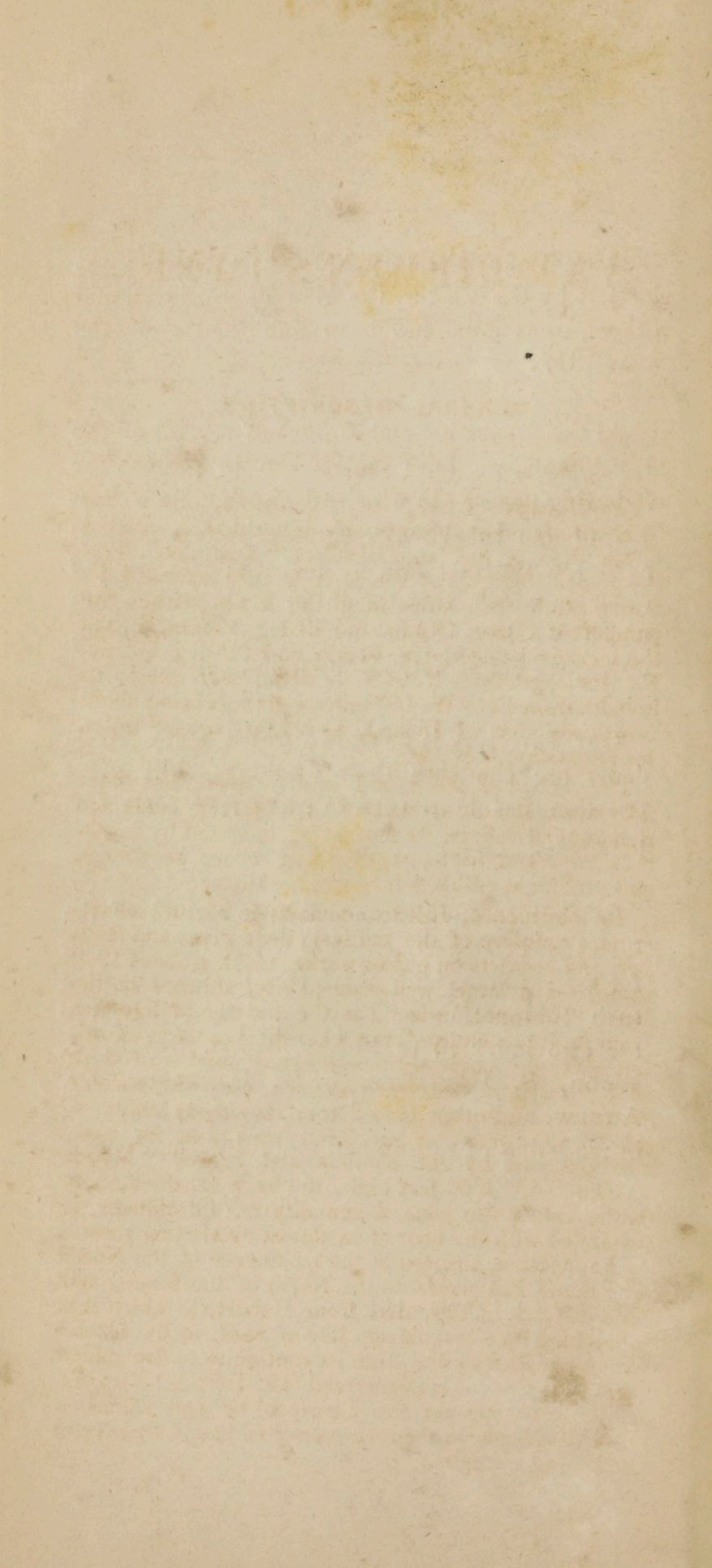
Our Directory is published whilst many Residents are changing their dwellings, but great exertion has been used to make it as correct as possible.

VAN DIEMEN'S LAND.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

"VAN DIEMEN'S LAND," or "Tasmania," as it has been latterly more appropriately designated, is situated to the S. E. of the large island of "Australia," from the golden treasures of which it is only separated by Bass's Strait, 180 miles in girth; it lies within the parallels of 41 deg. 18 min. and 43 deg. 42 min. S., and the meridians of 144 deg. 40 min. and 148 deg. 20 min. E. Its length from N. to S. is about 200 miles; its breadth from E. to W. 150 miles,—its area being about two-thirds that of Ireland, or 24,000 square miles. Its population is 80,000.

The surface of the island is diversified, but generally mountainous, abounding in lofty table-lands and rich alluvial valleys, its shores are indented by numerous bays and harbours, affording secure anchorage, and prolific in edible fish of various kinds.

Its Metropolis, Hobart, containing 23,107 inhabitants, (exclusive of the military, their wives and families, and convicts on public works, making about 1200 more)—is a large, well-planned city, situated on the River "Derwent," which, at the distance of 20 miles from its embouchure, forms a beautiful estuary, affording safe and ample anchorage to any number of ships of any burthen. Gently rising hills, clad with a livery of perennial green, ascend from its sloping terraces, dotted by church and mill tower, which, on the west, are canopied by the sublime and rugged "Mount Wellington," 4000 feet high, the brow of which, notwithstanding the general geniality of the climate, is encircled with the hoar of an almost everlasting snow.

Launceston, situated at the confluence of the North and South Esk rivers, to the North of the Island, and at a distance of 120 miles from Hobart, to which it is conjoined by a magnificent line of road, is the second commercial city; and from its contiguity to the golden shores of the newly-discovered "El Dorado" Victoria, is likely to become the Liverpool of Van Diemen's Land, bridged, as the intervening frith is, by powerful and rapid steamers.

The geological features of the island are varied, basalt being the principal stratum, limestone and coal are the only minerals yet brought into general use; although marble, iron, copper, silver, and even gold, are known to exist. The soil is generally very fertile, varying from the rich black vegetable mould to the argillaceous or sandy.

Its climate is pleasant and salubrious, and particularly suited to the constitutions of Europeans. Its "Flora," is beautiful and singular, embracing numerous varieties; its trees are of gigantic size, the timber they afford being well calculated for ship and house-building—particularly the "blue gum."

All vegetables and fruits known and cultivated in the "British Isles" are raised without difficulty, in the highest perfection; and every kind of grain thrives well and yields abundantly.

Its Aborigines, formerly very numerous and troublesome to the early settlers, dazzled by the light of a too hastily introduced civilization, are, as a race, effete and extinct,—a few individuals of either sex being now under the humane superintendence of the local government at Oyster Cove.

The Government of Van Diemen's Land consists of a Lieutenant-Governor and an Executive and Legislative Council. The Executive Council is composed of persons filling the highest official positions, all of whom are appointed by the Home Government. The Legislative Council 24 Members, two-thirds of whom are elected by popular suffrage under the lately extended Constitution, have now in their own hands social and commercial amelioration,—and the rapid progress of the colony has thus an earnest of accomplishment.

HISTORY.

"VAN DIEMEN'S LAND" was among the discoveries of the 17th century, an age more prolific than any other in geographical revelations,—having been first made known by Abel Jansen Tasman, a Dutch navigator, who visited it in the course of an eastward voyage from the Isle of France, in search of a great Southern Continent. Sailing in a southerly direction, he first sighted land about the middle of its western coast, near Point Hibbs; and having rounded the South West and South Capes, entered the large gulf into which the sparkling waters of the since-named Derwent flow,—this he called Storm Bay. He then rounded the peninsula, and on the 1st December, 1642, anchored in a bay named Frederick Hendrick Bay. On the subsequent day, he dispatched two armed boats to an inner bay, now North Bay, and landed on its strand, taking formal

possession of the country in the name of the Prince of Orange, then ruler of Holland. Little, however, was revealed by this visit, of the condition, manners, and customs of its barbarous inhabitants, although they are stated to have been very numerous, amounting to many thousands. About 180 years subsequently, Captain Mario, the Commander of a French exploring Corvette, visited the island in quest of a land, the middle of which was said to be of gold,—a supposition, vague and fabulous as it must then have been, strangely prophetic of those golden treasures lately disclosed in the continent of Australia. Having anchored in Hendrick Bay, this navigator tried to enter into friendly intercourse with the natives, but without avail; they could not be induced to accept his proffered presents, nor to reciprocate his friendly advances; they are represented by him as of warlike appearance, entirely destitute of clothing—the children being fastened to their mother's backs by bark or rush bands. The island was afterwards visited by Furneaux, and the illustrious "Cook," who gave names to many of the bays and capes on the southern and eastern coasts. To the description given by the latter, of its fine climate, verdant appearance, and evident fertility, may be ascribed its subsequent possession by the British.

In 1803, the island was formally taken possession of by a small detachment under Capt. Bowen, who having arrived from Sydney, selected Ridsden as the site of the future metropolis. In the following year, Colonel, afterwards Lieutenant-Governor Collins, followed with a considerable expedition, having in vain attempted to form a settlement at Port Phillip, who, after many surveys, selected the present site of Hobart Town, named after Lord Hobart, then Secretary for the Colonies. The progress of the Colony is highly creditable to its early settlers, and to those whose high destiny it has been to guide their energies, and to direct its administration. From its settlement in 1804 to the present day, a period of less than fifty years, many men of high qualification, both governmental and legislative, have guided the Vice-Regal car, among which the names of Collins, Sorell, and Arthur stand conspicuous—the first of whom found it an unproductive desert, incapable of producing any of the necessaries of life, its few European inhabitants being entirely dependent on foreign supplies. At his death, in 1810, the government successively reverted to three *locum tenentes*—Lieutenant Edward Lord, Capt. Murray, and Colonel Geils. About this time, ten years from its first occupation, the importance and value of the colony began to develop itself, and it now began to bear the impress of British industry. Land was brought into cultivation, houses were built, the sites of towns selected, farms enclosed, and the star of civilisation arose to illumine a territory before dark as extreme barbarism could make it. The year 1816 is memorable as first yielding

enough and to spare, as then corn was first exported, and the first bale of wool transmitted to England. It is also to be recorded, that in this year whales were first caught in the Derwent, a branch of commerce being thus introduced that deserves to be considered one of the most vital resources of the Colony.

On the arrival of Colonel Sorell in 1817, he found the island emerging from its infant state, and ministered to its increasing energies with consummate address. He repressed social disturbances of the most alarming character, invoked the spirit of order and discipline, and thus relieved the inhabitants of a solicitude that had well nigh suspended their industrial efforts. He projected the magnificent line of road that now connects the metropolis with Launceston—a work of the utmost importance, and a memorial more eulogistic than human praise. Van Diemen's Land, about this time, began to be spoken of in the mother land, as a spot towards which the stream of emigration might be successfully directed,—intercommunication with New South Wales, her elder sister colony, tending much to promulgate her beautiful climate and numerous resources. The Law sent its representatives, Religion its apostles, Education its emissaries, Trade its artizans, Commerce its merchants; Banks were founded, Distilleries and Breweries erected, Churches built, Public and Private Institutions established; and the towns of Hobart and Launceston began to assume the appearance of English cities of older growth; while, by the Government, roads were formed, bridges built, and all that an earnest, but physically feeble hand could do to avert evil and do good was energetically effected. All seemed, at this period, the work of enchantment; prospective wealth and affluence dazzled all eyes, everything was invested with the crimson and gold of an adventitious prosperity, and a recklessness was induced calculated to retard materially the onward progress of the Colony. Allured by high prices and great profits, enterprise gave place to the maddening spirit of agrarian and commercial gambling; estates were mortgaged, credit risked, and an almost universal bankruptcy ensued. The face of society, stripped of its false colours, has since assumed the more placid expression of industry and persevering labour. Thus was the foundation of the social edifice laid, and by these early reverses was its solidity tested.

It is needless, in this merely descriptive outline, to trace farther the very rapid development of its numerous resources; it is rendered sufficiently apparent by the following "Decennial Tabula"—which evidence a progression in civilisation, morals, and commerce unexampled in the history of communities, save in the sister Colonies of Australia—now the veritable marvel of the nineteenth century, and the proudest monument of successful colonisation:—

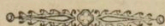

The Mails to and from Hobart Town and Launceston,
and the several Post Offices, on the main line of road
between these towns arrive and depart daily.

The Mails from Hobart Town are dispatched at half-
past 7 o'clock, P. M. precisely, and arrive at Launceston on
the following mornings respectively at half-past 10 o'clock,
excepting those of Saturday evenings, which are forwarded
by Coach, on Sundays, at 6 a. m., and the letters and
newspapers delivered at Launceston about 9 o'clock, a. m.,
on Mondays.

The Letter-box at the General Post Office is open for
unpaid Letters, and the window for prepaid Letters, every
evening till half-past 6 o'clock; and the latter, on pay-
ment of an additional single rate of Postage, (viz. four-
pence) on each letter, until fifteen minutes past 7.

Newspapers, to be forwarded by the same Evening's
Mail, must be posted before 6 o'clock: they are, however,
received until half-past 6, on payment of one half-penny
for each copy.

* Letters for Great Swan Port, are transmitted to Waterloo Point twice a-week; but from Waterloo Point to Great Swan Port, on Thursdays only.

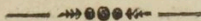
Mails for Norfolk Island, are made up at Hobart Town as opportunities offer.

Cambridge, Eastern Marshes, Grove (Huon Road), Leipzig, Muddy Plains, Rokeby, Tinder-box Bay, Barnes' Bay, and Trumpeter Bay, are merely Receiving Houses, attached to other Post Offices.

Hobart Town, Launceston, George Town, Circular Head, and Norfolk Island are the only post offices under the Government of V. D. L. at which the postmasters are empowered to make up and forward, and to receive and open foreign mails.

Ship Mails for New South Wales, South Australia, Victoria, Western Australia, New Zealand, Cape of Good Hope, Mauritius, Sandwich Islands, South Sea Islands, India, China, California, North America, Great Britain, and the Continent of Europe are despatched as opportunities offer.

Ship Letters posted at Hobart Town and Launceston respectively, under $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz. in weight, are charged 4d.; $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and under 1 oz., 8d.; 1 oz., and under $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz., 1s.; and 4d. extra for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. If addressed to, or sent from, a Post Office beyond the limits of Hobart Town or Launceston, they are chargeable with an extra penny each beyond these rates. All Ship Letters are required to be pre-paid.



HOBART TOWN DISTRICT POST.

(FORMERLY KNOWN AS THE TWOPENNY POST.)

Each letter sent through the post office of Hobart Town, or put into any of the Receiving Houses, intended for delivery within the boundaries of the City, under $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz., are charged, 2d.; $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz. and under 1 oz., 4d.; 1 oz. and under $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz., 6d.; and so on in proportion for each additional $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

No Letters can be pre-paid at any of the Receiving Houses for the present.

No Letters to be sent beyond Sea can be posted at any of the Receiving Houses, as the Postage on all such Letters must be prepaid.

Collection of Letters by Letter Carriers every Evening.

The Letter-Carriers perambulate their several beats every evening (Sunday excepted) *from Five to Six o'clock*, ringing bells, in order to collect such Letters and Newspapers as the inhabitants of Hobart Town and its suburbs may be desirous of sending per Post, *whether Inland or Ship Letters*; the former may be forwarded either unpaid or prepaid at the option of the sender, *but the latter must in every case be pre-paid.*

The Letter-Carriers are authorised to demand the sum of One Penny on each Letter over and above the rate of Postage, and One Half-penny on each Newspaper.

The Letter-Carriers are provided with Letter-Bags with two divisions, which are carefully locked; one division for depositing therein unpaid Letters, the other pre-paid Letters: but those parties who may pre-pay their Letters are requested to see that the Letter-Carriers mark the amount of Postage paid upon them in red, for which purpose they are provided with pencils, and that they put them into the pre-paid division of their Letter-Bags.

Letters directed to the interior of the Colony are collected and brought to the General Post Office at the same time as those intended for the Hobart Town District Post, and forwarded to their respective destinations by the first Mail; viz. to the Post Offices on the main line of road between Hobart Town and Launceston, the same evening; to New Norfolk, the next morning (excepting on Tuesdays and Fridays, when they are sent the same evening); Brown's River and Richmond, daily; other Post Offices on the Branch Roads, every Tuesday and Friday evening.

Postage Accounts.

A fee of Ten Shillings per quarter is charged to those Establishments who have Quarterly Accounts at the General Post Office; and all parties who do not make arrangements for accounts to be opened cannot be allowed any credit whatever; and must, therefore, provide themselves with the cash to pay their postage at the time of posting or receiving their letters, &c.

Registered Letters.

All Letters which the senders may require to be registered must be posted at the window of the several Post Offices; and a Registration Fee of six-pence each, in addition to the ordinary rates of postage, is charged on every such Letter, which must be pre-paid by the sender.

It is, however, to be distinctly understood that neither the Government nor the Post Office are in any way liable for the contents of Money or Registered Letters; the practice, therefore, of cutting notes, orders, cheques, &c. in halves, and not sending the second halves until the first have been acknowledged, is strongly recommended to be invariably adopted.

Re-directed Letters.—Letters re-directed from one post station to another are charged with extra postage; thus a letter on which postage to the first post station is “pre-paid” is charged with a single rate (if a single letter) to the station to which it is re-directed, and, if “unpaid,” to the first post station, to a double rate on its being transmitted to the place of its second address, excepting letters directed to officers of the army or navy, or civil officers in H. M. service when travelling on duty, which are subject to the first rate of postage only.

Undelivered Letters.—Letters undelivered in consequence of the parties to whom they are addressed being “dead,” “refusing them,” or “gone away not known where,” are returned to Gen. P. Office by the next post to that by which they are received; but if the cause arise from the parties “not being known,” “not to be found in the district,” or “not called for,” they are retained until the end of the quarter, and then returned to the Postmaster-General.

Money Letters.—Letters marked “money letter,” or “registered letter,” should always be delivered at the window of a post office, whether unpaid or pre-paid, and the party posting them is required to sign the book in which such letters are registered.

Anonymous Letters.—The postage charged on anonymous letters can be recovered on application to the Postmaster-General. Printed circulars are not considered anonymous.

Official Letters.—All official letters sent to parties entitled to receive letters “on public service only” free of postage, are nevertheless charged postage unless they are distinctly marked “on the public service only,” and the signature of the party sending them written underneath those words.

Letters once posted not given back.—Letters when put into any post office immediately become the property of the party to whom they are addressed, and cannot be given back to the writer excepting under the written warrant of the Lieutenant-Governor.

Names of Post Stations.—Every letter and newspaper put into any post office should bear on part of its address the name of the post station to which it is desired that it should be sent, and should be fully and legibly addressed and posted *as early as convenient*.

Articles which may not be sent by Post.—Letters or packets cannot be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by the post offices, containing any of the following enclosures, viz.,—any glass or glass bottle; any razor, scissors, knife, fork, or other sharp or pointed instrument; any leeches, game, fish, flesh, fruit, vegetables, or other perishable substance; any bladder or other vessel containing liquid, or any article, matter or thing whatsoever which might, by pressure or otherwise, be rendered injurious to the officers of the post office, or to the contents of the mail bags. The Act of Parliament for the regulation of the duties of postage expressly directs that no letter shall be sent by post containing any explosive or other dangerous materials or substance.

Soldiers' and Sailors' letters, when received in Great Britain from ports beyond the seas, without the postage of a 1d. being pre-paid, (the present restriction to $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz. in weight remaining in full force) are subject to a rate of 2d. only. Soldiers' and sailors' letters are not liable to any addtl. postage on re-direction, and when sent from or received in Great Britain by private ships, are liable to the ship-letter gratuities in addition to the postage.

The Inland rates of postage are uniform, viz., 4d. under $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz.; $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz. and under 1 oz., 8d.; 1 oz. and under $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz., 1s.; and 4d. for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., without regard to distance.

District Posts.—A District Post for letters or packets to be left till called for, is established at every Post Office throughout the colony; the rate of postage being the same as at Hobart Town and Launceston.

Letters viâ India.—Rates of Postage.—If specially addressed viâ Marseilles, weighing under $\frac{1}{4}$ an oz. 2s. 2d.; under $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz. 2s. 7d.; under $\frac{3}{4}$ of an oz. 4s. 9d.; under 1 oz. 5s. 2d.; under $1\frac{1}{4}$ oz. 9s. 1d. If viâ Southampton—under $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz. 1s. 4d.; under 1 oz. 2s. 8d., above 1 oz. 5s. 4d.; and so on. These rates are payable in England by the parties receiving the letters.

The greatest care should be taken by parties posting Letters and Newspapers to be forwarded viâ India, to mark upon them the route by which they desire them to be transmitted, viz., viâ Marseilles, or viâ Southampton, as the case may be.

Newspapers when sent viâ Southampton will be liable to a charge of 2d. each; and viâ Marseilles 5d. each.

Letters not to be sealed with Wax.—The practice of sealing Letters passing to and from the East and West Indias, and other warm climates, with wax, is attended with much inconvenience, and frequently with serious injury to the letters, in consequence of the melting of the wax, and adhesion of the letters to each other. In the case of Mails transmitted viâ India, considerable delay is occasioned, and, notwithstanding the greatest care is taken in separating the letters, which, owing to the course already mentioned, adhere closely together, many are much damaged and torn. The public are, therefore, strongly recommended, in all cases, to use wafers in preference to wax in securing their letters sent to India, or to other parts of the world when they must of necessity pass through warm climates: and, also, to advise their correspondents to pursue the same course.

The mails from Launceston are dispatched every afternoon at 5 o'clock, and arrive at Hobart Town every morning at 8 o'clock, excepting those of Saturday evenings, which are forwarded by Sunday mornings coach, and delivered at Hobart Town about 9 o'clock, A.M. on Mondays.

The Letter-box at the Launceston Post Office is open for the receipt of Unpaid Letters, and the window for Pre-paid Letters, every afternoon till 4 o'clock, excepting on Saturdays, when the Unpaid box is open until 7 o'clock, and the window for Pre-paid Letters till 5 o'clock. On payment of an additional rate of postage (viz. four-pence each letter), the window is open for the receipt of "too-late Letters" every afternoon till 45 minutes past 4, excepting on Saturdays, when it re-opens for the receipt of this description of Letters at 7 o'clock, and remains open until 45 minutes past 7.

The Launceston Post Office, on Saturdays, is closed from 5 to 7 o'clock, P.M.

Newspapers to be forwarded by the same afternoon's mail, must be posted at the Launceston Post Office before 4 o'clock, excepting on Saturdays, when they are received until 5 o'clock: they are, however, received until half-past 4, and on Saturdays from 7 to half-past 7 o'clock, on payment of one half-penny for each copy.

Each Letter sent through the Post Office of Launceston, and intended for delivery within the limits of the Town, under $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz. are charged 2d.; $\frac{1}{2}$ an oz. and under 1 oz. 4d.; 1 oz. and under $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. 6d.; and 2d. for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

The hours at which district letters or packets (not being newspapers) are sent out for delivery at Launceston, are 10 a. m., and 1 and 4 p. m., daily (Sundays excepted.)

FRANKING LETTERS.

All letters, &c., addressed to the Lieutenant-Governor, or the Private Secretary, whether marked "on public service" or not, and also all letters bearing the Signature of His Excellency or the Private Secretary, pass free of all postage whatever.

The following is a list of the Public Officers in Van Diemen's Land, who are authorised to frank and receive letters free of charge, by virtue of their offices, "on the public service only," unlimited in number and weight, provided that every letter or parcel has the words "on public service only" written upon its face, with the signature of the sender underneath these words:—

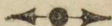

No. 5 ; August 4, 1838*—For every tun or butt, 2s. ; pipe or puncheon, 1s ; hogshead, 9d ; barrel, 6d ; cask or keg of small size, 3d ; crate, cask, or case of earthenware, hardware, or ironmongery, bale, case, or box of woollen, linen, cotton, haberdashery, slops, wine, &c., 9d ; chest of tea, 4d ; half chest or box, 2d ; bag of sugar or coffee, package of rice, or basket of tobacco, 3d ; bag of hops, 1s ; pocket of hops, 6d ; bushel of grain or flour, 1d ; dozen of oars, 2d ; deals per 100, 3s ; staves per ditto, 1s ; spades and shovels per dozen, 1d ; ton of iron, steel, lead, or other metal, including shot, 3s ; salt and potatoes per ton, 1s 6d ; flax and coal per ton, 1s ; cordage per ton, 2s 6d ; paint-oil or turpentine, per jar, keg, case or bottle, 2d ; mill-stones each, 2s ; four-wheeled carriage, £1 ; two-wheeled carriage, 10s ; small package not otherwise enumerated, 3d ; ton of heavy goods, not otherwise enumerated, 3s ; horse or mare, 7s 6d ; cedar by the log, plank or board, 1d. All goods or merchandise the produce of Van Diemen's Land, or of the fisheries thereof, as well as all the oil and whalebone landed in the colony from any British vessels, and all empty casks intended for the fisheries, to be exempted from wharfage.

TONNAGE DUES.—Sixpence for every registered ton of each vessel arriving from ports beyond the sea at any port in this colony where an officer of the customs is or shall be stationed. Vessels *bonâ fide* putting in for refreshments, repairs, or instructions only, or from stress of weather, and shall not in fact break bulk, or trade within such port, are exempt from tonnage duties ; and where any vessel (having *bonâ fide* put in for any such cause as aforesaid only) shall merely trade for the sole purpose of defraying her necessary expenses within the colony, it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor to direct the tonnage duty to be remitted in such case also, if he shall judge it expedient so to do.

Vessels using the steam boats are only charged half the above rates.

Vessels certified by the customs as being regular traders for two months between Van Diemen's Land and any place in New South Wales, are exempt from pilotage, excepting only in such cases where the master requires the services of a pilot, and when he is employed accordingly.

Into or out of any other port the same rate as Hobart Town.

Vessels of foreign powers included in any treaty of commerce with Great Britain and Ireland, arriving and bonding oil or whalebone at Hobart Town for exportation only, to be exempt from all wharfage and other dues, except harbour dues.

Vessels of all nations engaged in the whale fishery, or arriving and sailing in ballast, or which may not break bulk, or only to such an extent as may be necessary to provide funds for the repairs, refittings, or refreshments required, are exempt from all port charges or lights dues whatsoever, except pilotage in certain cases.

Harbour Masters are entitled to receive one penny per register ton of every vessel arriving in any port in this colony, (not being employed in coasting only) for mooring or unmooring the said vessels.

SIGNALS AT MULGRAVE BATTERY.

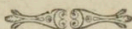
INSTRUCTIONS FOR SIGNALS.

When a sail is in sight, and from the southward, a white flag with a red cross (the same as the C. G. Hope) is hoisted at the top-mast head at Mulgrave Battery; if from the east, a blue and white flag (same as Sydney); if in mid channel, a yellow, blue, and yellow flag (the same as Ireland); when it is ascertained what the vessel is, the flag is hauled down from the top-mast, and a ball is affixed to one of the numbers on the yard-arm.

No. 1 on the right, viewed from the town, denotes a ship or barque; 2 on the right, a brig; 3 on the left, a brigantine or schooner; 4 on the left a steamer.

When it is discovered from whence the vessel sailed, a descriptive flag will be hoisted in lieu of the ball.

When two or more ships, brigs, schooners, or sloops, are coming in from the same place, a white flag pierced with red, is hoisted under the flag.



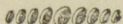
HOLIDAYS AT THE BANKS AND INSURANCE OFFICES IN HOBARTON.

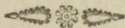

£10 penalty may be recovered on information against parents and occupiers of houses in the colony for not giving notice of a death within 10 days, and a birth within 6 weeks ; after 6 months no births can be registered. A fee of 5s. is payable if the registry of a birth is delayed beyond six weeks. When notices are sent, those of birth should contain date of birth, name, trade or profession, and residence of father, maiden and surname of mother, and sex of child ; whose Christian name may be added to the entry at a subsequent period, after baptism. Notice of death should contain date of death, sex, age, name, rank or profession of deceased, and cause of death.

All marriages solemnized in the colony since November, 1838, are registered in Hobart Town from the returns of the officiating ministers ; and Deputy Registrars may issue licences for marriage by dissenting ministers, as well as certificates of marriage notice, which are in lieu of the publication of banns.

POUND RATES.

As fixed by Act 11, Geo. 4, No. 3, March 13, 1830.

For each entire horse above the age of 12 months, 2s. 6d. ; mare, gelding, colt, filly, foal, mule, ass, goat, or pig, 1s. ; bull above the age of 12 months, 2s. 6d. ; ox, cow, steer, heifer, or calf, for the first 10, 6d. ; next 10, 1d. ; next 30, 3d. ; all others above 50, 1d. ; ram above the age of 9 months, 1s. ; ewe, wether, lamb, first 20, 2d. ; next 30, 1½d. ; next 50, 1d. ; all others above 100, ½d.

The above fees to be paid for each day, or part of a day, during which the animal is kept in pound.

For every horse, mare, gelding, mule, ass, or colt, filly, or foal, 6d. ; bull, cow, steer, or heifer, 3d. ; calf under 6 months, 1d. ; sheep or lamb, ½d. ; goat, 1d. ; boar, sow, and other pig, 3d.

The above charges are to be paid for each day, or part of a day, during which the animal is supplied with food and water by the pound-keeper ; but the owner may supply food and water, in which case these charges are not to be made.

JURORS AND JURIES.

Regulated by Act 5, Wm. 4, No. 11, 5th Nov. 1834 ; amended by Act 4, Vict., No. 14, 13th Sept. 1840 ; and by Nos. 31 and 33, 4th and 5th Nov., same year.

Every man, between 21 and 60, (except exempt) is liable to serve as a juror, whether common or special, under the following qualifications :—1. Having, within this island or its dependencies, in his own name, or in trust for him, in land or other real estate to the value of £60 by the year ; or, 2. In real and personal estate together to the value of £80 by the year ; or, 3. Shall be the tenant of any house, if in Hobart Town or Launceston, at a yearly rental of £75 : or, if in other part of the colony, at a yearly rental of £75.

EXEMPTIONS.—Judges, chairmen of quarter sessions, ministerial officers of supreme court and quarter sessions, members of council, commissioners of caveat board, surveyor general, director of public works, clergymen, Roman Catholic priests, dissenting ministers, officers in navy or army on full pay, police or assistant police magistrates, principal superintendent of convicts, assistant colonial secretary, clerk of the councils, private secretary, coroners, officers of customs, sheriffs' officers, gaolers, practising barristers and attorneys, physicians, surgeons, and apothecaries, and such public officers as the Governor may, from time to time, think fit to exempt from sitting on juries.

No special juror who resides above 25 miles, nor any common juror who resides more than 10 miles distance from the place of trial, shall be summoned.

ROYAL SOCIETY OF VAN DIEMEN'S LAND.

This Society was founded at a Meeting held at Government House, on the 14th of October, 1843, the then Governor, Sir J. E. Eardley-Wilmot, Bart., being in the Chair.

The Meeting consisted of Members of the Tasmanian and Horticultural Societies, and of other Gentlemen interested in the advance of Science and the progress of the Colony.

Sir Eardley-Wilmot subsequently assigned to the Society a large portion of the Government Garden, with an allowance of £400 a-year from the Public Treasury, to pay the Officers of the Society, and generally to promote its objects.

On the 12th September, 1844, the Governor announced that her Majesty the Queen had signified her consent to become Patroness to the Society—that the constitution of the Society had been approved—that the grant of £400 a-year had been confirmed—and that its designation should thenceforward be “The Royal Society of Van Diemen’s Land, for Horticulture, Botany, and the Advancement of Science.”

With a population, a large proportion of whom were neither virtuous nor industrious in youth, the infirmities of old age become inevitably premature, with neither the energy nor the will to struggle against them."

WEATHER TABLE.

The following table, constructed by the ingenious Dr. Kirwin, upon philosophical considerations of the attraction of the sun and moon in their several positions respecting the earth, is submitted to notice, under the recommendation of an actual observation of one entire year in this colony, further confirmed by several years experience in the northern hemisphere. It is not pretended to be infallible, but it comes so near the truth, that in very few instances indeed will it be found to fail furnishing the observer with the knowledge of what kind of weather there is the greatest probability of succeeding in any given quarter of the moon:—
