THE idea of publishing a Directory for Hobart Town was suggested to the compiler by many members of the mercantile community; and the extensive patronage the work has already received is an unmistakeable indication that it supplies a public want. Though every possible care has been taken in collecting information, and in preparing it for the press, many errors have doubtless crept in; indeed such are inseparable from a book of this description, and will not, it is hoped, greatly detract from its general usefulness. The compiler has to apologise for the somewhat tardy appearance of this Directory; this has been occasioned by some unavoidable delay in getting it through the Press; and has given rise to some few inaccuracies in the book itself, owing to changes that have taken place since the information was obtained.

IMMIGRATION.—The necessity of publishing the Bounty Regulations at length has been superseded by the establishment of the Hobart Town Immigration Society, which undertakes the agency of getting out relatives or immigrants under the Government Regulations. The Secretary (Mr. Rowcroft) will afford every information upon the subject. Bounty Tickets may be obtained of Mr. Loch at the rate of £3 for a single immigrant, or £5 for a family. These tickets will secure a free passage to the holders, if such can be obtained at the rate of £22 for each adult, which sum Government guarantees.

CAMPBELL TOWN.—Robert Quayle Kermode, Esq., Mona Vale, Ross: returned at general election 1851; was opposed by William Race Allison, Esq., now sitting in the Council as a nominee of the Crown. Result of the poll;—Kermode 139; Allison 77.

CORNWALL.—John Ward Gleadow, Esq., of the firm of Gleadow and Henty, Solicitors, Launceston: was returned without opposition at the general election of 1851.

CUMBERLAND.—William Stanley Sharland, Esq., New Norfolk: returned at general election, by a majority of 39 over Mr. Gellibrand. Sharland 129; Gellibrand 90.

HOBART TOWN.—Thomas Daniel Chapman, Esq., Sunnyside, New Town; and John Dunn, junr., Esq.; returned at general election: contested. Result of the poll—Chapman 817; Dunn, 814; Thomas Young 515. Mr. Dunn left for England in the Antipodes, March 18, 1854, without resigning his seat.

HUON.—Richard Cleburne, Esq., Hobart Town: returned at general election, after a contest. The candidates were Messrs. Cleburne, William Watchorn (since deceased), and John Abbott. Result of the poll—Cleburne, 70; Watchorn, 49; Abbott, 35.

MORVEN.—James Cox, Esq., Clarendon, Evandale: returned at general election; was opposed at the nomination by Mr. Sinclair; but on a poll being taken 137 electors voted for Mr. Cox, whilst Mr. Sinclair polled none.

Rum and all other spirits and strong waters, per gallon, and so on in proportion, with respect only to spirits and strong waters in bottle, for any greater or less quantity than a gallon, not being less than one-eighth part of a gallon, 9s. Wines, in wood, per gallon, 1s. Ditto in bottle, per dozen reputed quart bottles, 4s. Ditto, per dozen reputed pint bottles, 2s. Tobacco, (snuff excepted) and cigars, per lb., 2s. Tea per lb., 3d. Raw sugar and molasses, per cwt., 3s. Refined sugars per cwt. 6s. Coffee 1½d. per lb. Dried fruits, per lb. 1d. Hops per lb, 2d. Malt liquors, in wood, per gallon 2d. Ditto,

in bottle, per dozen reputed quart bottles, 1s. Ditto, per dozen reputed pint bottles, 6d.

Exempt from Duty.—Wines imported or purchased in bond for the use of regimental messes. All articles imported for the use of her Majesty's Government.

Drawbacks—Allowed on sugar, tea, coffee, hops, and currants on not less than £10.

Wharfage Dues.—As fixed by Act 16 Vict., No. 12; Oct. 6, 1852.—For every tun butt, 2s.; pipe or puncheon, 1s.; hogshead, 9d.; barrel, tierce, or quarter cask, 6d.; case, crate, cask, bale, box, trunk, bag, or other package of drapery, ironmongery, glassware, earthenware, stationery, or other goods, millstones, bellows, or other bulky articles, 1s.; case of Geneva, wine, &c., in bottle, small case, keg, bag, and other small packages not otherwise enumerated, chest of tea, 4d.; half-chest or box of tea, 2d.; spades, shovels, forks, frying-pans, brooms, &c., per dozen, 1d.; bushel of grain or malt, 1d.; four-wheeled carriage, £1; two-wheeled carriage 10s.; sugar, coffee, rice, salt, cordage, flax, oakum, iron, steel, lead, or other loose metal, machinery, and other goods not otherwise enumerated, per ton, 3s., and in proportion for each cwt.; coals, per ton 1s.; staves, handspikes, gunstocks, and small pieces of shaped wood, per 100 1s.; table, chest of drawers, or bureau, each, 1s.; chairs or tubs per dozen, 1s.; timber, per load of 50 cubic feet, and so in proportion for every quarter of a load, 2s. All articles for the use of her Majesty's government, and all goods, or merchandise, the produce of this colony, or of the fisheries thereof, as well as all oil and whalebone landed in the colony from any vessel, and all empty casks intended for fisheries, to be exempt from wharfage. Metallic ores landed in the colony for the purpose of smelting are exempted from wharfage dues.

Vessels entering the Port of Launceston, and remaining below Whirlpool Reach, a moiety of the rates only to be paid. Regular traders (only) between Hobart Town and Launceston to any port or ports of New Holland or New Zealand, by producing an exemption certificate from Collector of Customs to the pilots when boarded, are exempt from pilotage. By going out of the above trade, exemption ceases until the Customs renew the certificate. Exemption flag (red pennant above white) to be hoisted six leagues off shore. Outward-bound traders between Hobart Town or Launceston and any place in New South Wales, if employing a pilot, to pay full pilotage rates; or, otherwise, none. Steam vessels one-half of the above rates,

Light Dues, as fixed by Act 16 Vict., No. 12; Oct. 6, 1852. For every vessel employed in the coasting trade, 3d. per ton inwards; for every other vessel, per ton register, 6d.

The vessels of all nations (with which a treaty of commerce with Great Britain subsists) arriving from, or preparing for a whaling voyage, and all vessels sailing in ballast, or putting in for repair, or refreshment, are exempted from all port charges.

Places at which Vessels arriving at Van Diemen's Land shall perform Quarantine.—As per proclamation, June 27, 1839.—Port of Hobart Town.—Between Sandy Bay Point and the eastern side of the Derwent. Sandy Bay Point not to be brought to bear to the northward of west. *Port of Launceston*—Within the inlet on the west side of the Tamar called "Middle Arm," bounded on the eastward by the Middle Island Shoal, and on the north by a line from Inspection Head to a buoy called the "Quarantine Buoy."

Stations at which Vessels are to be searched previous to their departure from the port of Launceston.—As per proclamation, Feb. 22, 1840. Masters of vessels are required to come to an anchor at one of the following stations in the Tamar, to be searched previous to their departure from the port of Launceston; viz.—Townsend Bay, Kelso Bay, George Town Cove, and the White Buoy.

Fees.—Marriage License, £1; Marriage by deputy Registrar, 10s; entering notice of marriage, 2s 6d; certificate for marriage, 1s; search of Register Book, extending over a period not more than one year, 1s. and 6d. additional for every additional year; general search of the indexes of register books, 5s; particular search of ditto, 1s; certified copy of any entry, 2s 6d; ditto, with seal of office, being evidence in any court of justice, 5s; entering name after baptism, 1s; making declaration and registering birth of child, more than six weeks old, 5s; registering places of worship for solemnizing marriages therein, £5. £10 penalty may be recovered on information against occupiers of houses and parents in the colony, for not giving notice of a death within 10 days, and a birth within six weeks; after six months no births can be registered. A fee of 5s. is payable if the registry of a birth is delayed beyond 6 weeks. When notices are sent to the Deputy Registrars, those of birth should contain date of birth, name, trade, or residence of father, maiden name of mother, and sex of child, whose christian name can be entered at a subsequent period on the production of a certificate from the minister who solemnized the rite of baptism, or from the Dep. Registrar who shall have been present when the name was given. Notice of death should contain date of death, name, sex, age, and profession of deceased, and cause of death. All marriages solemnized in the colony since Nov., 1833, are registered in the Gen. Register Office, Hobart Town; and Deputy Registrars issue licences for marriages by dissenting ministers, as well as certificates for marriages, which avoid the publication of banns.

Every School established by the Board or assisted from the funds, is called a "Public School," and is open to inspection by an officer appointed by Government for the purpose, visitors also having free access during the ordinary school hours. Provision is made for religious instruction during one hour in each day; but if the teacher be a Protestant, the children of Roman Catholic parents are not required to attend, unless at the wish of their parents, and *vice versa*. In imparting such religious instruction the Teacher is limited to the use of the scriptures and such books as may have been sanctioned by the Irish Board of Education, or may hereafter be approved by the Colonial Board. The Board, however, are prepared to sanction any arrangement by which the different Ministers of Religion residing in the vicinity of a school may have opportunities of affording religious instruction on particular days to children of their own

denomination, or those whose parents may desire them to be present. Schools of the *first class* will be established in Hobart Town and Launceston, and in other localities where an attendance of 80 children may be calculated on; those of the *second class* will be established in districts where an attendance of not less than 20 children may be calculated upon. Where the number of scholars likely to attend does not amount to 20, the Board will consider the propriety of granting assistance, on the principle of proportioning these grants to the sums locally subscribed. At least one third of the expense of building or renting school-house or master's residence must be defrayed from local sources. The Teachers in Public Schools are appointed by the Board, and classified as under:—First class £150 per annum, second class £120; third class, from £50 to £100. Mistresses and assistant Teachers are paid such salaries as the Board shall determine. Residences are provided by the Board, for the principal teachers. Examinations are to be made at stated times by the Inspector, with the view of testing the qualifications of candidates and promoting deserving teachers. Teachers are empowered to charge scholars, payable in advance, on the following scale:—One child 9d. per week, 2s. 6d. per month, 6s. per quarter;—Two children of the same family, each 7d. per week, 2s. per month, 5s. per quarter;—Three or more, ditto 6d. per week, 1s. 8d. per month, 4s. per quarter. According to the regulations of the Board no grant in aid of building will exceed two thirds of the expence. Where practicable crown land will be given as a site, but when such cannot be obtained, the site must be conveyed to Trustees, one of whom must be an officer of the Government. The trust deed must be submitted to the Board, and must contain a clause declaring “that the land and buildings thereon to which it refers shall be for ever exclusively appropriated for the purposes of the public school of the locality where it is situated; and that such school shall be for ever open to the children of all communions without distinction, and the visits of the Inspector of School or other officers appointed by the Government.” Applications for a building grant must be accompanied by a plan, and certain necessary features in the proposed structure are specified in the regulations. Applications for the establishment of schools must be made according to a printed form, copies of which may be obtained of the Secretary.

The following Regulations came into operation on the 1st November, 1853.

All letters and packets (newspapers alone excepted) posted at any of the post offices of this colony *must* be prepaid by means of adhesive stamps. There are 1d. stamps, and 4d. stamps, which may be procured at the various post-offices throughout the colony, and of the principal booksellers and stationers in Hobart Town and Launceston.

Postage stamps must be affixed upon the outside of all letters or packets above the address written upon them, as by the post-office act no postmaster is bound to take notice of or pass any stamp which may be affixed on any other part of a letter or packet.

Letters and packets intended to be left till called for at the post-office at which they may be posted, or for delivery within the same city or town, must bear a stamp of 1d. for each half-ounce or portion thereof, in weight.

Letters and packets to be forwarded from one part of the colony to another, and ship letters and packets to be transmitted beyond seas, must bear a stamp of the value of 4d. for every half-ounce or portion thereof in weight.

The exact weight of letters and packets to be ascertained before posting them, in order to enable the senders to affix the correct stamps upon each letter or packet; as all such as have not stamps upon them equal to the amount of postage to which they may (according to their weight) respectively be chargeable, are detained at the post-office at which they have been posted.

Daily lists of letters and packets dropped into the letter-boxes of the several post-offices, not bearing the requisite stamps, or insufficient in value, are exhibited on the exterior of the respective post-offices at which they have been posted.*

* Very important that particular attention should be paid to this and the preceding paragraph.

Letters arriving from beyond seas are delivered in Hobart Town, in Launceston and at the several post offices in the interior of the colony free; being, by act of council, exempted from all postage whatsoever.

Affidavits, bankers' parcels, conveyances, deeds, judgments, memorials, proceedings of any court of justice, patterns or samples of merchandize, wills, writs—*marked as such by the sender with his name and address subscribed thereon, and not containing any letter or epistolary communication or intelligence*; and catalogues, magazines, pamphlets, periodicals, price currents, proceedings of parliament, proceedings of colonial legislature, reviews, votes of parliament, votes of colonial legislature—*marked as above, and not containing any letter or epistolary communication or intelligence, and open at each end*,—must bear a stamp of the value of 6d. for each 4 ozs. or portion thereof in weight.

Packets of books, charts, maps, music, placards, and prospectuses when forwarded from one part of the colony to another, or when posted at Hobart Town or Launceston for transmission to places beyond the seas, must bear stamps to the value of 6d. for every 4 ozs. or portion thereof in weight; and when posted at any of the post-offices in the interior of the colony to be forwarded beyond sea, they must bear stamps to the value of one shilling for each 4 ozs. or portion thereof in weight—6d. being the inland rate of postage, and the additional 6d. the ship packet rate.

Letters and packets may be registered at the option of the senders; but all such must bear stamps to the value of one shilling as the registration fee, exclusive of the amount of stamps required for postage according to weight. Letters or packets which are intended for the East or West Indies, and other warm climates, should not be sealed with wax, unless it has been prepared for the purpose.

Seamen and soldiers while they are employed in her Majesty's service can send or receive letters, not exceeding half an ounce in weight, on their own private concerns only, at the rate of one penny each, if superscribed and forwarded in conformity with the 14th clause of the post-office act, 1853, the penny being prepaid by an adhesive stamp.

Newspapers are forwarded, free of postage, if enclosed either separately or in covers open at each end—provided they do not contain any printing, writing, or thing other than the newspaper.

HOBART TOWN AND LAUNCESTON.

Mails to and from Hobart Town and Launceston, and the post offices between these towns, are made up and delivered daily.

The letter-box at the general post-office, Hobart Town, is open for prepaid letters by means of adhesive stamps (and franked letters) till half-past six p.m.; and the window for "too late" letters and newspapers until fifteen minutes past seven, on payment of four pence in money on each letter, and for newspapers one half-penny each copy, as perquisites of the five senior clerks.

The letter-carriers deliver letters within the limits of the city of Hobart Town three times in each day, starting from the general post-office at nine o'clock in the morning, or as soon after as the mails can be opened and the letters, &c., assorted, and at one and four o'clock p.m.

The letter carriers perambulate their several beats every evening (Sundays excepted) from 5 to 6 o'clock ringing bells, in order to collect such letters and newspapers as the inhabitants of Hobart Town and its suburbs may be desirous of sending per post whether inland or ship letters,—but the postage on both these descriptions of letters must be prepaid by stamps, and the letter carriers are authorised to demand the sum of one penny on each letter and one half-penny on each newspaper, which they collect as their perquisite.

Letter carriers are invariably to wear their livery when on duty, and the public are particularly requested to put their letters into the carriers' bags themselves, taking care that the necessary stamps to cover the postage have been placed upon each letter.

The general post-office, Hobart Town, is open to the public from 9 o'clock a.m. or as soon as the sorting of the morning mails is completed, until half-past 6 p.m. daily; but applications for registered, unclaimed, or dead letters must be made between the hours of 10 o'clock a.m. and 5 p.m. Unclaimed letters of the current month are delivered at the windows but applications for *Dead Letters*, or unclaimed letters which arrived previously to the current months must be made at the unclaimed and dead letter offices up stairs—first door in the right entrance in Collins Street. Applications for Registered Letters must be made at the Stamp Sale Room—entrance in Collins Street between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Receiving houses are visited at 10 o'clock a.m., and 1 and 4 p.m., when all letters found there are brought to the general post-office for distribution.

Subscribers of one guinea per annum are entitled to have private boxes, and obtain their letters at a separate delivery window; but otherwise no resident within the city or its suburbs is permitted to direct his letters to be left at the post-office till called for, nor to obtain them earlier. The delivery of letters by the carriers and at the office window commences at the same time.

or put into any of the receiving houses intended for delivery within the limits of the city, must bear a stamp of the value of 1d. for every half oz. or portion thereof in weight.

The hours for the several daily deliveries by letter carriers, and the instructions with reference to those at Hobart apply to the men attached to the Launceston post-office in like manner, excepting that they perambulate their beats from 3 to 4 o'clock p.m., as the mails are made up from Launceston at 5 p.m. daily.

Each letter sent through the post office Launceston, and intended for delivery within the limits of the town, must bear a stamp of the value of 1d.; for every half oz. or portion thereof in weight.

The mails for George Town are dispatched twice a week; viz. Wednesday and Saturday, at 12 o'clock. Letters are taken in, until 15 minutes before 12.

Mails for Longford and Bishopsbourne are made up four days in the week, viz., Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, at 4 o'clock, p.m. Letters are taken in until 15 minutes before 5 o'clock, on payment of 4d.

Mails for Carrick, Deloraine and Westbury, are dispatched daily, at half past 2 o'clock, p.m.

Mails for Evandale are dispatched daily at 5 o'clock, p.m.

Mails for Port Sorell are dispatched once a week ; viz. Wednesdays, at half-past 2 o'clock, and are forwarded by the Westbury coach.

Nor can any action be brought in the same court, where the matter in question relates to the title of any lands, tenements or hereditaments, or (unless by the consent of the attorney-general) to the taking of any duty to her Majesty, or for any fee of office, or to any annual rent due her Majesty, or such matter where rights in future may be bound, or to any general right or duty.

JURORS AND JURIES.—*Regulated by act, 5, Wm. 4, No. 11, Nov 5, 1834; amended by act 4 Vict., No. 14, Sept. 15, 1840; and by Nos. 31 and 33, Nov 4 and 5 same year.*—Every man, between 21 and 60 (except exempt) is liable to serve as a juror whether common or special, under the following qualifications:—1. Having within this island or its dependencies in his own name, or in trust for him, in land or other real estate to the value of £60 by the year; or, 2—in real and personal estate together to the value of £80, by the year; or, 3—Shall be tenant of any house, if in Hobart Town or Launceston, at a yearly rental of £75; or, if in any other part of the colony, at a yearly rental of 50*l.*

Exemptions.—Judges, chairman of quarter sessions, ministerial officers of supreme court and quarter sessions, members of council, commissioners of caveat board, surveyor-general, director of public works, clergymen, Roman Catholic priests, dissenting ministers, officers in navy or army on full pay, police or assistant police magistrates, principal superintendent of convicts, assistant colonial secretary, clerk of councils, private secretary, coroners, officers' of customs, sheriff's officers, gaolers, practising barristers and attorneys physicians, surgeons, and apothecaries, and such public officers as the governor may, from time to time, think fit to exempt from sitting on juries.

For the trial of civil issues no special juror who resides above 25 miles, nor any common juror who resides more than 10 miles distance from the place of trial shall be summoned. In criminal cases all jurors, whether special or common, whose residence is not more than 25 miles may be summoned. Penalty for non attendance not less than £2 nor more than £10.

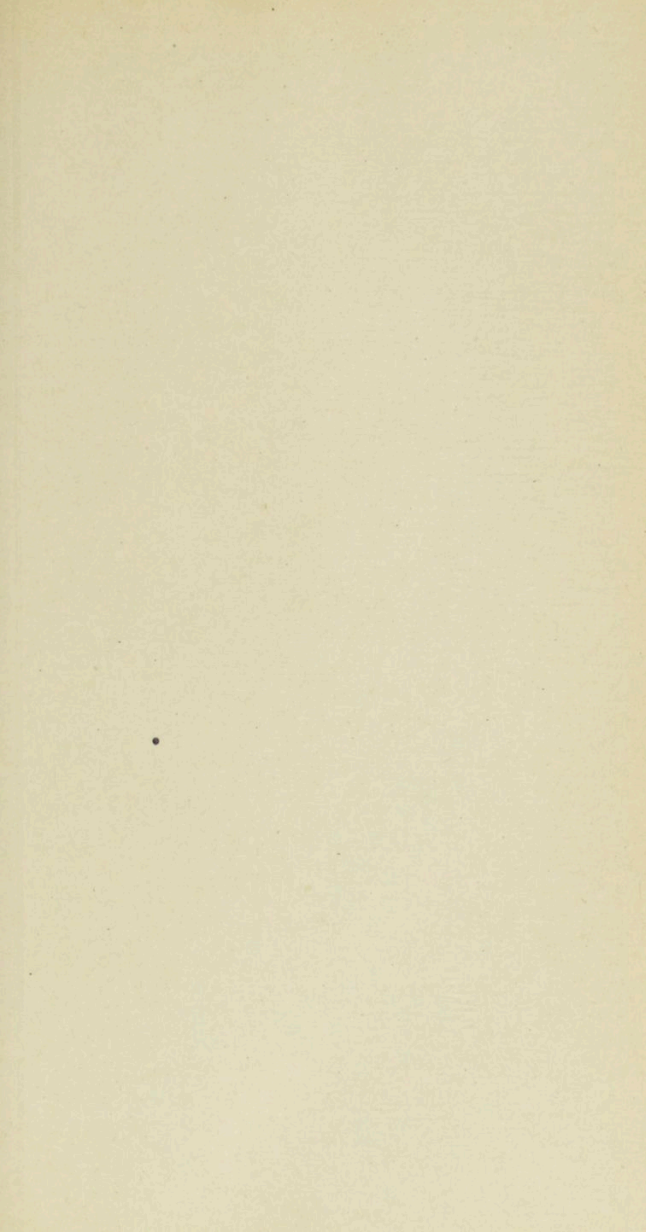

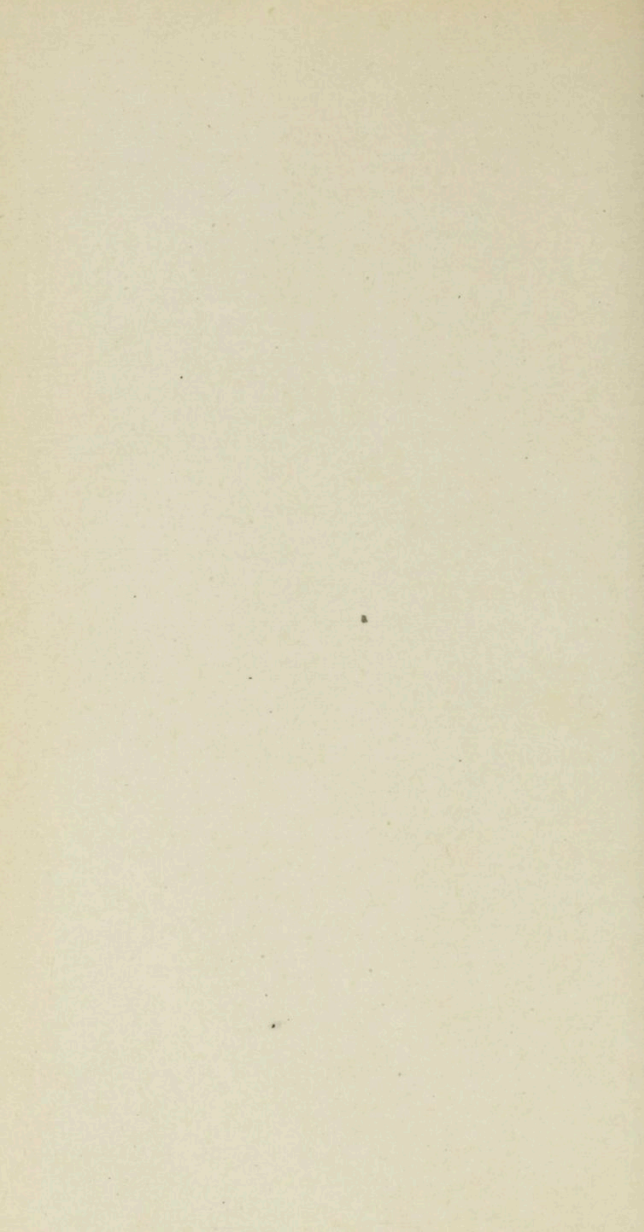

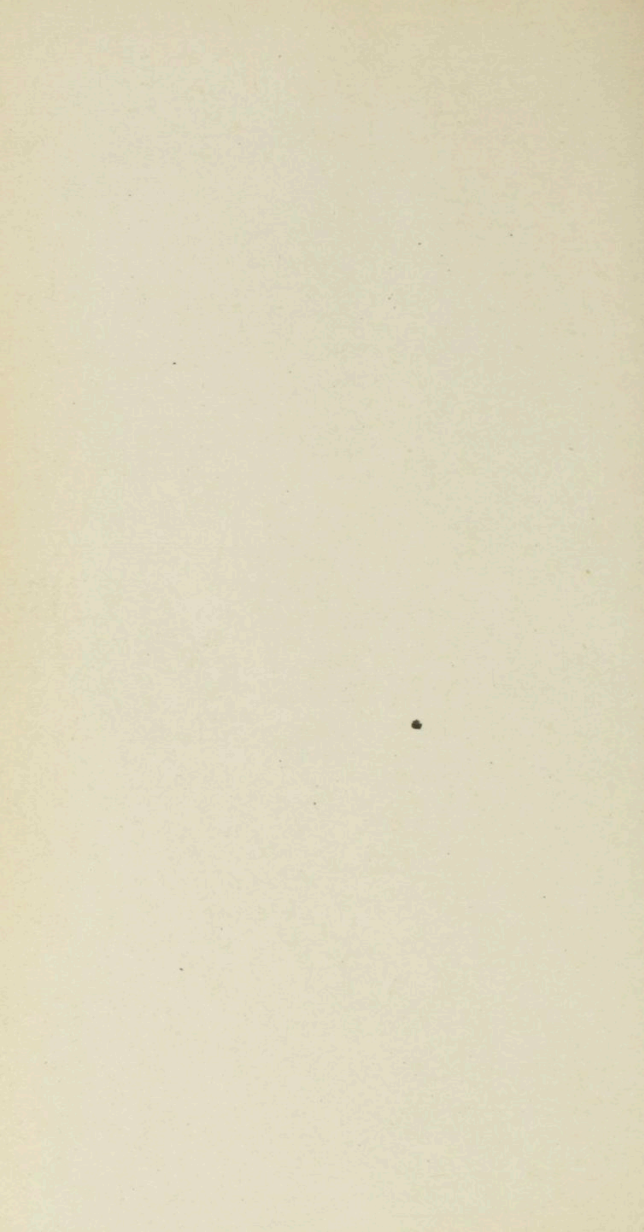

WAREHOUSE RENT—Under the Act passed this year the Lieut.-Governor has proclaimed in the Gazette the scale of charges for receiving, issuing, and warehousing of bonded goods, as follows:—For every pipe butt or piece, charges for receiving and issuing 3s, rate of rent per week, 7d; puncheon above 60 gallons 2s 6d and 6d; hogsheads containing 60 gallons and under, 2s and 4d; barrel or quarter cask 30 gallons and under, 1s and 2d; keg or cask of wine or spirits 6d and 1d; case containing 6 gallons and above 4d and 1d; case under 6 gallons 2d and 1d; hogshead of tobacco 5s and 8d; tierce ditto above 4 cwt 2s and 4d; half tierce 4 cwt and under 1s 6d and 3d; keg 6d and 1d; case 6d and 2d; small case 3d and 1d; case cigars to 10,000 1s and 2d: ditto to 20,000 2s and 4d; ton of sugar and coffee in bags and baskets 5s and 6d; hogshead refined sugar 3s and 9d; tierce ditto 2s and 4d; barrel 9d and 2d; pocket of hops 6d and 2d; carotol dried fruit 1s and 4d; barrel or package ditto 4d and 2d; chest of tea 3d and 1d; and for every smaller package of tea in same proportion.
