Beemery pastoral holding, county of Cowper; thence by that line to a southern boundary of that holding; thence by that boundary westerly to the boundary dividing the Doradilla pastoral holding from the Moolta pastoral holding, and by that boundary southerly to the boundary dividing the latter holding from Mulga No. 1 pastoral holding; thence by that boundary westerly and southerly and by the boundaries of the Jandra pastoral holding south-westerly and north-westerly to the Darling River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary dividing the county of Landsborough from the county of Killara, and by that boundary north-westerly to the Paroo River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the county of Ularara from the county of Fitzgerald; thence by a part of that boundary, which forms part of the southern boundary of the Nocoleche pastoral holding, west to the western boundary of that holding; and thence by that boundary and the western boundaries of the Wanaaring, Tinapagee, and Talyeale pastoral holdings generally northerly to the starting point.

### 114. COBAR.

Comprising the counties of Canbelego, Robinson, and Yanda, and parts of the counties of Booroondarra, Cowper, Flinders, Gregory, Oxley, Rankin, Werunda, and Woore: Starting on the Darling River at the south-west boundary of the county of Rankin; and bounded thence by that river upwards to the boundary between the

Yanda and Jandra pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary south-easterly, a south-eastern boundary of the latter pastoral holding north-easterly and an eastern boundary northerly to the south boundary of the Mooculta pastoral holding; thence by that boundary easterly and an east boundary of that pastoral holding northerly to the southern boundary of the Beemery pastoral holding; thence by that boundary easterly to the line dividing the leasehold from the resumed area of that holding; thence by that line generally north-easterly to the Bogan River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary between the Murrawombie and Moonagee pastoral holdings; thence by that boundary easterly to the Duck Creek, and by that creek upwards to the north-western boundary of the Canonbar pastoral holding; thence by that boundary north-easterly, by a north-east boundary south-easterly, and again by a north-west boundary north-easterly to the western boundary of the Buttabone pastoral holding; thence by that boundary and part of the eastern boundary of the Merryanbone pastoral holding south-easterly, and by the south-eastern boundary of the latter holding to the Gunningbar Creek, and by that creek upwards to a western boundary of the Mullengudgery pastoral holding, and by that boundary southerly to the line dividing the leasehold and resumed areas of that holding, and by that line south-easterly to the south-eastern boundary of that holding, and by part of that boundary south-westerly to the line dividing the leasehold and resumed areas of the Gunningbar pastoral holding; thence by part of that line and a line in continuation thereof south-easterly to a north-western boundary of the Belaringar pastoral holding, and by that boundary south-westerly and part of its south-western boundary south-easterly to the north-west boundary of the Cremorne pastoral holding; thence by that boundary and the north-west boundary of the Eugeldrie pastoral holding south-westerly to the Bogan River; thence by that river downwards to the road from Buddabudah to Nymagee, *viâ* Pangee and Babinda; thence by that road westerly to the western boundary of the county of Flinders; thence by that boundary northerly to the south-eastern boundary of the county of Robinson, and by that boundary and part of the south-east boundary of the county of Booroondarra south-westerly to the easternmost boundary of the Paddington pastoral holding; thence by that boundary north-westerly and a north-western and north-eastern and again part of a north-western boundary to the easternmost corner of the Neckarboo pastoral holding; thence by the north-eastern and part of the north-western boundary of that holding north-westerly and south-westerly to the north-eastern boundary of the Fulham pastoral holding; thence by that boundary north-westerly to the south-eastern boundary of the Cultowa pastoral holding; and thence by that boundary north-easterly and a north-eastern, north-western, and again north-eastern boundary (the latter being part of the south-western boundary of the county of Rankin) north-westerly to the starting point.

### 115. THE BARWON.

Comprising the counties of Clyde, Culgoa, Finch, and Narran, and parts of the counties of Baradine, Denham, Gregory, Gunderbooka, and Leichhardt: Starting on the boundary dividing the Colonies of New South Wales and Queensland at the western boundary of Molten Plains pastoral holding; and bounded thence by the Colony boundary easterly to the Barwon River; thence by that river downwards to the boundary dividing the Merkadool pastoral holding from the Eurie Eurie pastoral holding; thence by that boundary easterly and southerly to the boundary dividing the latter holding from the Kucargo pastoral holding; thence by that boundary south-westerly and southerly to the Namoi River, and by that river downwards to the boundary dividing the Goangra pastoral holding from the Ulambie pastoral holding; thence by that boundary southerly to the boundary between the counties of Baradine and Leichhardt, and by that boundary south-easterly to the boundary dividing the Warragan pastoral holding from the Wingadee pastoral holding; thence by that boundary southerly to the Castlereagh River; thence by that river downwards to Nedgera Creek, and by that creek upwards to the north-western boundary of Gungalman West pastoral holding; thence by that boundary, a north-western, western, and part of a northern boundary of the Quabathoo pastoral holding south-westerly, southerly, and westerly to the boundary dividing the county of Clyde from the county of Gregory, and by that boundary south-westerly to the Macquarie River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the Derri Derri pastoral holding from the Willie pastoral holding, and by part of that boundary westerly to the line dividing the leasehold area from the resumed area of that holding; thence by that line to Marra Creek; thence by that creek upwards (forming partly a western boundary of the county of Gregory) to a northern boundary of that county; thence by that boundary westerly to the Bogan River; thence by that river downwards to the Darling River; thence by that river downwards to the Culgoa River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary between the Corella and Warraweena pastoral holdings, county of Gunderbooka; thence by that boundary north-westerly, and by part of the north boundary of the latter holding westerly to the west boundary of Lissington pastoral holding; and thence by the boundary dividing that pastoral holding and Molten Plains pastoral holding from Lila Springs and Belalie pastoral holdings generally northerly to the starting point.

## 116. MOREE.

Comprising the counties of Benarba and Courallie, part of the county of Burnett, nearly the whole of the county of Stapylton, part of the county of Jamison, and small parts of the counties of Arrawatta and Denham: Starting on the Dumaresq River at the westernmost corner of portion No. 6, parish of Bengalla, county of Arrawatta; and bounded thence by part of the south-western boundary of that portion south-easterly to the road from Bengalla to Tucka Tucka; thence by that road southerly to the Macintyre River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary between the counties of Stapylton and Arrawatta; thence by that boundary southerly to Ottley's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road from Yetman to Warialda; thence by that road southerly to the northern boundary of Gournama pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary easterly to the boundary dividing that pastoral holding from Gragin and Graman pastoral holding; thence by that boundary generally southerly to the north-east boundary of Gineroi pastoral holding; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the western boundary of the Myall Creek pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary south to the northern boundary of the Bangheet pastoral holding; thence by that boundary westerly to the boundary between the counties of Murchison and Courallie (being the range dividing the waters of Terry Hie Hie Creek from those of Horton's River); thence by that boundary southerly and south-westerly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Jamison and Courallie; thence by that county boundary generally north-westerly to the south-west corner of portion 67, parish of Gurly, county of Courallie; thence by the south boundary of that portion east and the eastern boundaries of that portion and portions 112 and 11, parish of Windoondilla, northerly to Courallie Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Moomin River; thence by that river downwards to the Gwydir River; thence by that river downwards to the Barwon River; thence by that river, the Macintyre River, and the Dumaresq River (being the boundary between the Colonies of New South Wales and Queensland) upwards to the starting point.

## 117. INVERELL.

Comprising nearly the whole of the county of Arrawatta, and small parts of the counties of Stapylton, Gough, Hardinge, Murchison, and Burnett: Starting at the confluence of the Beardy River with the Dumaresq River; and bounded thence by the last-mentioned river (being the boundary between the Colonies of Queensland and New South Wales) downwards to the westernmost corner of portion No. 6, parish of Bengalla, county of Arrawatta; thence by part of the south-western boundary of that portion south-easterly to the road from Bengalla to Tucka Tucka; thence by that road southerly to the Macintyre River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary between the counties of Stapylton and Arrawatta; thence by that boundary southerly to Ottley's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Yetman to Warialda; thence by that road southerly to the northern boundary of Gournama Pastoral Holding; thence by part of that boundary easterly to the boundary dividing that pastoral holding from Gragin and Graman Pastoral Holding; thence by that boundary generally southerly to the north-east boundary of Gineroi Pastoral Holding; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the western boundary of Myall Creek pastoral holding; thence by part of that boundary southerly, and by part of the south boundary of that holding easterly to the boundary between the parishes of Dingo and Evans, county of Murchison; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Gwydir or Big River; thence by that river upwards to Cope's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Bundarra to Inverell; thence by that road northerly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Gough and Hardinge; thence by that boundary easterly to the range forming the watershed between the waters flowing into the Mitchell River and those flowing into the Macintyre River; thence by that range northerly, and by the boundary dividing the counties of Gough and Arrawatta northerly, crossing the Severn River, to the range dividing the waters flowing into the last-mentioned river from those flowing into Glen or Robertson's Creek; thence by that range westerly to the source of Swamp Oak Creek; and thence by that creek and Beardy River aforesaid downwards, to the starting point.

## 118. GLEN INNES.

Comprising parts of the counties of Gough, Gresham, Clarke, and Sandon: Starting on the Gibraltar Range, which forms the boundary between the counties of Clive and Drake, at the source of Keye's or Pleasant Creek; and bounded thence by that creek downwards to Morven Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range which forms the boundary between the counties of Clive and Gough; thence by that range southerly to the range which divides the waters flowing into the Deepwater River from those flowing into the Severn River; thence by that range westerly to the range which divides the waters flowing into Glen or Robertson's Creek from those flowing into the Deepwater River; thence by that range northerly to the road from Deepwater to Tent Hill; thence by that road westerly to the western boundary of portion 52, parish of Wellington Vale, county of

Gough; thence by part of that boundary northerly to Glen or Robertson's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Beardy River; thence by Swamp Oak Creek upwards to the boundary between the counties of Gough and Arrawatta; thence by that boundary and by the range dividing the waters flowing into the Mitchell River from those flowing into the Macintyre River southerly to the boundary dividing the county of Gough from the county of Hardinge (being the range dividing the waters of the Moredun Creek from those of the Graham's Valley Creek); thence by that boundary easterly and by the boundary dividing the county of Gough from the county of Clarke (being the northern boundary of the parish of Ryanda, county of Clarke) easterly to the road from Glen Innes to Armidale; thence by that road southerly to the northern boundary of the county of Sandon; thence by part of that boundary westerly to the western boundary of the Great Northern Railway enclosure; thence by that boundary southerly to the boundary dividing the parish of Falconer from the parish of Exmouth, county of Sandon; thence by that boundary southerly and by the boundary dividing the parishes of Falconer and Wentworth from the parishes of Tilbuster and Springmount easterly, and by the boundary dividing the parish of Wentworth, county of Sandon, and the parish of Lagune, county of Clarke, from the parish of Clevedon, county of Sandon, and the parish of Gill, county of Clarke, northerly, easterly, and again northerly to the Aberfoyle River; thence by that river downwards to the Guy Fawkes River, thence by that river downwards to the Boyd or Little River; thence by that river downwards to Razorback Creek; and by that creek upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters of the Henry River from those of the Boyd or Little River; thence by a line westerly crossing the range to the source of Roger Creek; and by that creek downwards to the Henry River; thence by that river upwards to the west boundary of the parish of Newton-Boyd; and by that boundary north and the north-west boundary of that parish to the boundary dividing the county of Gough from the county of Drake; thence by that boundary northerly to the Gibraltar Range; and by that range northerly and westerly to the starting point.

#### 119. GRAFTON.

Comprising parts of the counties of Drake, Gresham, Clarence, and Fitzroy: Starting on the Gibraltar Range at the source of Dandahra Creek, and bounded thence by that range (partly forming the western boundary of the county of Drake) southerly to the boundary dividing the county of Gough from the county of Drake, and by that boundary easterly and southerly to the north-west boundary of the parish of Newton-Boyd, county of Gresham; thence by that boundary south-westerly and by the western boundary of that parish southerly to the Henry River, and by that river downwards to Roger Creek, and by that creek upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters of the Henry River from those of the Boyd or Little River; thence by a line easterly crossing the range to the source of Razorback Creek, and by that creek downwards to the Boyd or Little River; thence by that river downwards to the east boundary of the parish of Urania; thence by part of that boundary north to the road from Newton-Boyd to Grafton; thence by that road along the range forming the northern watershed of the Boyd or Little River to the Nymboida River; thence by that river upwards to the boundary dividing the counties of Gresham and Fitzroy; thence by that boundary southerly to the source of Horton's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Cloud's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Nymboida River aforesaid; thence by that river upwards to Little Nymboida River; thence by that river upwards to Mole Creek; thence by that creek upwards to a tree marked broad-arrow over J over 85; thence by a line north to the road from Kangaroo Creek Station to Nana Creek; thence by that road to the range forming the western watershed of the Tallawudjah Creek; thence northerly along that range to the west boundary of portion 21, parish of Kremnos, county of Fitzroy; thence by that boundary and the west boundaries of portions 2, 18, 19, 9, 8, 10, and 7, northerly to the north boundary of the last-mentioned portion and by that boundary east to the Orara River; thence by that river downwards to Dundoo Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Half-way Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Woogoolga to Grafton; thence by that road north-westerly to the road from Grafton to Yamba; thence by that road north-easterly and northerly to the south boundary of the parish of Coldstream, county of Clarence; thence by that boundary westerly to the Coldstream River; thence by that river downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Ulmarra; thence by that boundary generally westerly to Swan Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the right bank of the Clarence River; thence by the right bank of that river downwards to a point east of the junction of Alamy Creek with that river; thence by a line west to that junction; thence by that creek and lagoon or Bunyip Creek upwards to the north boundary of the parish of Great Marlow; thence by part of that boundary westerly to the road from Grafton to Casino; thence by that road northerly to the Richmond Range; thence by that range westerly by Mount Marsh and Mount Neville to the source of Dubadah or Deep Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Clarence River, and by that river upwards to Nogrigar Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range dividing the waters of the Clarence River from those of the Timbarra or Rocky River; thence by that range southerly to the Gibraltar Range, and by that range southerly to the starting point.

## 120. THE CLARENCE.

Comprising parts of the counties of Richmond and Clarence: Starting on the Ocean at the Redbank River; and bounded thence by that river upwards to Dirty Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the new road from Grafton to Woogoolga; thence by that road north-westerly to the road from Grafton to Yamba; thence by that road north-easterly and northerly to the south boundary of the parish of Coldstream, county of Clarence; thence by part of that boundary westerly to Coldstream River; thence by that river downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Ulmarra; thence by that boundary generally westerly to Swan Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the right bank of the Clarence River; thence by that river downwards to a point east of the junction of Alamy Creek with that river; thence by a line west to that junction; thence by that creek and Lagoon or Bunyip Creek upwards to the north boundary of the parish of Great Marlow; thence by part of that boundary westerly to the road from Grafton to Casino; thence by that road northerly to the Richmond Range; thence by that range easterly, northerly, and again easterly to the Ocean aforesaid; and thence by the Ocean southerly to the starting point;—Together with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined.

## 121. BALLINA.

Comprising parts of the counties of Rous and Richmond: Starting on the Ocean at Boundary Creek; and bounded thence by that creek westerly to the Richmond River; thence by a line west crossing that river to its left bank; thence by the left bank of that river and its north arm upwards to the south boundary of the parish of Tuckurimba, county of Rous; thence by the boundary dividing that parish from the parishes of Coraki and Broadwater, generally easterly, northerly, and westerly to Tucki Tucki Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Pearce's or Boggy Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the south boundary of the parish of Lismore; thence by part of that boundary generally easterly to Marom Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the eastern boundary of portion 49, parish of Lismore; thence by part of that boundary northerly, and by part of the north boundary of that portion westerly, to the road which forms the east boundary of portion 68; thence by that road northerly to the Cowalong Road; thence by that road generally north-easterly to Pearce's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Wilson's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Byron Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the boundary dividing the parish of Byron from the parishes of Teven and Newrybar; thence by that boundary generally easterly to the shore of the Ocean near Broken Head; and thence by the Ocean southerly to the starting point.

## 122. LISMORE.

Comprising part of the county of Rous: Starting on the range dividing the waters of the Tweed from those of the Richmond River, at the source of Hanging Rock or Leicester Creek at Mebbin or Hanging Rock; and bounded thence by that creek downwards to Back Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the boundary dividing the parish of South Lismore from the parish of Tomki; thence by that boundary southerly to the range dividing the waters flowing into the Richmond from those flowing into Pelican Creek; thence by that range south-easterly to the road which partly forms the northern boundaries of portions 62, 90, 86, 135, and 115, parish of North Codrington; thence by that road easterly to the road which partly forms the western boundaries of portions 32, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 180; thence by that road southerly to the road which partly forms the north-eastern boundaries of portions 16, 18, 19, 20, 21, 33, and 34, and the northern boundaries of portions 35, 36, and 51; thence by that road south-easterly and easterly to the north arm of the Richmond River; thence by a line east crossing that river to its left bank; thence by that river upwards to a point where it meets the south boundary of the parish of Tuckurimba; thence by the boundary dividing the last-mentioned parish from the parishes of Coraki and Broad-water generally easterly, northerly, and westerly to Tucki Tucki Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Pearce's or Boggy Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the south boundary of the parish of Lismore; thence by part of that boundary generally easterly to Marom Creek; thence by that creek northerly to the east boundary of portion 49, parish of Lismore; thence by part of that boundary and part of the northern boundary of that portion northerly and westerly to the road which forms the eastern boundary of portion 68; thence by that road northerly to the Cowalong Road; thence by that road generally north-easterly to Pearce's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Wilson's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the boundary dividing the parish of Jasper from the parish of Clunes; thence by that boundary generally westerly to Cooper's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Boggy or Repentance Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the road from Lismore to Byangum, which follows the Nightcap Range; thence by that road north-westerly to the range dividing the waters of the Tweed River from those of the Richmond River; and thence by that range westerly to the starting point.

## 123. THE TWEED.

Comprising part of the county of Rous: Starting on the Ocean at Point Danger; and bounded thence by the boundary dividing the colonies of New South Wales and Queensland south-westerly to the range dividing the waters of the Richmond River from those of the Tweed River; thence by that range southerly and easterly to the road from Lismore to Byangum, which follows the Nightcap Range; thence by that road south-easterly to Boggy or Repentance Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Cooper's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to where it meets the boundary dividing the parish of Jasper from the parish of Clunes; thence by that boundary generally easterly to Wilson's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Byron Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the boundary dividing the parish of Byron from the parishes of Teven and Newrybar; thence by that boundary generally easterly to the Ocean near Broken Head; and thence by the Ocean northerly to the starting point;—Together with the islands lying off the coast of the district so defined.

## 124. THE RICHMOND.

Comprising nearly the whole of the county of Richmond, and parts of the counties of Rous, Buller, and Drake: Starting on the boundary of the colony of Queensland, on Macpherson's Range, at the eastern boundary of the parish of Koreelah, county of Buller; and bounded thence by that boundary south and the east boundary of the parish of Gore and part of the north boundary of the parish of Beaury to Beaury Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Tooloom Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Clarence River; thence by that river downwards to the confluence of Dubadah or Deep Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the Richmond Range; thence by that range generally easterly by Mount Neville and Mount Marsh to the Ocean; thence by the Ocean northerly to Boundary Creek; thence by that creek westerly to the Richmond River; thence by a line west crossing that river to its left bank; thence by the left bank of that river and its north arm upwards to a point opposite the road which forms the north boundaries of portions 51, 36, and 35, parish of North Codrington, county of Rous; thence by that road westerly to the road which forms the north-eastern boundaries of portions 34, 33, 21, 20, 19, 18, and 16; thence by that road north-westerly to the road which forms the western boundaries of portions 180, 31, 30, 29, 28, 27, 26, 25, 24, 23, 22, and 32; thence by that road northerly to the road which forms the northern boundaries of portions 115, 135, 86, 90, and 62; thence by that road westerly to the range dividing the waters flowing into the Richmond from those flowing into Pelican Creek; thence by that range north-westerly to the eastern boundary of the parish of Tomki, county of Rous; thence by part of that boundary northerly to Back Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Hanging Rock or Leicester's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in the range which divides the waters of the Tweed River from those of the Richmond River at Mebbin or Hanging Rock; thence by that range northerly to the boundary of the colony of Queensland, on Macpherson's Range aforesaid; and thence by that boundary westerly to the starting point.

## 125. TENTERFIELD.

Comprising parts of the counties of Buller, Drake, Clive, and Gough: Starting at the confluence of the Beardy River with the Dumaresq River; and bounded thence by the first-mentioned river upwards to Glen or Robertson's Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the western boundary of portion 52, parish of Wellington Vale, county of Gough; thence by part of that boundary southerly to the road from Tent Hill to Deepwater; thence by that road generally easterly to the range dividing the waters of the Glen or Robertson's Creek from those of the Deepwater River; thence by that range southerly to the range dividing the waters of the Severn River from those of the Deepwater River; thence by that range southerly and easterly to the range forming the boundary between the counties of Clive and Gough; thence by that range northerly to the source of Morven Creek; thence by that creek downwards to Keye's or Pheasant Creek; thence by that creek upwards to its source in Gibraltar Range; thence by that range northerly to the range dividing the waters of the Clarence and Timbarra Rivers; thence by that range northerly to the source of Nogrigar Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Clarence River; thence by that river upwards to Tooloom Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Beaury Creek, and by that creek upwards to the north boundary of the parish of Beaury; thence by part of that boundary west and the east boundaries of the parishes of Gore and Koreelah north to the boundary between the colonies of Queensland and New South Wales; and thence by that boundary generally south-westerly to the starting point.

Before closing their Report, your Commissioners deem it their duty to invite attention to the fact that, in distributing New South Wales into Electoral Districts, they have included and dealt with Lord Howe Island, South Solitary Island, and Montague Island, as well as all other islands forming part of the territory which they are directed to distribute. In so acting your Commissioners have departed from what, as far as they can discover, has hitherto been the course of all legislation dealing with the Electoral Distribution of New South Wales, these islands appearing to have been constantly ignored; but they have strictly complied with the letter of the present statute, guided by the provisions of the Imperial Act, 18 and 19 Victoria, cap. 54, and the statute of New South Wales, 17 Victoria, No. 41, section 46.
